### **PREAMBLE**

Indian youth are a vast human resource and in view of their large numbers the question of tapping their enormous potential has assumed great importance. In this backdrop the growing need for project designing, planning, implementing and monitoring youth development programmes necessitated the establishment of the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD) at Sriperumbudur by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India in 1993.

The RGNIYD was registered under Societies Registration Act, XXVII of 1975 S.No.67 of 1993. The Institute was set up to serve as a nodal agency for training youth functionaries and youth as facilitators of youth development activities in the country. It worked closely with the Youth Organisations viz., NSS and NYKS of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports and other Government and Non-Government Organisations implementing training programmes on youth development.

RGNIYD plays multi-faceted roles in the following areas:

To evolve and achieve an integrated approach to youth development for preparing and empowering the youth for the future, by –

- 2. Preparation of Core Training Material and Facilitator's Manuals
- 3. Enhancing Employability Skills of Youth
- 4. Diagnostic and Impact Assessment Studies

- Action Research
- 6. Monitoring and Evaluation Studies
- Client-based and Demand-driven Training Programmes
- Academic Programmes in relation to Youth Development
- Inter-disciplinary Research in Youth Development
- 10. Youth Exchange Programmes
- 11. Study and Exposure Visits

The Ministry of Human Resources Development (Department of Higher Education, Government of India) had, on the recommendation of the University Grants Commission, declared Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu as a "Deemed-to-be University" under section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956 under the "De Novo Category" vide its notification No. F.9-3/2006-U.3 (A) dated 23 October 2008.Academic programmes at Master's Degree level and Doctoral programme in the sphere of youth development were introduced in 2008 and 2010 respectively. The academic research programmes were initiated to complement with training and outreach programmes.

Later in 2012, it was elevated as an Institute of National Importance by the Act of Parliament No.35/2012, with a vision of achieving excellence in the field of youth development.

As an Institute of National Importance, the Institute functions with the Vision, Mission and Objectives as indicated below:

#### Vision

RGNIYD's vision is to be a globally recognised and acclaimed centre of academic excellence in the field of youth development and fully responsive to the national agenda to meet the needs and aspirations of young people in the country.

#### Mission

The Institute seeks to realise its mission through its multi-faceted functions of policy development, capacity building of youth professionals, conducting academic programmes and research in youth development, establishing National youth resource centre and International Cooperation Division and catering to the needs of young people in the country.

#### **Objectives of the Institute**

The objectives of the Institute are:

- To evolve and achieve an integrated approach to youth development for preparing and empowering the youth for the future, by –
  - a. Providing research inputs for policy formulation and policy analysis
  - b. Conducting impact assessment studies
- ii. To set up advanced National Youth Resource Centre commensurating with the international standards to provide comprehensive and scientifically analysed data on all youth-related

- issues and matters, with adequate library facility, documentation and publication;
- iii. To undertake research and disseminate knowledge;
- iv. To act as a nodal agency for capacity building of stakeholders including youth and organisations / agencies relating to youth;
- v. To empower youth to participate in inclusive development and nation building;
- vi. To evolve as an institute of advanced study in the field of youth and to develop such professional excellence as may be required for the purpose;
- vii. To promote higher education in the field of youth through employment-oriented and inter-disciplinary courses at the post graduate level.

As an apex Institution of higher learning in Youth Studies, RGNIYD offers six full-time Master's Degree Programmes of Two-year duration viz., M. A. Youth Empowerment, M. A. Life Skills Education, M. A. Career Counselling. M. A. Gender Studies, M. A. Local Governance and M.A.Development Practice.

The Hon'ble President of India, Shri. Pranab Mukherjee is the Visitor of RGNIYD from 31August 2012. During the year under report, Shri. ### 1. Overview

As a think-tank of the Ministry of Skill Development, Entrepreneurship, Youth Affairs and Sports, RGNIYD formulated the draft National Youth Policy 2012. Based on the review and suggestions of the Exposure Draft of the National Youth Policy 2012 that emerged from the key stakeholders, experts, policy makers etc, the draft NYP was refurbished and a final National Youth Policy 2014 document was prepared by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India.

