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# Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development

The Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu, is an Institute of National Importance by an Act of Parliament No. 35/2012 under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India. The RGNIYD was set up in 1993 under the Societies Registration Act, XXVII of 1975. The Institute functions as a think-tank of the Ministry and premier organization of youth-related activities in the country. As the apex institute at the national level, it works in close cooperation with the NSS, NYKS and other youth organizations in the implementation of training programmes. The Institute is a nodal agency for training youth as a facilitator of youth development activities in rural, urban as also tribal areas.

RGNIYD endeavours to facilitate the nation's youth with a conducive environment and tools that will enable them to make the most of their natural potential to realize their aspirations. The Institute functions as vital resource centre coordinating training, research, orientation, extension and outreach initiatives for state and central governments and national level youth organizations. As a national level documentation and information dissemination centre on youth development, the Institute undertakes research and evaluation studies which help in formulating policies and programmes to cater to the current needs and aspirations of the youth.

The RGNIYD serves as a youth observatory and depositary in the country thereby embarking on youth surveillance on youth-related issues. It has a wide network with various organizations working for the welfare and development of young people and serves as a mentor.

RGNIYD offers inter-disciplinary, multi-dimensional, field-based expertise in the following areas through training, faculty exchange and consultancy:

The Hon'ble Union Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, Shri. Ajay Maken introduced the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development Bill, 2011 in the Lok Sabha on December 21, 2011 to convert the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD) into an institution of national importance. Towards recommending this conversion, the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India constituted a Mentor Group to assess the present nature of the programmes and activities being undertaken by RGNIYD and to suggest a road map for RGNIYD to emerge as an Institution of National Importance. As a sequel to this effort, the RGNIYD Bill was passed on 21stMay 2012 in the Lok Sabha and on 9thAugust 2012 in Rajya Sabha. The RGNIYD Act of Parliament received the assent of the President of India on the 30th August 2012 came into force on 19th November 2012.

As an apex Institution of higher learning in Youth Studies, RGNIYD offers the following five Master's Degree Programmes (Two-year duration):

- M. A. Youth Empowerment
- M. A. Life Skills Education
- M. A. Career Counselling
- M. A. Gender Studies
- M. A. Local Governance

These five M. A. Programmes offered by RGNIYD are the first of their kind in the country and are unique in terms of content and structure. Adopting an interdisciplinary approach, equip the students with competencies and theoretical knowledge about youth work and contemporary issues. A judicious blend of scholarly pursuit and field practicum, each M.A. Programme moulds the learners into professionals in youth development.

#### **Vision statement**

As the apex national agency for youth development, the Institute will strive to develop into a globally recognised and acclaimed centre of academic excellence in the field of youth development, fully responsive to the national agenda for inclusive growth, and the needs and aspirations of young people of the country to realise their potentials to create a just society.

# 1 Overview

The year 2012-13 was a significant year in history of the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development due to the fact that the Institute was converted into an institution of national importance. The Lok Sabha passed the RGNIYD Bill on 21May 2012 and the Rajya Sabha passed the same on 09August 2012. The RGNIYD Act of Parliament received the assent of the President of India on the 30 August 2012 came into force on 19 November 2012.

As an apex institute for youth development, the RGNIYD formulated the Draft of National Youth Policy 2012 during the year. As a sequel to the effort, regionwise consultations and meetings were organised with the State Secretaries of Sports, Youth, Cultural Affairs and Education drawn from different states in each region including Government Officials from related departments and youth functionaries who deliberated to solicit soliciting views and suggestions on the Draft of National Youth Policy 2012. The Institute also offered consultancy services to the Government of Maharashtra, Odisha and other North Eastern States for preparation of draft State Youth Policy and preparation of Five-Year Action Plan for Development of youth in the respective states.

The RGNIYD organised the 3rd Lecture of the RGNIYD's Eminent Speaker Series on 22 June 2012, RGNIYD in which Prof. Madhav Menon, a titan in the field of legal education delivered the lecture titled "Education for Responsible Citizenship". Besides, the Institute played host for the Study Abroad Programme of the University of Florida (USA) – Capacity Building on Youth Development in which the international students learn the best practices in India on Local Governance Systems. The Institute also organised at its campus a special

programme for the delegates of International Training Programme on Good Governance for Management of Rural Development Programmes convened by NIRD.

The Institute in collaboration with Commonwealth Youth Program (CYP) Asia Center and the British Council organised the Asia Youth Leaders Summit 2012 at New Delhi during September 2012. Further the Institute in partnership with the British Council conducted a seminar on Youth Participation: Opportunities and Challenges at New Delhi.

The Asia-Pacific Regional Conference on Youth in Development: Policies and Programmes was held at RGNIYD during February 2013. The 4th SAARC Youth Camp with the theme "Youth as Ambassadors in global partnerships for development" was organised at RGNIYD from 11 – 15 February 2013. The students of RGNIYD had the rarest opportunity to be a part of the Indian Youth Delegation to China 2012. The Institute during the period under report organised the International Seminar on Migration and Development and the 4th International Conference on Life Skills Education.

The 4th Indian Youth Science Congress was conducted at Nagpur, Maharashtra, from 9 -11 November 2011 jointly by RGNIYD, MSSRF and SRM University. The RGNIYD organised for the first time the Rajiv Gandhi Youth Leadership Internship Programme (Summer 2012) during June 2012 at its campus and the Rajiv Gandhi Youth Leadership Internship Programme (RGYLIP) – Winter 2013 for the Youth of North Eastern Region was held during January 2013 at Guwahati. The interns were provided intense training and hands on experience on leadership skills, life skills, gender sensitivity, youth development, career counselling, local

governance, rights violation, environmental activism, health awareness, organizing communities, refugees and displacement, contribution of Gandhi, Nehru and Ambedkar to building of modern India, protection of monuments, agrarian crisis, water management, etc.

To strengthen the academic base, the RGNIYD organised the National Workshop on Convergence of Youth Development Programmes in Rural Development, Regional Workshop on Internal Migration, National Conference on Youth Migration and Development, National Seminar on Violence against Women: Promoting Gender Justice, National Seminar on Positive Youth Development during this financial year.

The Institute also pilot tested the Advanced Facilitators' Manual on Life and convened consultation meetings for developing Training Manual on Youth and Social Entrepreneurship Skills during the year. The Institute has also brought out a hand book on Youth in Decentralised Governance

Several training of trainers programmes on youth leadership, personality development and employability skills; social harmony and human rights; civic citizenship, parenting and peer education; tribal youth as social animators; environment and sustainable development; gender equity; decentralised governance and youth development; leadership and personality development

and career guidance and counselling were conducted during the year across the country. The RGNIYD embarked on the task of establishing Youth Resource Centres in various parts of the country to reach out to the youth. The Action Research Project-Mainstreaming Youth in Local Governance was initiated in select states.

To enhance the employability of the rural and less educated youth, the RGNIYD undertook the task of providing vocational training/skill development and certification through NCVT/NSDC. Besides, the Institute organised several job melas to provide employment opportunities for the rural youth in industries in and around the RGNIYD. Career exhibitions for school and college students were organised in different parts of the country to widen the horizons of career opportunities in the world of work and facilitated to make systematic career decisions and choices.

The RGNIYD continued to implement its flagship programme titled "Interstate Youth Exchange and Home Stay Programme" to educate the youth of north-east and to sensitize them to the rich cultural heritage of different states in India and as a reciprocal gesture, the youth from the other parts of the country visit the north-eastern states where the duo strive to promote peace, harmony and brotherhood thereby strengthening the social harmony and national unity across the youth in the country.

# 2 Training and Other Activities

#### **A. Training of Trainers Programmes**

# Pilot Testing of the Advanced Facilitators' Manual on Life Skills

#### 16 - 30 June, RGNIYD

The Advanced Facilitators' Manual on Life Skills was Pilot Tested on 45 outgoing batch of RGNIYD students to obtain objective feedback on the content and methodology of the manual. The participants were also required to provide training to the students in different schools on various modules of the training manual and provide feedback. The suggestions were assimilated and were incorporated in the manual.

# TOT on Youth Leadership, Personality Development and Employability Skills

13- 22 July 2012, Punjab 13-22 August 2012, Kohima, Nagaland 12-14 December 2012, Karnataka 07 – 15 January 2013, Agartala, Tripura

RGNIYD during the year organised four training of trainers programmes on Youth Leadership, Personality Development and Employability Skills. The first programme was organised in collaboration with the Punjab Technical University, Jalandar in which 48 trainees participated (Boys: 36 and Girls: 12) representing various colleges of PTU, Punjab. Dr. S.K Bansal, Vice Chanceller, Bahra University, inaugurated the programme. Dr. Bains, Registrar, PTU delivered the valedictory address and distributed certificates.

The second programme was held at Mount Tabor Training Centre, Kohima, Nagaland. The programme was inaugurated by Shri. Elusing Meru, IFS, Secretary



to the Government of Nagaland, Shri. K. Singh, Zonal Director, NYKS highlighted the objectives of the programmes. A total of 41 participants attended the training (34 Male – 7 Female).

The third programme was conducted for the NSS programme officers and NGO representatives of Karnataka was organised at Regional Institute of English, South India, Jnanabharathi Campus, Bangalore in association with NSS regional Centre, Karnataka. The Programme was inaugurated by Dr. K B Dhananjaya, Secretary, Department of Youth Services and Sports, Govt. of Karnataka. The valedictory address was given by Dr. Kundan Basavaraj, NSS Programme Coordinator, Kuvempu University, Shimoga. The training was attended by 35 (19 Male, 6 Female) programme Officers.

The fourth ToT programme was organized jointly by RGNIYD and the Directorate of Youth Affairs and Sports, Tripura for NGO officials and Tribal Youth of Tripura at Cooperative Management, AD Nagar, Agartala. The programme was inaugurated by Shri. Sahadeb Das, IAS,

Director, Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt of Tripura. A total of 40 participants (12 female & 28 male) attended the programme.

#### **TOT on Social Harmony and Human Rights**

The RGNIYD organised two training of trainers programmes on Social Harmony and Human Rights. The first programme was held at the Bidar Institute of Medical Science in which 41 programme officers from six universities in Karnataka participated. Shri Anees Ahmed, I.A.S., Chief Executive Officer, Zila Parishad, Bidar inaugurated the training. The valedictory address was given by Shri.Jaideep Singh Kocher, IES, Joint Secretary (Training), Nation Human Rights Commisiion(NHRC), New Delhi.



The second programme was organised at All India Institute of Local Self Government, Belgaum. Prof. D.Y. Kulkarni, Principal, R.L.Law College, Belgaum inaugurated the programme in which forty NSS Programme Officers (Male – 31, Female – 9) from seven Universities in Karnataka participated. The valedictory address was given by Shri. Raju Chikkangoudar, Syndicate Member, Rani Channamma University, Belgaum.The sessions for the training were conducted as per the training manual developed by RGNIYD.

# Training of Trainers on Civic Citizenship, Parenting and Peer Education

With a view to instil the qualities of responsible citizenship, impart knowledge on effective parenting and to disseminate the learning through peer education, four training of trainers programme on civic citizenship, parenting and peer education were conducted by RGNIYD.

The first programme was conducted for 50 professionals (21 males and 29 females) representing NSS, NYKS, NCC, NGOs, Colleges besides, counselling, training, research and social work professionals at Maharashtra. Dr. Gowtam Gawali, Professor and Head of Department of Applied Psychology, Mumbai University inaugurated the training.

The second programme was organised at IIPER, Kolkata in which 40 officials from NCC and NSS including a few representatives of NGOs and Civil Society Organisations from West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand and Odisha participated.

The third programme was held for 38 youth functionaries (24 male and 14 female) representing NSS, NYKS, NCC, NGOs, State and Civil Society workers at RGNIYD.

The fourth ToT on Civic Citizenship, Parenting and Peer Educationwas organised by RGNIYD at the CYP Asia Centre, Chandigarh in which 39 participants (24 male and 15 female) representing the NSS, NYKS, NCC including NGOs and civil society organisations attended. The valedictory address was given by Shri. Aminul Islam Khan, the Director, CYP.

The training covered vital inputs on Citizenship, Democracy, Indian Constitution, Transparency in Governance, Celebrating Diversity, parenting, moulding young people as responsible citizens and peer education.

#### **Training of Trainers on Life Skills**

Two training of trainers programme for master trainers on life skills were held during the year. The first programme was held at RGNIYD in which 36 professionals (24 male and 12 female) hailing from teaching, training, research and counseling backgrounds from Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu attended. The Director, RGNIYD inaugurated the programme.

The second programme was held at the Youth Hostel, Khuman Lampak, Imphal, Manipur. 41 youth functionaries of NYKS (20 male and 21 female) in Manipur participated. The participants were given conceptual inputs with hands on practice session to instill life skills among the youth and to promote adaptive behavior in their day to day life.

### Training of Trainers on Tribal Youth as Social Animators

RGNIYD organised three five-day TOTsfor the tribal youth to function as social animators. The first programme was held for 40 tribal youth pursuing education in various colleges in Koraput, Odisha. The tribal youth participants belonging to Gadaba, Paraja, Kondh and Desia tribes were identified by the NYK, Koraput district for the programme. The programme was inaugurated by Smt Malathi Majhi, Chairperson, Zilla Board, Koraput. Shri.P.K.Mallick, District Information Officer, Koraput was the chief guest for the valediction.

The second ToT was held at Kanteerava Stadium, Koramangala, Bangalore for 43 Tribal Youth out of which male 36 and female 7. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. H. Srinivasaiya, President, Karnataka Gandhi memorial Smriti, Bangalore. Shri. E. Venkata Ramaiah, IAS, Principal Secretary, Department of Social Welfare delivered the valedictory addrss. Shri. C.N. Ramu, National President, Adi Dravida Samithi, Bangalorewas the guest of honour.

The third programme was organised at Cathaolic Church, Youth centre, Sambalpur, Odissa, which is one of the textile hubs of India. This programme was the first RGNIYD programme in the backward western parts of Orissa. In this programme 40 tribal youth participated (25 male and 15female). The programme was inaugurated by Shri. Rainu Singh, Sub-collector of Sambalpur, Odissa.

These training programmes had sessions on personality development, leadership, discrimination, government policies, and welfare schemes were held. Issues specific

to the tribal youth participants were also addressed.

# Training of Trainers on Environment and Sustainability

The RGNIYD organised three training of trainers programmes on Environment and Sustainability during the year. The first programme was held in association with West Territorial Division, Forest Environment and Wildlife Management Departmentatthe Zilla Bhawan, West Sikkim. The programme was inaugurated by Shri AP Rai, SCS Additional District Magistrate. 39 participants (8 male and 21 female) including students, NGO representatives and employees of Forest Department participated in the training programme. Shri. Elamurugan, IFS DFO (T) West was the chief guest for the valedictory.

The second programme organised was Thamaraipakkam, Thriuvallur District, in association with Institute of Sustainable Development, Chennai. Dr. M. S. A total of 40 (27 Male, 13 Female) participants including students, non-students,

During the year under report, RGNIYD organised 6 training of trainers programmes on gender equity with the main objective to sensitise and train key youth functionaries on Gender Equityand who in turn can facilitate gender sensitization programmes with the youth and the community.



The first programme was conducted for the NSS Programme Officers from Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Puducherry and Tamil Naduwhich was held at RGNIYD.As part of the training programme, a field visit was organized to Nemilli, O.M Mangalam villages and Irula Tribal Women Welfare Society to understand the ground level realities and to learn various livelihood opportunities.Ms. Thilothama, Vice chairperson of NYKS graced the valedictory session.

The second training was organized at Orissa University of Agriculture and Technology which was attended by 50 NSS Programme Officers (F-18, M-32) from the states of Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha and West Bengal. Dr. U.N. Sahu, SLO cum Dy. Secy., Govt of Odisha delivered the Inaugural address. The valedictory address was delivered by Shri S. K. Ray, Registrar, OUAT.

The RGNIYD during this year organized six training of trainers programmes on Social Harmony, National Unity and Human Rights for a duration of seven days each. The first programme was conducted for 34 NSS Programme Officers of Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Kerala held at the RGNIYD.

The sixth such ToT was held at Jaipur, Rajasthan for the Programme Officers of NSS. The sessions for the training were held as per the training manual prepared by RGNIYD handled by eminent experts.