The Union Cabinet approved the introduction of the National Youth Policy-2014 (NYP-2014) on 9th January 2014, replacing NYP-2003 which was formally launched across the country in various Universities, Colleges and Youth Development Organisations across the country on 21st February 2014. The National Youth Policy (NYP) 2014 and the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan (RGKA) were launched at RGNIYD on 21st February 2014 by Shri. Sudhir Kumar, Joint Secretary (YA), Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports.

The Fifth Indian Youth Science Congress was jointly organised by MSSRF, Visva-Bharati, SRM University and Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development at Shantiniketan, Kolkata during December 2013 on the theme "Leading Mind into Ever-widening Thought and Action" which was inaugurated by His Excellency the President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee.

The state-of-the-art RGNIYD Central Library was inaugurated by Shri. Jitendra Singh, Hon'ble Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Youth Affairs and Sports on 4th March 2014 and also laid the foundation stones for the construction of the new academic and residential complexes

at RGNIYD, Sriperumbudur. The RGNIYD Central Library provides access to researchers and students of youth-related studies to e-library, intranet and internet connected digital library facilities. A treasure trove of books, journals, working papers, reports and documentaries, the RGNIYD Central Library presently has 21,000 such exclusive publications on youth development and allied fields besides link with the knowledge network under Knowledge Mission of the Government of India. A separate work station for the research scholars and facilities for translation of youth-related learning material, articles published in journals, case studies, success stories, locally available natural wisdom and classics in different languages have also been made available.

In commemoration of the 70th Birth Anniversary of Shri. Rajiv Gandhi, the RGNIYD organized its Fifth Foundation Day on 20 August 2013 at its campus. Dr. Sam Pitroda, Adviser to the Prime Minister on Public Information Infrastructure & Innovations and Chairman, National Innovation Council delivered the Foundation Day Lecture.

The Horizontal Learning Program (HLP) is an outcome-based initiative and is unique in its method of learning by performing. To popularise this, RGNIYD in collaboration with Centre on Integrated Rural Development for Asia and the Pacific (CIRDAP), Bangladesh conducted a programme at Sriperumbudur during the year.

In order to create a cadre of young social entrepreneurs across the country, RGNIYD prepared a training manual on Social Entrepreneurship and pilot tested the training manual. A national workshop on 'Building Perspectives on Youth Policy' was held at RGNIYD in collaboration with Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung (FES) during which discussions on four thematic areas vis a vis, Citizenship, Education, Skill Development and Work/ Employment were held.

In order to assess the region-specific Youth needs and problems of South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) countries, to deliberate on the youth policies of various countries in the SAARC region, learn best practices of SAARC countries for emulation and to create a platform for the youth functionaries for effective programme and policy implementation, a consultation was held at RGNIYD.

The RGNIYD, CYP Asia Centre and the British Council jointly organised one day programme on "Youth Leadership and Global Citizenship Initiatives" and a Workshop on Social Media.

The RGNIYD played host for the 14 students of the Department of Family, Youth and Community Sciences, University of Florida as part of their study abroad programme who were educated on the Decentralised Governance, Mainstreaming Youth in Local Governance and Youth Development in India at RGNIYD. The Institute facilitated a field visit to the Mudichur Village Panchayat besides organising interactions with the local Panchayat Presidents and SHG Members for the international students.

The Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt. of India, the Commonwealth Youth Programme (CYP) Asia Centre, the British Council and the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development jointly organised the Second Asia Youth Leaders' Summit 2013 under the theme "Be Seen, Be Heard" to discuss the issues pertaining to youth engagement/participation in the decision making process.

As part of the Indo- Swedish Academic Exchange Programme, a Capacity Building on Youth & Democracy for Swedish Scholars was organised at RGNIYD in collaboration with the Institute of Development Research and Corporate Ethics, Chennai. The faculty and scholars from different institutions of Sweden had interactions on youth

and Democracy, India and its Global Challenges, and Mainstreaming Youth in Local Governance – Experiences from India with the faculty and students of RGNIYD.

Commemorating the International Youth Day the RGNIYD organised a special Lecture. Dr. Irudaya Rajan, Chair Professor, Ministry of Overseas Indian Affairs, Centre for Development Studies, Thiruvananthapuram delivered a lecture on Internal Migration and Youth in India. The programme was followed by a research study presentation titled Quality of Work Life of Migrant Workers in the Special Economic Zone of Sriperumbudur conducted jointly by RGNIYD and Aid et Action International, Chennai.