# Training of Trainers on Decentralized Governance and Youth Development,

10 - 14 December 2012, Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu 31 January- 05 February 2013, RGNIYD 20-25 February 2013, RGNIYD 21-26 March 2013, RGNIYD

RGNIYD during the year under report conducted four training of trainers programmes on Decentralized Governance and Youth Development for a duration of five days each with a view to create a cadre of trainers in the field of decentralized governance and youth development. The first training was organised at Sriperumbudur inwhich 56 (38 Male and 18 Female) programme officers of National Service Scheme (NSS) and volunteers from Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu participated.

The second training of trainers on Decentralized Governance and Youth Development was organised at RGNIYD in which 59 NSS programme Officers and volunteers (44 Male and 15 Female) from Odisha and Pondicherry participated.

The third training was organised by RGNIYD for NSS programme Officers and volunteers (32 Male and 31 Female) from Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh. The fourth training of trainers programme was organised at RGNIYD for 38 (28 Male and 10 Female) NSS programme Officers and volunteers from Assam and Tripura.

During the five-day training, sessions on Youth and decentralization, 73rd Constitutional Amendment Act, Youth Participation in Local Governance, National Youth Policy, Right to Information, Social Auditing, Role

of Youth in Disaster Management etc. were covered. Youth budgeting at the local level, Strategies and approaches for youth development, etc were held. Group discussions and brainstorming sessions on resource mapping, concerns, issues and priorities of Youth development were also conducted.

# **Training of Trainers on Career Guidance and Counselling**

A training on Youth Entrepreneurship / Enterprise Development was organised at NIESBUD, Noida jointly by CYP, Asia Centre and the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India. 23 youth functionaries from RGNIYD, NSS and NYKS attended. The programme was inaugurated by Shri. Arun Kumar Jha, Director General, NIESBUD. Shri Aminul Islam Khan, Regional Director, CYP, Asia Centre highlighted the objectives of the programme. The second training programme was conducted for the NCC trainers at the Training Academy (OTA), Gwalior which was attended by 52 female NCC officers from various states. Col Chimni, NCC commander inaugurated the programme. The participants were given inputs on ten core life skills, leadership, citizenship anddemocracy, adolescents' issues and concerns and imperativeness of peer education.

#### Training of Trainers on Youth and Peace Building Organized by RGNIYD and Commonwealth Youth Programme Asia Centre

The training imparted vital inputs on Understanding conflict and its type, Conflict and violence, Enemy image, Social conflict, Role of power in conflict, Conflict analysis, Youth and peace building, Non Violence communication, Consensus decision making, Media and peace building, Trauma counselling,

Mediation and negotiation, Art and peace building, Appreciative inquiry, Learning styles and intelligence and Training Horrors and challenges.

#### **B. Capacity Building Programmes**

#### Orientation Programme for Empowering Rural Youth for Sustainable Livelihood 02- 03 April 2012, Mahaboobnagar, Andhra Pradesh

RGNIYD organised two-day orientation programme on Empowering Rural Youth for Sustainable Livelihood from 2-3 April 2012 at Madanapuram, Mahaboobnagr, Andhra Pradesh in association with Youth for Action. The programme was inaugurated by Smt. Jyothi, Mandal Parishad Development Officer (MPDO), Pebbair who stressed the importance of creating self-employment opportunities at village level and make best use of the training inputs.

The participating youth were provided hands on training on trades such as maintenance and repairing of hand pumps, Plant Health Clinic Services which include Integrated Pest Management, Soil and Water Analysis, leaf analysis etc, Food processing and Bakery, Nursery Management - raising ornamental, Fruit and vegetable plants and saplings, seed production and Veterinary Care and Animal Husbandry. The participants derived immense benefit out of the programme which will enable them to take up viable income generating activities. The participants requested for conduct of courses on trades motor winding, house wiring, embroidery, cosmetology/beautician courses and cell phone repair and servicing. The programme was coordinated by the Training, Orientation and Extension Division.

The objective of the programme was to impart skill based eduction and training in agriculture and off-farm non agricultural sectors covering two distrctis of (Andhra Pradesh) (Gulbarga/Yadgiri districts) and Karnataka and the outcome of the programme was to promote trained youths to work as a para entrepreneurs and extension agents to develop into a virutally skill developed resource network pools.

#### Training to District Youth Programme/Project/ Information/ Special Officers of Kerala State Youth Welfare Board



Conducting Workshop, Capacity Building Training Programmes, Exposure visit for the SC/ST students, Providing books and necessary teaching aids for the SC/ST hostels and deserving Ambedhkar Evening Tuition centres in Chennai Slums, Sponsoring Pamphlets for the creating awareness on GO.92 among the SC/ST students, conducting Job fair for the SC/ST meritorious students in association with like-minded NGOs and Corporates, conducting base line survey and creating awareness programme in association with NSS and NYKS, organizing talent exhibition

for the talented SC/ST youth, compilation of all the governmental schemes and GO's, organising National Dalit Cultural Festival, compilation of documentary film on issues pertaining to Dalits, conducting Skill Development programme, certification programme and Entrepreneurship Development programme for the SC/ST youth were the suggested under the SC/ST Sub Component Plan.



to Catch the Young, Tobacco Cessation Methodologies, World No Tobacco Day's Message and the Role of Youth in Tobacco Control.



# Workshop on Skill Development for Youth 20 July 2012, Guwahati, Assam

The Workshop on Skill Development for Youth was held on 20 July 2012 at Don Bosco Institute, Guwahati in which 42 participants including the senior functionaries of World Vision, FICCland youth functionaries participated. Issues such as need for skill gap analysis and skill mapping in northeast, life skills training for enhancing employability, orientation to parents and teachers on vocational training and career, job opportunities in media and visual communication related sector, policy framework to incorporate life skill training in course curriculum of school and colleges, migration of north east youth in search of employment and better living, retaining the youth in villages by reinventing job in agriculture and related sector, enhancing the self-esteem of youth of north east and the need of new enterprises in north east were brought out by the participants.

The participants later discussed in groups on Key issues in Youth Skill Development in the NE context, Priorities of Youth in Skill Development, Strategies to be adopted to move forward, Synergising initiatives

for greater collaboration and results and made group presentations. Further a North East Regional Working Group was formed with a team with the objective to develop an action plan pertaining to education and training, regional resource directory, skill mapping and skill gap analysis, importance of agriculture and allied sector, peace building and social harmony, skill training and upgradation, and assessment and certification.

### **Regional Workshop on Internal Migration**

27 September 2012, RGNIYD

A regional level workshop on Internal Migration issues was held at RGNIYD with the objective to understand the reasons for internal migration and its impact. 23 participants viz., Experts, Activists, Builders, Research Scholars, Representatives from NGOs viz, INMAAS, YESA, UDHAYAM Trust, Restless Development, Jeevan Trust, and Aide et Action, Nirman Mazdoor Panchayat Sangam and Trade Union members participated in the programme. The Director, RGNIYD gave the presidential address who the need and importance of mobile education, and recreation facilities for the migrant workers. Senior academicians, law professionals and leading NGO representatives made presentations on the state of migrant workers and their rights.



As an outcome of the workshop, it was decided to create a Migration Helpline by RGNIYD in association with NGOs who work for Migration issues. A Migration cell will be established and RGNIYD will create awareness as well as organise capacity building programmes in collaboration with likeminded NGOs and the government departments. It was also suggested to constitute a core committee under the chairmanship of Tamil Nadu Additional Labour Commissioner. The Tamil Nadu State Legal AID would be approached for Right based Policy. During the ensuing period, the RGNIYD will conduct Migration Survey in association with Centre for Development Studies, Kerala and Arunodhaya Migrants Initiative, Chennai.

The second regional workshop on Internal Migration issues was held at Bangalore in association with Aide Et Action – South Asia. The objective of the programme was to understand the cause and consequences of internal migration in Karnataka, problems of migrant workers, and the role of government and NGOs in addressing the issues of migrants. The Deputy Director, Youth service and Sports, Govt. of Karnataka inaugurated the workshop. Dr. Bernard D Sami, portrayed the problems of the migrants and emigrants push and pull factors, role of government and non-government organizations for devising suitable intervention to address the issues. He emphasized that need for maintaining District wise migrants directory and voting rights and fulfilling the basic needs of the migrants by quoting the Fundamental rights in the Indian Consitution. The experts spoke on migrant workers issues and concerns, rights of migrants and the role of Government and NGOs in addressing the issues of the migrant workers. Migrant workers who were working in quarry expressed their problems. 35 persons (24 Male 11 Female) including students, academicians, lawyers, activists, tribal youth, quarry workers, NGO representatives and government officials participated in the workshop.

RGNIYD in collaboration with CYSD, Bhubaneshwar conducted the third regional workshop on Internal Migration issues at Bhubaneshwar, Odisha. 40 participants including Trade Union Members, Experts Activists, Builders, Contractors, Migrant workers, Academicians, Researches and NGO's attended.

The fourth regional workshop on Internal Migration Issues was organised by RGNIYD at Hotel Taj Mahal, Secundrabad, Andhra Pradesh in which 50 (35 Male and 15 Female) Activists, Academicians, NGO/INGO representatives, Government Officials from Labour Department, ILO representative; Research Scholars, Reporters and International Interns had participated. The programme was inaugurated by Mr. Ravi Bhusan, Secretary, Andhra Pradesh Construction and Other Workers Welfare Board. Discussions were centered on Internal Migration Issues in Andhra Pradesh, Issues and concerns of Migrant workers in Andhra Pradesh, Rights and Livelihood Opportunities, Role of Government and NGOs and INGOs in addressing the issues of migrants in Andhra Pradesh.

# National Workshop on Convergence of Youth Development Programmes in Rural Development

#### 28 September 2012, RGNIYD

A workshop on convergence of youth development programmes in rural development was organised at RGNIYD. Sri.SM Vijayanand, IAS, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Rural Development, Govt. of India spoke on the significance, scope and potentials of ensuring convergence in various development programmes. Functionaries from the Youth Organisations like Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan and National Service Scheme; Officials of National Institute of Rural Development, Hyderabad; Key functionaries of Development organisations like Institute of Social Sciences, DHAN Foundation, Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), Representatives of Local Government Institutions and

Youth Awardeesparticipated in the workshop, besides the faculty members of RGNIYD. The participants were involved in group discussions on the operational aspects of convergence of services. Based on the group suggestions and recommendations, action plan for bringing convergence of youth development programmes in rural development would be drawn and implemented.



# **Review Meeting on Regional Workshop on internal Migration issues**

#### 02 October 2012, RGNIYD

A review meeting on regional workshop on internal Migration issues was held at RGNIYD with the officials of RGNIYD. Dr. Bernard D Sami, Coordinator, Arunodhaya Migrants Initiative, Chennai suggested that District Directory should be maintained for Migrants Workers and a Watch Dog Committee should be constituted, the Panchayat level. The Present Migrant Workers welfare Board must be revitalized. The migration cell shall be established on 8th November at RGNIYD and at the initial stage the Cell can concentrate on Pre-Departure training programme for the International Migrants in association with Arunodhaya Migrants Initiative, Chennai and Educational programme for the children of Migrants workers in collaboration with Aid et Action, Chennai. A Help Line for the Migrants will be created with the Help of Arunodhaya Migrants Initiative for International Migrants and the calls may also be forwarded to the Ministry of Overseas Affairs. The Internal Migrants will be given information with the help of Aid et Action, Chennai. For Legal Aid Programme, Lawyers who have concern towards migrants may be involved for collective work and bring justice to the migrant workers. Migrants' workers safety and Health measures will be explored through research. Later it was suggested by Dr. Bernard D Sami that the next regional workshop on internal migration issues which would be conducted in Bangalore which will be a platform to discuss about migration in a wider perspective.

## Workshop on Interactive Role of Youth in the Development of Lakshadweep

#### 07 November 2012, Ernakulam, Kerala

One day workshop on Interactive Role of Youth in the Development of Lakshadweep was organized by RGNIYD at the Government Guest House, Ernakulam in collaboration with the NYKS, Ernakulam. Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Lakshadweep Shri. Hameedulla Sayed inaugurated the workshop and interacted with delegates. Shri.K T Thomas, Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Idukki, Kerala and Member of Legislative Assembly Shri. Hibi Eden, were also present during the occasion. Issues discussed include transport, communication, higher education facilities in the islands, career, tourism and fisheries. 127 youth participated in the workshop (Male: 84 & Female: 43).

One panel discussion, three paper presentation sessions, one group discussion and presentation session were organised as part of the conference.

56 delegates including academicians, NGO representatives, sexual minorities, persons living with HIV/AIDS, youth volunteers, international volunteers, UNV representatives, agriculture and water management experts participated and presented papers in the conference. Eminent personalities such as

Dr.B.Choudry from Santhiniketan, Mr.Vedbhyas Kundu from Gandhi Smriti, Dr.Indira Das Gupta,Ms.Amitha Dhahiya from UNV,AR.Patil,A.S Guha moderated different sessions.



### **4th Indian Youth Science Congress**

### 09-11 November 2012, Maharashtra, Nagpur

The 4th Indian Youth Science Congress was conducted at Nagpur, Maharashtra jointly by RGNIYD, MSSRF and SRM University. The theme for the congress was "Young Scientists and Shaping India's Future". Young research scholars and students from various institutions across the country participated and presented papers on themes such as agriculture and rural development, natural resource management, environmental protection, new technological options for a better living and ending hunger and poverty.

### 4th International Conference on Life Skills Education: Optimising Positive Strengths through Life Skills

### 07 – 09December 2012, Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra

The fourth international conference on life skills education was organized at K.B.P College, Vashi, Navi Mumbai jointly by RGNIYD, University of Mumbai and K.B.P College from 07 – 09 December, 2012. The objective of the conference was to promote research base of life skills education and to disseminate

various research findings on life skills and their areas of application to the youth. The conference was inaugurated by His Excellency Shri. Shankaranarayanan, Governor of Maharashtra, Mumbai.

RGNIYD organized a two-day National Conference on Youth Migration and Development at Sriperumbudur with the support of UNESCO, New Delhi and Arunodhaya

Migrants Initiatives, Chennai. 120 (M-82, F-38) experts, activists, faculty members, research scholars, college students and resource persons from eleven States viz., Andaman & Nicobar, Jammu Kashmir, Jharkand, West Bengal, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh and a delegate from Nepal attended the conference. The conference was inaugurated by Hon'ble Prof. D. V. Vijayakumar, Vice Chancellor, The Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University Chennai. The valedictory address was delivered by Shri. K. ### **Consultation Meeting on Establishing Youth Resource Centre**

### 18 May 2012, RGNIYD

A consultation meeting was organised by at RGNIYD to discuss the possible areas of collaboration and signing MoU withSPW India project Trust, Restless Development, New Delhi. It was decided that RGNIYD would set up 8 Youth Resource Centres at a total cost of Rupees Twelve Lakh in six states. The activities and modus operandi of the Youth Resource Centres were deliberated. Further it was decided that these Youth Resource Centres would implement RGNIYD's training and extension activities in the concerned states and facilitate as local coordinators of various activities for RGNIYD. The Youth Resource Centres would make presentations at RGNIYD at the end of every semester and also undertake periodic monitoring and evaluation of the programmes implemented for RGNIYD. A MoU would be signed and the dates for launching these centres would be finalised in the due course.

# Consultation Meeting for Preparing the Plan of Action for Collaborative Ventures with AIILSG

#### **16 June 2012, RGNIYD**

Towards operationalizing the collaborations based on the MoU signed between RGNIYD and All India Institute of Local Self Government (AIILSG) for five years, a Consultation Meeting was held for preparing the Plan of Action. The possible areas identified include: Sharing of resource material published by AIILSG and RGNIYD; capacity building of young elected members of Panchayati Raj Institutions with thrust on Gram Panchayats of Tamil Nadu and Commune / Gram Panchayats of Puducherry; Conduct of National Conference on Urban Empowerment Initiatives in January 2013 at RGNIYD; and, Initiation of Action research project 'Youth Budgeting at the Urban Local Government Institutions' in one Municipal Council each in Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu for a period of two years on pilot basis.