To build leadership skills, strengthen communication skills and to provide the youth with social experiences, one-month "Rajiv Gandhi Youth Leadership Internship Programme (RGYLIP) – 2013 was held at RGNIYD from 15 May-13 June 2013 with 53 interns from 16 states all over India from diverse educational background like B.E., B.Tech., P.G. in Agriculture, Fishery Science, Coastal economics, Criminology, Social work and Management.

Recognising the imperativeness of the role of media in shaping the young people, a three-day National Seminar on Youth and Media was organised to deliberate upon the issues related to youth and media, provide platform to discuss the role of youth in print, electronic, radio and New Media for development, to examine the various dimensions of media impact on youth and to formulate an action plan/suggestive measures for effective and positive coverage of important issues in media.

A Career Helpline to provide information through telephone, SMS, e-mail and social media was launched by RGNIYD in association with Youth Resource Centre, National Youth Network, Ranchi, Jharkhand and the Directorate of Employment and Training, Govt. of Jharkhand during May 2013.

A national level interactive series with eminent personalities has been launched by the National Innovation Council and broadcasted live over the National Knowledge Network to all the connected Institutions.

As a sequel to this effort, Shri Rahul Gandhi, Member of Parliament in the Lok Sabha addressed the student youth on 'The Agenda for Change: Education and Nation Building" on February 15 from Bangalore University and on 26 February from Assam University through video conferencing.

During 2013-14, another post graduate programme was introduced viz., M.A. Development Practice.

During the year under report, RGNIYD trained 1,467 master trainers trained, 5,237 youth and youth functionaries through its capacity building programmes. A total of 270 youth participated in National/ International Exchange Programmes through RGNIYD. 2,959 NSS/ NYKS functionaries and youth volunteers were trained through various programmes organised by RGNIYD. Through the youth leadership internship programmes 578 youth were benefited during the year. The training manual on Social Entrepreneurship was prepared by RGNIYD and was pilot tested besides conducting training of trainers programmes on the theme.

RGNIYD organised a 10-day Training of Trainers programme on Disaster Preparedness and Risk Reduction for the National Youth Corps and Functionaries of Youth Clubs from tsunami, cyclone and flood prone coastal districts of Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry at RGNIYD. A similar programme was held at Joshimath, Chamoli District (one of the most disaster-prone districts of the country), Uttarkhand.

The RGNIYD in collaboration with NYKS organized a National Integration Camp at Kagenele, Haveri District, Karnataka to inculcate secular values and to promote social harmony and sadbavana among the youth for the NYKS Volunteers of eight states viz., Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Odisha, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, and Karnataka.

The Inter-state Youth Exchange and Home Stay Programme was organised by RGNIYD in Collaboration with NSS Regional Centre, Hyderabad and NSS Cell, Andhra University, Visakhapatnam. 90 NSS volunteers and 13 Programme Officers from Mizoram, Manipur, Assam, Nagaland, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Sikkim and Andhra Pradesh participated.

The following sections provide details on various activities conducted by RGNIYD during the year 2013-2014.

### 2. Training and Other Activities

### A. TRAINING OF TRAINERS

Training of Trainers Programme on Disaster Preparedness and Risk Reduction 28 March -03 April, 2014, RGNIYD

Panchayati Raj and Youth Affairs (PRIYA) Division organised 7 day Training of Trainers' Programme on Disaster Preparedness and Risk Reduction for National Youth Corps (NYC) Volunteers and Functionaries of Youth Clubs from Andhra Pradesh during 28 March - 03 April, 2014. 35 male volunteers from the coastal districts of Andhra Pradesh participated in the programme. Practical sessions were handled by Emergency Management and Research Institute (108 Ambulance Service), and 4th Battalion of National Disaster Response Force, Arakkonam. The participants were provided inputs on various types of mapping, emergency kit preparation and village disaster preparedness planning and a transect walk was organised in 2004 at Tsunami affected areas of Chennai for better field understanding of the trainees.