### Consultation Meetings on International Seminar on Migration and Development

### 11 August 2012, Chennai, Tamil Nadu 25 August 2012, Chennai, Tamil Nadu

RGNIYD conducted the First Consultation meeting on International Conference on Youth Migration and Development at the office of Alumni Association, Administrative Block, Loyola College on 11 August, 2012. The Director, RGNIYD and the Director, Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Loyola College and Founder Director, Arunodhaya International Migration, Chennai held discussions. It was decided that the Arunodaya Migrants Initivate (AMI) an NGO will provide its technical expertise to RGNIYD for conducting the International Conference. The concept note, themes and sub themes of the Conference were discussed in detail. The resource sharing, experts contacts and support services were explored.

The Second Consultation meeting on International Conference on Youth Migration and Development was held at Hotel Park View, on 25 August, 2012. The organising committee had discussions with Dr .S. Irudhaya Rajana, Migration Unit, Centre for Development Studies(CDS), Kerala. The concept note, themes and sub themes of the Conference were finalised. It was decided that a Migration Survey may be conducted in Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry jointly by RGNIYD, AMI, Chennai and CDS, Kerala which will be published in the year 2013. Before the conference, series of workshops will be conducted to create sensitization on Internal and External Migration in different places like Chennai, Bangalore, Chandigarh, Pune and Odisha. The first Workshop will be conducted in the Month of September, 2012 at RGNIYD in association with AMI, Chennai. Further, a specialised Cell to address the issues of Migration will be established in the Month of October 2012 at RGNIYD premises.

# Consultation Meeting on Establishment of Youth Resource Centre in Ramnad District, TamilNadu

#### 27 August 2012, RGNIYD

RGNIYD conducted a consultation meeting on Establishment of Youth Resource Centre Ramnad District, at RGNIYD. The Director, RGNIYD, Representative and programme coordinators of Restless Development, The District Youth Coordinator of NYKS in Ramnad District, and the other officials of RGNIYD participated in the consultation meeting. The objective of the meeting was to explore the possibilities and strategies to establish Youth Resource Centre at Ramnad District. Mr. Ravi, Restless Development had shared his experience of initation of YRC at Chenglepet, Kancheepruam District in association with RGNIYD. He highlighted importance of YRC and its function. Role of RGNIYD and NYKS in establishing YRC at Chenglepet was deliberated in detail on that day. Mr Sathasivam, District Youth Co-ordinator, NYKS, Ramanathapuram suggested that the YRC can be established in Paramakudi as it is the centre place for the entire Ramanathapuram District and the activities like Skill Development can be focused, Vaccination to the animals will also be given important, Career Counselling will be given utmost important. The District Collector and NYKS will discuss and find out suitable place with adequate infrastructure facilities.

### Consultation Meeting on Developing Training Manual on Youth and Social Entrepreneurship

### 05 October 2012, RGNIYD 08–10 November 2012, RGNIYD

A consultation meeting on developing Training Manual on Youth and Social Entrepreneurship was held on 5 October, 2012 at RGNIYD. 13 experts from leading organisations such as Indian Organic Farmers Producer Company Ltd., Centre for Social Entrepreneurship & Development, VIT University, Vellore, National Entrepreneurship Network, Madras School of Social Work, Chennai, Tamil Nadu and other social entrepreneurs attended. During the meeting the components of the manual were developed.

# **Symposium on Life Skill Education for Social Development**

RGNIYD in collaboration with Centre for Information and Guidance India (CIGI) organized a symposium on Life Skill Education for Social Development which was facilitated Dr. Rajasenan Nair, Deputy Director, NYKS, Trivandrum. Addressing the gathering, Shri. Padmakar Valvi, Hon'ble Minister for Sports and Youth Welfare, Government of Maharashtra recollected the achievements of late Shri.

Short films on suicide prevention were screened for the students and staff of RGNIYD followed by a lecture on the 'Strategies for Suicidal Prevention among the Youth'. The students of RGNIYD presented skits on topics related to suicide issues viz., suicides in higher educational institutions, reasons for suicides among the women, suicides in corporate sector, suicidal deaths in rural areas and preventing suicides through imparting life skills.

### **Observance of Gandhi Jayanthi**

#### 02 October 2012, RGNIYD

The RGNIYD observed the 143rd birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi during which Dr. Bernard D. Sami of Loyola College, Chennai spoke about the divergent influences on Gandhi. He critiqued the protest movements and how they either influenced Gandhi or were influenced by him.

### Observance of World Mental Health Day

### 10 October, 2012, Chennai, Tamil Nadu

On the occasion of world mental health day, the RGNIYD organised a lecture on the Theme: "Depression- a Global Crisis" for the MTTI Trainees, Mentors, Instructors and Officers from various units of Air Force station, Avadi. The Faculty Head, School of Counselling, RGNIYD, then delivered a lecture on "Depression- A Global crisis" which highlighted the causes ,effects and methods to cope with depression citing various case studies, facts and figures. Zung Self Rating Depression Scale was administered to 500 air force trainees who attended the programme. The students of school of counselling, RGNIYD presented a skit portraying the need for

promoting mental health during different phases of life viz., while career decision making, parenting and post retirement life. Literature on "Promotion of mental health" was distributed to the participants.

Krishnamurthy, International expert in Coastal Hazards/Disasters, Remote Sensing and GIS Applications delivered the key note address. The programme consisted of various sessions focussing on aspects such as Gender and Disaster Management, Women and Resilience, Role of students in Disaster Management and Natural Disasters in India. The programme came to an end with a lecture cum demonstration on 'Basic Life Support' by Prof. Dr. H.S. Imamuddin Ahmed, Resource person (Training) -RPF and Para Military Force, Railway Board. A total of 93 students (Boys:52, Girls:41) from Mar Gregorios Arts & Science College, Loyola College, St. Thomas College of Arts & Science, and Madras School of Social Work and few other guests participated in the programme.

### **National Integration Week**

The RGNIYD observed National Integration Week from 19–25 November 2012 in commemoration of the birth anniversary of our late Prime Minister Smt. Honble Justice Ms. Vimala, Judge, High court of Madras delivered the keynote address. She highlighted various critical issues in implementing laws relating to violence against women and how women are victimised by the judgements made with patriarchal approach. She urged that youth need to take pledge to end all forms of violence against women so that equality and peace can be accomplished.



Ms. Letika Saran IPS, Former Director General of Police, Tamil Nadu delivered the special address on Online Violence and Cybercrime. She brought out the fact that new forms of violence have come in to being with the technological revolution in the era of globalization. She pointed out online violence against the girls and

### 02- 03 April 2012, Mahaboobnagar, Andhra Pradesh

RGNIYD organised two-day orientation programme on Empowering Rural Youth for Sustainable Livelihood at Madanapuram, Mahaboobnagr, Andhra Pradesh in association with Youth for Action. The participating youth were provided hands on training on trades such as maintenance and repairing of hand pumps, Plant Health Clinic Services which include Integrated Pest Management, Soil and Water Analysis, leaf analysis

etc, Food processing and Bakery, Nursery Management - raising ornamental, Fruit and vegetable plants and saplings, seed production and Veterinary Care and Animal Husbandry. The participants derived immense benefit out of the programme which will enable them to take up viable income generating activities. The participants requested for conduct of courses on trades motor winding, house wiring, embroidery, cosmetology/beautician courses and cell phone repair and servicing.

### Job Fair and Dissemination of Job related Information

The Employment Enhancement Cell of RGNIYD conducted a job fair in partnership with the Apollo Pharmacy — a unit of Apollo Hospitals for vacancies of Pharmacist/Pharmacy Aide. A total of 10 unemployed rural youth who have passed SSLC from the Kanchipuram District have been interviewed and all the 10 candidates were selected and joined their orientation training after which they would be placed on jobs.

### **Gender Sensitization Programme for Police Personnel**

25 April 2012, Tamil Nadu Police Academy, Vandalur, Tamil Nadu 26 – 28 June, 2012, RGNIYD 12 September 2012, Tamil Nadu Police Academy, Vandalur, Chennai, Tamil Nadu 23 January 2013, Vandallur, Tamil Nadu 26 – 28 February 2013, RGNIYD

RGNIYD organised five batches of gender sensitization programme for the police personnel. The objective of the programme was to sensitize the police personnel on gender issues and to enable them able to handle/ analyse situations from a gender perspective in their work. The first sensitization programme was held at Tamil Nadu Police Academy (TNPA), Vandalur in

which 31 Police Officers in the rank of Inspectors and Sub-inspectors from Salem, Chennai, Nagapattinam, Cuddalore, Coimbatore, Tirunelveli, AWPS, Thoothukudi, Dharmapuri districts of Tamil Nadu attended. The second programme was organised in collaboration with APCA, Vellore for 32 prison officers from the states of Karnataka, Nagaland and Tamil Nadu.