# Training of Trainers on Youth and Peace Building Organized by RGNIYD and Commonwealth Youth Programme Asia Centre, 28 March – 06 April 2013, RGNIYD

A Training of Trainers on Youth and Peace Building organized by Commonwealth Youth Programme, Asia centre Chandigarh and Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur was held at RGNIYD, Sriperumbudur. There were 23 participants from different parts of the country (India) working in the field of peace building. Topics such as Understanding conflict and its type,

Conflict and violence, Enemy image, Social conflict, Role of power in conflict, Conflict analysis, Youth and peace building, Non Violence communication, Consensus decision making, Media and peace building, Trauma counselling, Mediation and negotiation, Art and peace building, Appreciative inquiry, Learning styles and intelligence, Training Horrors and challenges were dealt.

## TOT on Youth Employability 01 - 05 June, 2013 at Shimoga, Karnataka

RGNIYD in collaboration with Samanvaya organised the programme at Shimoga from 1 - 5 June 2013 for 35 participants from Shimoga district. The objective of the training programme was to enhance youth employability among the participants and to create a band of master trainers who can take the training across the district of Shimoga. The partner organisation Samanvaya has agreed to conduct employability training programme in all the 7 taluks of the district.

### 5-Day ToT on Environment and Sustainable Development, 03 – 07 June 2013, Rajkiya Madhaya Vidyala, Namidih, Vaishali, Bihar

The training of trainers programme on Environment and Sustainable Development was organized by RGNIYD along with Raj Narayan Seva Sansthan, Namidhi at Rajkiya Madhaya Vidyala, Namidih, Vaishali, Bihar. The programme was inaugurated by Shri. Jitendra Singh, Member of the Advisory Group, Ministry of Environment and Forest, Government of India. Shri. Jai Prakash Chaudhary, Zila Parishad, Chairperson was the chief guest. Prof. Dinesh Singh, RBS College, Vaishali, was the guest of honour. A

total of 40 youth from different districts of Bihar participated.

### TOT on Gender Equity 04-08 June 2013, IFFT, Hatia, Jharkhand

The Gender Equity Division, RGNIYD in collaboration with the NSS Regional Centre, Patna, organized a TOT on Gender Equity at National Institute of Foundary and Forge Technology (NIFFT), Hatia, Jharkhand during 04 - 08 June 2013. The training objective was to enhance knowledge, sensitize, and train youth functionaries on varied aspects of Gender Issues, and to develop understanding as a way to change behaviour to promote Gender Equity. Dr. Hemalata S. Mohan, Chairperson, Jharkhand State Commission for Women was the Chief Guest for the inaugural function and Prof. Sanjay Kumar, Director, National Institute of Foundary and Forge Technology (NIFFT) was the Guest of Honour. There were 45 NSS programme officers from the states of Bihar, Chattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha and West Bengal who participated in the programme.

### Training of Trainers on Life Skills 05 - 09 June 2013, Kristu Jayanti College, Bangalore

The five day training of trainers programme on Life Skills for the Assistant and Associate Professors was held at Kristu Jayanti College from 05 – 09 June 2013. A total of 55 teaching faculty participated in this programme. Inputs on the the ten core life skills and training methodologies were provided to the participants.

## Training of Trainers on Life Skills and Personality Development for the NCC / Army Officers 19 – 25 June 2013, RGNIYD

With the objective of imparting knowledge and skills on life skills, the Youth and Adolescent Health Division (YAHD) organized Training of Trainers Programme on Life Skills and Personality Development for the NCC officers viz., Commandos,

Deputy Directors, Girls Cadet Instructors, Associate NCC Officers. The training was held in RGNIYD during 19 – 25 June 2013. A total of 33 NCC officers (20 male and 13 female) from southern and central states of India participated in this programme. They were imparted with knowledge on ten core life skills, parenting adolescents and motivating self and other, team building and leadership qualities. Shri. P. Michael Vetha Siromony, Director RGNIYD inaugurated the programme. The training sessions were conducted as per the facilitator's manual of RGNIYD.

## Training of Trainers on Life Skills and Personality Development

24 - 28 June 2013, NCC Directorate, Bangalore

The Youth and Adolescent Health Division (YAHD) organized Training of Trainers Programme on Life Skills and Personality Development for the Associate NCC Officers (ANOs) of Karnataka and Goa at NCC Direcotrate, Bangalore from 24 to 28 June 2013. 40 NCC officers participated in the training. The participants were given theoretical and conceptual inputs, with practicum and training exposure through mock sessions on the topics of ten core life skills, team building and leadership.

## Training of Trainers on Life Skills and Personality Development for the NCC / Army Officer 15-19 July 2013, DGNCC Camp Parade, New Delhi

The Training of Trainers on Life Skills and Personality Development for the NCC officers viz., Commanders, Deputy Directors, Girls Cadet Instructors, and Associate NCC Officers was held at DGNCC Camp Parade, New Delhi during 15 – 19 June 2013. A total of 35 NCC officers (27 men and 8 women) from North and North Eastern states of India participated. They were imparted with knowledge on ten core life skills, parenting adolescents and motivating self and other, team building and leadership qualities. Lt Gen PS Bhalla, Director General NCC inaugurated the programme.

### TOT on International Migration 29-31 July 2013, Chennai, Tamil Nadu

The training of trainers programme on International Migration - Predeparture Training programme during 29 - 31 July 2013 was organized by Migration Cell, RGNIYD in association with Arunodhaya Migrant Initiatives at Holy Cross, Chennai.

## TOT Programme on Youth Employability 22-27 August 2013, Ropar, Punjab

RGNIYD in collaboration with NSS Regional Center and Punjab Technical University organized a six-day TOT Programme on 'Youth Employability' at Rayat Institute of Management, Ropar, Punjab. A total of 46 under graduate students including 23 girls and 23 boys from eighteen colleges of Punjab, Chandigarh and Haryana successfully completed the programme. The students participated enthusiastically and were immensely benefitted from the programme.

## ToT on Social Harmony and National Unity 23-27 August, 2013, Barkatullah University, Bhopal, M.P

# Decentralised Governance and Youth Development 02 August 2013, Sriperumbudur

Technical Session on Trafficking and Migration – Concept and Dimension was handled by Mr. Richard Ebenezer, Advocate, Madras High Court. Sessions on The Interstate Migrant Workman (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1979, Migration, Trends, Patterns, Internal and Inter-State Migration (Concept and Dimension), Migrant workers welfare in Trade Union's perspective were held.

# State level workshop on Youth Migration in Odisha- Issues and Challenges

25 June 2013, CYSD, Bhubaneswar

The Migration Cell, RGNIYD in collaboration with, MIRC (Migration Information & Resource Centre) Aide et Action organized a State level Workshop on Youth Migration in Odisha - Issues and Challenges. A total of 60 participants representing the Youth migrants, PRI members, NGO functionaries, activists. Government representative academicians participated and shared their views in addressing the issues of youth migration in the state. The Inaugural session was chaired by Mr. Aurobindo Behera, IAS Retd.) Shri. Santosh Sarangi, IAS, Honorable Commissioner cum Secretary, ST & SC Development Dept. Govt. of Odisha delivered his valedictory address.

Dr. Pitabasa Sahoo, Member Planning, BDA, Bhubaneswar highlighted RGNIYD's mandate on the issues related to migration. Dr. Ambika Nanda, state representative of UNDP shared his view on youth migration referring to Human Development

Index of UNDP published in 2010. Migrant youth who participated in the workshop shared their experiences of distress situation at source and destination. Sarapanches of Balangir, Nuapada and Malkangiri also shared their initiatives in ensuring 100 days employment through MGNREGA and reduced distress migration. Sudhir Kumar, who also highlighted the salient features of NYP 2014 and RGKA and flagged off the Rally comprising of 1500 student youth drawn from 18 educational institutions in and around Sriperumbudur from RGNIYD to Rajiv Gandhi Memorial via Sriperumbudur Town and Bus Terminus to disseminate the highlights of the NYP and RGKA. The rally was led by Shri. V. Subash, Shri. V. Hari Prasad and Ms. J. Sreevidhya who set the world record by climbing the Mount Everest from Lukla to Everest Base and Camp Lukla in less than five days covering 5500 meters (approx).