## Gender Sensitization Programme for Students

# 18 – 19 June 2012, NSPR Govt. Degree College, Andhra Pradesh

RGNIYD organised a Gender Sensitization Programme for the students of the NSPR Govt. Degree College for women, Hindupur in which 120 students participated. The programme covered different sessions on social

construction of gender, gender discrimination, and the importance of education for women's empowerment. The important outcome of the programme was the reflection by the participants on the need to embrace education, to be aware of their rights and be empowered citizens.

#### **Job Fair**

RGNIYD during the year organised five job fairs for the unemployed youth in Sriperumbudur. In the first job fair 440 unemployed youth attended. The second job fair was conducted with JK Tyre Company at RGNIYD Campus. 372 Youth participated, out of which 50 candidates have been selected and were issued provisional appointment orders. The third job fair was conducted with the help of District Employment office, Kanchipuram and Confederation Indian Industries on 25 October 2012 at RGNIYD. 487 candidates participated (448 male, 39 female), out of which 233 Candidates (217 male, 16 female) were selected. Appointment orders are to be issued. The fourth job fair was held with JK. Tyre Company at RGNIYD Campus. 85 Candidates attended the Job fair and among those 27 candidates were selected and issued appointment orders. The fifth job fair was conducted in partnership with JK Tyre Company at RGNIYD in which 156 candidates registered. 77 candidates passed and attended the interview, out of which 24 candidates were selected and were given provisional appointment orders.

RGNIYD organised a personality development programme for 45 unemployed youth at Mayiladuthurai. The sessions were conducted as per the training manual prepared by RGNIYD.

### Gender Sensitization Training Programme for NDRF Personnel

#### 15 March 2013, Arakkonam, Tamil Nadu

RGNIYD conducted a one-day Gender Sensitization Training Programme for 200 NDRF Personnel of 4th Btn, at National Disaster Response Force, Arakkonam). The training programme encompassed various sessions on conceptions and dimensions of gender, gender based violence and the crucial role of Security Force Personnel in protecting the rights of women and girls.

### Awareness Programme on Good, Bad and Accidental Touches

#### 19 – 23 March 2013, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh

The Gender Equity Division and the K.H.E.L, Lucknow organized an Awareness programme on Good, Bad and Accidental Touches for socially under-privileged adolescents at different locations of Lucknow such as Ehsaas Drop-in-Center, Charbagh; Mamta School, Sitapur; St.Francis Dispensary, Lalbagh; Children's Home, Deepshikha; Samarth Foundation, Gomti Nagar; Sudamapuri slum children; Gharonda, Indira Nagar. The programme covered a total of 375 adolescents (172, 203 male) from these areas. The sessions began with understanding the body, discussions on what the children understood by touch and the different types of touches, i.e. good touch which comforts us, bad touch which makes us feel uncomfortable, confusing touch which leaves us with mixed feelings of being good or bad and accidental touch which get perpetrated for reasons other than bad intentions. They brainstormed on who could they share their experiences with, if not their parents. They received help in identifying some very basic ways of reacting to inappropriate touches, followed by contextual responses to such touches.

# Awareness Programme for Volunteers on Legal Awareness, PRI, Health and RTI

## 22- 23March 2013, Geeta Bhavan, Sehore, Madhya Pradesh

An Awareness Programme was organized by RGNIYD for young volunteers on Legal Awareness, PRI, Health & Hygiene, and RTI at Sehore district, Madhya Pradesh (M.P.). There were various sessions on the Social Construction of Gender, Legal awareness, Women's role in PRIs, role of RTI and consumer forum, Health related issues specially HIV/AIDS, Hygiene, Water and

### **Artificial Jewellery Making**

### 01-04 July 2012, Thimmarajam Pettai 27 – 29 July 2012, Mayiladuthurai

With a view to enhance the employability skills of the less educated unemployed youth, artificial Jewel making training was conducted at Thimmarajampettai for 33 mahilas and SHG members. The second programme was held at Mayiladuthurai in which 40 women benefitted.

### Sill Development Training for Women in Jute Products

#### 21 – 24 February 2013, RGNIYD

As follow up of the extension activity carried out in the nearby villages of RGNIYD, four-day skill training for women was organised at RGNIYD. Totally 29 women from different villages were trained to make Jute products making like purses, pouches, folders and carry bags.

#### **NCVT Certification**

#### January - March 2013

For providing NCVT Certification for the skilled youth, the candidates were by NYKS Tamil Nadu & Puducherry Zone for assessment of their skills and certification. Three Assessing Agencies were identified and given task to take assessment and issue certificates to 3961 trained youth. A total of 232 youth were provided NCVT certificates.

### Vocational Training programmes in Basic Computer Applications and Mushroom Cultivation for Tribal girls

### 7 - 16 March2013, Wayanad, Girija Seva Trust, Wayanad 12 -16 March 2013, Behenapara, Borihat, Assam

RGNIYD and the Wayanad, Girija Seva Trust, Wayanad organized a training programme in Basic Computer Applications and in Mushroom Cultivation for ST girls. Resource persons who were from the National Centre for Jute Diversification, Guwahati provided training on product processing before use, art of making diversified jute products i.e hand bags, baskets, mats, decorative items with the use of dye, jhumki, beads, etc.

# Skill Development Programmes for Surrendered Militants and their Wards on Mobile Repairing and Maintenance of Electrical Accessories

RGNIYD in collaboration with Rashtriya Rifles of Indian Army and Hamdard Educational Society, Ganderbal Kashmir organised skill development programmes for surrendered militants and their wards at Kashmir and Jammu regions in mobile phone servicing, electrical repairs and plumbing works. Skill training on Mobile phone servicing was organized at Bandipora, Kashmir region during 19 - 28 March 2013 in which 30 youth (All male) took part. No. 13 Rashtriya Rifles of Indian Army extended support for the conduct of the training programme. The second programme on Electrical repairs was organized at Badampura, Ganderbal, Kashmir Region during 22-31 March 2013 with the support of No. 5 Rashtriya Rifles of Indian Army and 30 persons (all male) attended the training. The Director, RGNIYD presented the Draft NYP 2012 for discussion and suggestions on the policy document were invited.

Further Mr. Aparajitha highlighted the implications of YRC among the youth, percentage of beneficiaries at different levels and the demands from the community for the effective utilization of YRC.

# MCC students Exposure Visit to RGNIYD 10 October 2012, RGNIYD

The undergraduate students of the department of social work, Madras Christian College, Chennai visited RGNIYD as part of their academic requirements. The students were provided information on the programmes and activities of RGNIYD, the academic programmes offered and the pioneering youth development initiatives. Dr. Baraniraja, the Medical Officer AYUSH, RGNIYD educated the mothers to deworm their children once in 6 months, to maintain personal hygiene and to make use of available herbs to enhance the immunity of the children against viral infections. A total of 31 children were screened at the health camp. The children were found to be malnourished and the ICDS teachers were advised to educate the mothers to provide low cost nutritious diet to the children with available cereals.

### Establishing and Maintenance of Youth Resource Centres

#### **November 2012 – March 2013**

Towards reaching up to the unreached segments of youth population and backward areas and to accelerate the initiatives and interventions for youth development, Youth Resource Centres (YRC) were initiated by RGNIYD in the selected areas of Jharkhand, Kerala, Odisha and West Bengal. During December 2012, YRCs were initiated in Dumka, Hazaribag, Palamau and Ranchi of Jharkhand; Chadayamangalam of Kerala; Mayurbhanj of Odisha; and, Jalpaiguri and Purba Medinipur of West Bengal. Keeping in view of the sustainability of the initiatives, the YRC were initiated in collaboration with the organisations like National Youth Network, Garhwa; Swaraj, Chadayamangalam; Youth Development Foundation, Mayurbhanj; Centre for Development of Human Initiatives, Jalpaiguri, and Aamra Susama Jalaprapat, Purba Medinipur. As part of the initiative, appropriate skill development activities and other capacity building programmes will be taken up depending on the need, scope and opportunities in the operational areas.