The Joint Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs was present during the occasion. Faculty and students of various Colleges and youth functionaries participated in the programme.

The vision of NYP-2014 aims at empowering the Indian youth to achieve their fullest potential, and through them enable India to find its rightful place in the comity of nations. Towards achieving this vision, the Policy delineates five well-defined objectives and 11 priority areas besides suggesting policy interventions in each priority area. The priority areas include education, skill development and employment, entrepreneurship, health and healthy lifestyle, sports, promotion of social values,

community engagement, participation in politics and governance, youth engagement, inclusion and social justice.

The Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan has been launched with the objectives to include promotion of sports as a way of life among the youth, increase access to sports facilities throughout the country, conduct sports competitions across the country to identify talent and to encourage achievement of excellence in sports. The scheme envisages over 6500 sports complexes in every rural block of the country wherein, each sports complex will have 11 outdoor and 5 indoor games including multi gym, three sports trainers, sports equipment worth Rs.15 lakh, provision for self-defence training, particularly for women and a facility housing the youth resource centre.

At block level Rs.1 lakh, at District level. Rs.4 lakh, at State level Rs. 2 lakh for each district and at national level Rs.10 lakh will be provided respectively for sports discipline to conduct competitions for identifying the talent. Each sports complex will be built at a cost of Rs.1.75 crores on a fast track basis. RGKA is a unique scheme which provides convergence of various governmental schemes viz., MGNREGA, NLCPR-Central, ACA for LWE and RGKA.

#### Inauguration of Central Library and Foundation Stone Laying of the New Academic & Residential Complex

#### 04 March 2014, RGNIYD

The RGNIYD has created a new infrastructure to establish its state-of-the-art central library of international standards with referral providing access to e-library, intranet and internet connected digital library facilities. A treasure trove of books, journals, working papers, reports and documentaries has a capacity for 21,000 such exclusive publications on youth development and

allied fields. The RGNIYD Central Library has a link with the knowledge network under Knowledge Mission of the Government of India. The Central Library also houses a National Youth Resource Centre annexed to it. The infrastructure has been created at a cost of Rs. 20 crores.

Shri. Jitendra Singh, Hon'ble Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Youth Affairs and Sports inaugurated the state-of-the-art Central Library. ### Research

The PRIYA Division of RGNIYD undertook an action research project titled "Mainstraming Youth in Local Governance" in 27 States and one Union Territory during the year 2012-13. The project was continued during the year 2013-14. The research project envisaged identification of one village Panchayat/Gram Panchayat/Village Council from each of the 27 state for the pilot study and for collaboration with reputed ICSSR Institutions/ academic institutions /development organisations from each state to operationalize the project.

As part of the research, conduct of a youth status study, the needs, concerns, issues, problems and priorities of youth from the study area were collected. In addition, efforts were made to map the initiatives and interventions for youth development by the local government/ other organisations in the area. Efforts were undertaken to formulate the framework for taking up youth budgeting at the local level in the study areas. The study resulted in bringing several tangible and intangible benefits to the society in general and youth in specific. The study resulted in realising, revisiting, refining, redefining and rejuvenating the measures adopted in the selected areas for mainstreaming youth in local governance. It is expected that such micro level studies have the latent potentials towards achieving 'good governance at the grassroots with more active involvement and participation of vouth.

### **Schedule 14 - Significant Accounting Policies**

### 1. Basic of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with "Generally Accepted Accounting Principles" followed in India under the historical cost convention on the mercantile basis.

### 2. Government Grants

Institute has both restricted and unrestricted grants.

Restricted grants are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions given at the time of grant.

Grant received towards Plan, Non-Plan Expenditures and Grants received for Specific programms have been routed through the Income & Expenditures Account. Capital Grants received have been accounted in the capital fund and unspent balances have been carried forward in the Balance Sheet separately.

3. All known Incomes and Expenses are recognised based on accrual method.

### 4. Fixed Assets & Depreciation

Fixed assets are carried at cost of acquisition less depreciation. Depreciation has been provided on the Written down value method as per the rate prescribed in the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Cost of acquisition is inclusive of inward freight, duties and incidental and direct expenses related to the acquisition.