### **CAAYE Young Entrepreneurs Summit**

### 13 – 15 December 2012, Mumbai, Maharashtra

The Commonwealth Youth programme, Asia Centre, RGNIYD, CII and Young Indians jointly organised CAAYE Young Entrepreneurs Summit at Mumbai. Around 200 young entrepreneurs from different countries were participated. Ms.Nita Chowdhury, IAS, Secretary, Ministry of youth Affairs and Sports, Gol, New Delhi, Ms.Katherine Ellis, Director, Youth Affairs, Commonwealth Secretariat, London were present during the inauguration. Session on Building a Better Youth Entrepreneurship Ecosystem, Access to Finance, Infrastructure, Regulations and Taxes, Education & Skill Development, Entrepreneurship as a Career, Education as a Business Opportunity, Breaking Trade Barriers and funding young entrepreneurs were held.



# Review meeting on Youth Resource Centre (YRC)

RGNIYD had convened a Review Meeting on Functioning of Youth Resource Centres established in collaboration with Restless Development. - More than 11,000 were reached through the YRC
- 300 people accessed peer support and sought advice on Sexual Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR)
- 140 Young people were trained on 'Microsoft Unlimited Potential Programme'
- 130 Young People availed Career Guidance
- 42 Young People secured jobs through career fairs
- 40 Young People were trained on basic communicative English

### **Nelliampathy Nature Study Camp**

The RGNIYD Nature Club arranged for a Nature Study Camp in the Neliampathy Forest Reserve for 53 students of RGNIYD. # Third Lecture of the RGNIYD's Eminent Speaker Series

#### 22 June, 2012

The Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu organized the third lecture of its Eminent Speaker Series at its premises. About 200 participants, which include youth pursuing various courses including law from various universities, colleges, institutions from different parts of the country, law professionals, legal services authorities, heads of colleges and educational institutions, principals and headmasters, teachers from various schools including the Vice Chancellor and Faculty Members of the Dr. Ambedkar Law University, Chennai participated in the programme.

The purpose of the programme was to create an appropriate platform for the youth through interaction with prominent leaders and icons in various fields. This endeavour was also to facilitate the youth to realize their potential and unleash their creativity through exchange of innovative ideas, with an ultimatum to transform the young people as 'world ready youth' to face contemporary challenges. This series was launched at RGNIYD by Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam during 2010.

Padma Shree. Dr. N. R. Madhava Menon, the architect of the five-year integrated LL.B. Programme in India and the Founder Vice-Chancellor of the National Law School of India University, Bangalore and the National University of Juridical Sciences, Kolkata delivered the third lecture of the RGNIYD's Eminent Series on the theme 'Education for Responsible Citizenship.

This knowledge on each right as enshrined in the Constitution makes life worth living, he added. Speaking on the different dimensions of citizenship, he enlisted the 11 Constitutional values and responsibilities for the citizens.

During the year under report, the PRIYA Division of RGNIYD undertook an action research project titled "Mainstreaming Youth in Local Governance". In 27 states and one Union Territory, one of the village Panchayat/ Gram Panchayat/Village Council from each state was selected for the pilot study and reputed ICSSR Institutions/ academic institutions /development organisations from each state was collaborated for the operationalization of the project. As part of the research, conduct of a youth status study, the needs, concerns, issues, problems and priorities of youth from the study area were collected. In addition, efforts were made to map the initiatives and interventions for youth development by the local

government/ other organisations in the area. Efforts were undertaken to formulate the framework for taking up youth budgeting at the local level in the study areas. The study resulted in bringing several tangible and intangible benefits to the society in general and youth in specific. The study resulted in realising, revisiting, refining, redefining and rejuvenating the measures adopted in the selected areas for mainstreaming youth in local governance. It is expected that such micro level studies have the latent potentials towards achieving 'good governance at the grassroots with more active involvement and participation of youth.

### **A. CAG Audit Report**

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur for the year ended 31 March 2013

- 1. We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur as at 31 March 2012, the Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. The Audit has been entrusted for the period upto 2013-2014. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.
- 2. This separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
- i. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur as required in the rules and regulations of the Institute in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iii. We further report that:

### A. Balance Sheet

### 1.1. Schedule – 6 – Current Assets – Rs. 19.98 Crore

- i. Non-inclusion of Grants accrued and due (sanctioned in March 2013 but received in April 2013) in the accounts of 2012513 has resulted in understatement of Income and understatement of Current Assets to the tune of Rs. 2.01 crore.
- ii. Grants were received under National Programme for Youth and Adolescent Development (AHDP) every year on instalment basis for the year 2011. The Institute has shown AHDP Claim receivable of Rs. 22,02,847 as against Rs. 42,19,203 resulting in understatement of Current Assets and Income to the tune of Rs. 20,16,356.
- iii. An amount of Rs. 2,65,736 paid towards renewal of annual journal subscription pertaining to two accounting years (2012-13 and 2013-14) were booked under the revenue head 'Newspaper and periodicals'. The booking of entire expenditure of Rs. 2,65,736 in the accounts of 2012-13 has resulted in overstatement of Expenditure and understatement of Current Assets Prepaid expenditure to the tune of Rs. 2,00,476.
- iv. An amount of Rs. 17,70,622 was shown under Schedule 6 Current Assets Electricity Deposits. However, the interest accrued for the year 2012-13 to the tune of Rs. 1,59,360 has not been included in the interest of income for the year 2012-13 as well as under Schedule 5 Current Assets Accrued Interest. The non-disclosure of accrued EB deposit interest has resulted in understatement of Current Assets as well as understatement of income to the tune of Rs. 1,59,360.

### **B. Income and Expenditure Account**

### 2.1. Interest Income – Schedule – 8 – Rs. 0.67 Crore

An amount of Rs. 1,04,611 accrued as interest on the deposits made during February 2013 was not accounted for the year 2012-13, resulting in understatement of Income as well as Current Assets to the tune of Rs. 1.05 lakh

### 2.2. Administrative Expenditure – Schedule – 11 – Rs. 3.53 Crore

Non-accounting of outstanding expenditure (due but not paid) as on 31.03.2013 viz. water charges, security charges, repairs & maintenance charges, overtime allowances, has resulted in understatement of Expenditure as well as Current Liabilities- Outstanding Expenditure to the extent of Rs. 13.28 lakh.

### C .Grants-in-aid

Out of the grants-in-aid of Rs. 26.30 crore received during the year 2012-13, and Rs. 5.61 crore being unspent balance of the previous year, the Institute could utilize only a sum of Rs. 13.09 crore leaving a balance of Rs. 18.81 crore as at 31st March 2013.

### D. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur through a management letter issued separately for remedial / corrective action.

- iv. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- v. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.
  - a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur as at 31 March 2013; and
  - b. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account, the surplus for the year ended on that date.

### **Schedule 14 - Significant Accounting Policies**

### 1. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with "Generally accepted Accounting Principles" followed in India under the historical cost convention on the mercantile basis.

### 2. Government Grants

Institute has both restricted and unrestricted grants

Grant received towards Plan, Non-Plan Expenditure and Grants received for Specific programmes have been routed through the Income & Expenditures Account. Capital Grants received have been accounted in the capital fund and unspent balance have been carried forward in the Balance Sheet separately.

### 3. All known Incomes and Expenses are recognised based on accrual method.

### 4. Fixed Assets & Depreciation

Fixed assets are carried at cost of acquisition less deptreciation, Depreciation has been provided on the Written down value method as per the rate prescribed in the Income Tax Act, 1961. Cost of acquisition is inclusive of inward freight, duties and incidental and direct expenses related to the acquisition.

### 5. Retirement Benefits

Liability towards retirement benefits payable to employee has not been provided.

### **Schedule 15-Notes on Accounts**

### 1. Contingent Liabilities

The dispute with M/s. Saravana Contractors Private Ltd., the building contractors is still pending in the Court and orders are still awaited. There is a possibility to pay the compensation to the contractor upon completion of pending dispute. Total compensation awarded by the arbitrator is 1.43 corores (excluding interest).

### 2. Grants

During the year Institute has received the following grants

- a) PLAN Rs. 17.60 Crores
- b) NON-PLAN Rs. 1.70 Crores
- c) Other Grants Rs. 6.98 Crores

During the year the Ministry has sanctioned Rs. 2.01 Crores towards Plan Expenditure, however the same was not received as on 31.03.2013, hence the grant has not been accounted. The Grant was subsequently received in the financial year 2013-14.

### 3. Programme advances

The Institute's policy is to provide advances to programme organisers (both employee & other institutions) for conducting various programmes. After completion of programmes, the Institute receives expenditure settlements from the programme organisers and getting the same settled. However there are advances which are pending for more than 10 years for want of expenditure statements and supporting documentary evidences from the concerned persons. However during the year the Management has decided to clear such advances by obtaining utilisation certificates from the concerned persons without obtaining any supporting documents (Vouchers, Invoices etc.).

Pending advances as on 31.03.2013 are as follows:

- a). Programme Advances Rs. 1,33,02,165/-
- b). Other Advances (For Administrative Expenses) Rs. 13,83,342/-

However, the above advances are cleared off after obtaining utilisation certificate from the concerned persons and such adjustment entries passed in the financial year 2013-14.

### 4. Taxation

Since, the Institute has been registered under 12AA of the Income Tax Act, 1961, the computation of Income has been prepared based on the actual Receipts & Payments Account (on Receipt Basis) as prescribed u/s11 of the Income Tax Act, 1961. There will be no tax liability and hence no provision has been made towards taxation.

5. Previous year'sfigures have been regrouped /reclassified wherever necessary to confirm to current year's classification.

### Management Report for the year 2012-13

The Annual Accounts, Vouchers, Bank Statements and other details pertaining to the financial year 2012-13 furnished to us were audited by us and our observation are detailed hereunder and subject to the Management Report, Audit Report has been issued.

### **Audit observation**

### 1. Details of Grants received and expenditures incurred:

The Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development receives Grants-in- Aid every year from Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports under Plan (for activities such as Training Programmes, Research projects, Up gradation of infrastructure for promotion of youth welfare, etc.) and Non-plan Head (for recurring expenditure of the INSTITUTE). The year wise grant and expenditure statement for the past five years since 2005-06 is given below:

From the above it may be seen that grants received under PLAN schemes are underutilized and excess of expenditure over grant assistance is incurred under NON-PLAN. This excess expenditure was met by diverting funds from PLAN grants, which is in contravention of the conditions specified at the time of releasing the grant.

### 2. Internal Control

Management of the INSTITUTE is responsible for implementing effective Internal Control over its activities. Based on our review and observation there is a weakness in internal control in the following areas and the management may take up initiatives to improve such areas.

- Sanction of Advances & Settlement of Programme Expenditure
- Co-ordination between the departments and the administration at the time of conducting the programmes.
- There is no specific guidelines for claim to Travelling expenses.
- There is prescribed limit for Honorarium paid to resource persons for the programmes organised by RGNIYD. (Both for internal and outsourced resource persons)
- In certain cases, the INSTITUTE has sanctioned funds to certain organisations for conduct of programmes.
   The organisation while submitting their expenditure statements, have not obtained the certificate from Chartered Accountants which was followed till last year. Hence, it is suggested to instruct the programme organising institutions to submit the expenditure statement duly certified by a chartered accountant or a firm of Chartered Accountants.
- Certain payments have been made by the INSTITUTE which attracts tax deduction as source, whereas the INSTITUTE has not deducted tax on such items (details of such payments are separately included in para no. 9)
- APP programme:

There is no system of maintaining DCB (Demand, collection and balance) with regard to Academic programme incomes on a regular basis. However statement provided by the APP division with regard to the total fees received during the year is not matching with the Books of account maintained by the IN-

STITUTE. Hence, it is suggested to implement maintenance of proper records with regard to APP division.

### 3. MEDICAL REIMBURSEMENT

In respect of Medical Reimbursement, there no limit fixed for claim made by the employees. The Limit may be fixed for the future years so as to have the control over medi-claim reimbursements.

The above list has been updated up to February 2013 as informed by the INSTITUTE. From the above it is evident that the INSTITUTE is performing sufficient programmes every year.

### 5. ACADEMIC PROGAMME AT POST GRADUATE LEVEL-NON COLLECTION OF TUITION FEE, MESS CHARGES, ROOM RENT ETC.

From the Academic year 2008-09, the INSTITUTE has commenced five regular

Post Graduate Programmes. Hostel accommodation with mess facility has also been provided to the students Rs. 2,40,241/- is outstanding as on 31.3.2013 towards the Fees.

During the year APP fees schedule was produced to us during the audit. However, the schedule given to us did not tally with the books of accounts. This difference may be reconciled.

### **6.ADVANCES PENDING FOR MORE THAN 10 YEARS**

It is in practice to give advances to the staff for conducting the seminars/training programmes. But the advances drawn were not settled for months/years together. This is being pointed out by us repeatedly every year. There is no internal control in respect of these advances which need to be monitored on the frequent basis and a control system could be developed by the INSTITUTE to reduce the pending advances.

- The pending advances as on 31.03.2013 is
- a. Programme advances Rs. 1,33,02,165/-
- b. Other advances (For Administrative Expenses) Rs. 13,83,342/-

In view of the failure to take proper follow up action for settlement, the advances account was showing an OUTSTANDING BALANCE OF Rs. 1,98,16,228/- as on 31.03.2013

It may be seen that large sums of advances drawn to meet the programme related expenses are outstanding since 2000 onwards. This was pointed out in our earlier reports also. Steps may be taken in this regard to recover the advances and the same may be placed before the Executive committee for their information and orders.

However during the year Management has decided to clear such advances by obtaining utilization certificates from the concerned persons without obtaining any supporting documents (Vouchers, invoices etc.). This needs to be approved/ratified by the Executive Council. As a result during the year 2013-14 the advances outstanding have been brought down to 16,64,103/-

### 7. PRINTING, PURCHASE OF STATIONERIES AND INTERNAL CONTROL:

The purchase of Stationeries were carried out independently by the Training Officers for conducting the Seminars/ workshops instead of centralised purchase. It is suggested that an effective system may be implemented towards the same.

### 8. INTERNAL AUDIT

Since, the INSTITUTE's transactions are increasing day by day and the internal controls are weak, it is suggested that internal audit may be introduced to give reports to the Management on a monthly or quarterly basis so that procedural lapses could be rectified by the INSTITUTE then and there. Due to the absence on internal audit on a number or procedural lapses were noticed like advances pending settlement for more than 10 years, heavy arrears towards tuition fee and hostel charges, non availability of DCB system, non finalization of tenders for purchase of stationery and printing etc.

### 9. TAX DEDUCTED AT SOURCE:

The tax deducted at source have been remitted to the treasury, however there was some non deduction of tax on certain payments. It is suggested to monitor all the payments which are attracting TDS. Tax may be deducted and remitted within due dates in order to avoid penalty under Income Tax Axt, 1961.

### 11. VERFICIATION OF CASH

We have physically verified the cash balance with the petty cash Register and the same was found correct.

### 12. HOUSE RENT ALLOWANCE AND CCA-NOT RECOVERED:

The AG Audit had pointed out that HRA was fixed at the rates applicable for Metropolitan area at 30% instead of 7.5% /10% applicable for other areas including Sriperumbudur, where the INSTITUTE is functioning, and it directed to recover Rs. 31.27 lakhs made during the period from 2006-07 to 2009-10. On verification, it was observed that no recovery was effected till date for the reason that the fixation made already has been referred to the Govt. for ratification and final orders are awaited. In view of this, it is suggested that HRA & CCA may be refixed immediately as per the Rules applicable till final orders are received in this regard and subject to that Audit has been completed.

### 13. FIXED DEPOSITS

Fixed deposit confirmation and interest confirmation certificate has not been obtained from the concerned bank, hence we are unable to verify the correctness of the same. And interest accrued as on 31.03.2013 has not been provided and subject to that Audit has been completed.


### 14. CONSTRUCTION ADVANCES

During the previous financial year Rs.6.11 lakhs had been given to TWAD Board towards construction of water tank inside the RGNIYD Campus, whereas the work completion certificate has not been produced to audit. The work was completed and advance paid has been capitalised during the year under audit.

Further, advances paid to CPWD for construction of buildings, have been capitalized based on the final work completion certificate issued by CPWD which resulted in refund due to the INSTITUTE