Institute had purchased a Land at a cost of Rs. 36,26,970/-. Depreciation has been provided including the Land cost in the earlier years, hence the land cost has been separately disclosed and the difference depreciation has been revised during the current year.

### 5. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

Liability towards retirement benefits payable to employee has not been provided.

### 3. PROGRAMME ADVANCES

The Institute's policy is to provide advances to programme organizers (both employees & other institutions) for conducting various programmes. After completion of programmes; the Institute receives expenditure settlements from the programme organizers and getting the same settled. There were advances pending from earlier years for want of expenditures statements and supporting documentary evidences from the concerned persons. However during the previous year the Management has decided to clear such advances by obtaining utilization certificates from the concerned persons without obtaining any supporting documents (Vouchers, invoices etc).

Accordingly, as per the direction of management during the year, Institute has adjusted such advances by obtaining self utilization certificate from Organizers and other Institutes who had received advances for conducting various programmes.

Institute should either obtain vouchers with original bills or utilization certificate which is duly authenticated by Chartered Accountant and ensure that fund had been utilized as per the directions given by the Institute.

# Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Rajiv Gandhi National of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur for the year ended 31 March 2014

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur as at 31 March 2014, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 28(2) of the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development Act 2012. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cumperformance aspects, etc., if any are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4 Based on our audit, we report that :
- i We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur as required in the rules and regulations of the Institute in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iii We further report that :
- A Balance Sheet
- 1 Current Assets Cash & Bank balance Rs 6.84 crore

New Pension Scheme and Contributory Provident Fund accumulations not accounted in the Balance sheet - Rs 105.05 lakh

Balance available in Bank Accounts pertaining to Contributory Provident Fund (CPF) and New Pension Scheme (NPS) funds as on 31.3.2014 was Rs 105.05 lakh.

The above balances have not been accounted in the annual accounts resulting in understatement of assets (current assets - Bank balances) and understatement of liabilities (Earmarked fund - retirement benefit funds) to the tune of Rs 105.05 lakh.

### 2 Current liabilities - Rs 52.77 lakh

# Non provision of Interest on CPF/NPS contributions - Understatement of current liabilities and expenditure (CPF/NPS fund) - Rs. 15.36 lakh

Non provision of Interest payable on CPF and NPS accumulations which works out to Rs 15,36,348 for the period 2008-09 to 2013-14 in the accounts had resulted in understatement of current liabilities as well as expenditure to the extent of Rs 15.36 lakh.

### B. Income & Expenditure Accounts

### Depreciation Rs. 2.81 crore

The Institute has not classified the buildings as 'residential' and 'non-residential'. The Institute has provided depreciation at the rate of 10% uniformly on all types of buildings. Thus the incorrect application of depreciation rates on buildings has resulted in overstatement of depreciation and understatement of fixed assets - Buildings.

### Other income Rs. 16.78 lakh

Grants of Rs. 4,85,710 was received from the Ministry towards reimbursement of expenditure incurred for a specific programme which was already conducted by the Institute. Hence the grant was to be accounted under 'Earmarked fund - SAARC Youth Camp'. However the Institute has accounted the reimbursement Grants for SAARC as 'Other Income' in the Income and Expenditure Account for the year 2013-14 resulting in Overstatement of Income to that extent.

### C General

### Non apportionment of interest earned to the respective grants

The Institute has received Rs 11,70,00,000 during the year 2013-14 for various purpose such as Plan, Non-Plan, SC Sub Plan, ST Sub Plan and Youth Development Programme for North East Region.

As per the ledger, Rs 82,08,312 received as interest from the above grants has been accounted as income in the Income and Expenditure Account. Interest earned by the above grants have not been apportioned to the respective grants.

### D Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

### E Grants-in-aid

Out of the grants-in-aid of Rs. 21.73 crore received during the year 2013-14, internal receipts of Rs. 1.12 crore and Rs 18.81 crore being unspent balance of the previous year (totaling Rs 41.66 crore), the Institute could utilize only a sum of Rs 34.16 crore leaving a balance of Rs 7.50 crore as at 31st March 2014.

- iv Subject to out observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- v In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India;
- a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur as at 31st March 2014 and
- b. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account, the deficit for the year ended on that date.
