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## DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Keeping in view the slogan of Sab ke Sath, Sab Ke Vikas, advocated by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development envisioned an inclusive approach in all its programmes and activities during the year 2016-17 to address the aspirations of the young millennials charting out their future.

Through the bountiful support of the Members of the Executive Council and the Academic Council and the officials of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, the RGNIYD and its Regional Centre has made several strides in the arenas of academics, training, research, policy interventions and extension services and has been able to reach out its services across the country.

The RGNIYD during the year under report undertook concerted efforts to strengthen its academic mandate. The curricula at RGNIYD is inbuilt to enable the students to choose a particular course that allows development of thinking as well as analytical ability, he/she gets equipped with necessary skills ultimately making him/her suitable for an employment and to integrate values of our culture with education.

Besides reviewing the existing academic programmes, keeping in view the contemporary requirements of the knowledge society and the world of work, the Institute has launched new Master's Degree programmes in Social Work with specialization in youth and community development.

In order to achieve the mandate of RGNIYD and execute the priority areas of National Youth Policy 2014, RGNIYD has launched the Post-Graduate Diploma in Youth Development (PGDYD) on a convergence mode from January, 2016 onwards train youth development professionals to enhance their competencies in youth work.

In collaboration with the Centre for Social Innovation and Engineering at IIT Madras, development of modular courses on Social Entrepreneurship are on the anvil. To create a pool of skilled professionals, the Institute launched Certificate and Diploma programmes in community mental health, youth development, logistics management, IT and ITeS sectors. Serious efforts were also taken to increase the student strength by sixty four per cent in the current academic year.

In order to enhance the academic vibrancy of the campus several lectures and discussions by eminent academics and practitioners were organised. Further, to enhance the employability skills of the students, exclusive programmes were

conducted to hone their skills. To enrich the campus life of the students, several initiatives were undertaken through the Counselling and Assessment Centre to provide counselling, mentoring and guidance services besides building their capacities for unleashing their potentials. The students and faculty are provided with adequate facilities to participate in various programmes including exchange visits both nationally and internationally.

The Departments under the Academic Division have organised several workshops, special lectures, training and outreach programmes at regional and national levels. To keep the student updated RGNIYD has hosted a number of seminars and conferences.

The Institute expanded its scope of training operations by partnering with Governmental and credible non-government organisations across the country.

The Institute has signed MoUs with various organisations to upscale its academic, training and extension services. RGNIYD signed an MoU with Saint-Gobain India Private Limited (SGIPL) Flat Glass Business in the presence of honourable President of India to strengthening capacities of local communities, promote collaborative action research projects and development of CSR field work engagements for students of RGNIYD.

Another path-breaking effort to bridging the gap between Social Sciences and Pure Sciences, the RGNIYD has started working closely with the Indian Institute of Remote Sensing. Through the MoU inked with them, efforts were taken up to:

- Develop syllabus for a 3 credit course on geo-spatial technology for governance and development
- Establish a Geo-spatial lab in RGNIYD with the help of Indian Institute of Remote Sensing
- Train and build the capacity of RGNIYD faculty on geo-spatial technology usage

- Participate in a mission for asset mapping of Panchayats under Bhuvan Panchayat Portal

To gain deep insights about spatial knowledge and in equipping young people with geo-spatial skills, Asset Mapping exercises have been undertaken in collaboration with Indian Institute of Remote Sensing (IIRS), Dehra Dun. For this purpose, 40 villages have been identified for implementing the project. As part of their field practicum, the students have been involved in various mapping exercises for developmental initiatives.

As pointed out by our Honourable Prime Minister, A Skilled India is a Successful India. RGNIYD has recognized its role to equip the youth with vocational skills, promote the spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship to contribute to the nation's progress. Towards accomplish this national goal; the RGNIYD has conducted various skill training programmes through the Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship, National Institute for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and the ICT Academy of Tamil Nadu in various states. The Institute has also trained over 9000 college students on entrepreneurship. The RGNIYD Regional Centre has trained hundreds of youth on computer applications and hardware. During the year, a skill development project was launched at Chandigarh by Smt. Kirron Kher, Hon'ble Member of Parliament.

An MoU for Model Village Adoption Programme was signed with IIT, Guwahati and the initiative seeks to adopt two villages, Umden in Meghalaya and Pyranga in Assam, to impart sustainable livelihood skills to the population. Handloom, Weaving and Value added ready made products are the focus of the intervention. As subsidiary components of the program, Health and Sanitation have also been included. With the commitment to promote vocational education and skilled workforce in the country, the Institute continued to offer two Bachelor's programmes in Apparel Manufacturing and Entrepreneurship and Fashion Designing and Apparel Training and Design Centres.

RGNIYD has trained tribal youth as social animators in various parts of the country in the past decade, based on a training module specially designed by the Institute. On 29 August 2016, an MoU was signed with the Tribal Research Centre, Department of Tribal Welfare, Government of Tamil Nadu through which it is

envisaged to design appropriate programmes that seeks to empower tribal youth in Tamil Nadu. A MoU has been signed with Assam Rajiv Gandhi University of Cooperative Management to provide networking assistance to facilitate legal and IT assistance. In partnership with the Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs, a certificate programme in Corporate Social Responsibility is proposed to be offered. With a view to rehabilitate and mainstream the differently abled, RGNIYD offers consultancy and psycho-social rehabilitation services at the NIEPMD Extension Centre at RGNIYD.

To name a few other notable social responsibility initiatives of the Institute during the year are Village Adoption Programme, promotion of peace education, legal awareness programmes for young college girls, and alike.

The e-Governance component of Digital India program, which re-engineers and simplifies government processes that make governance more participatory has been initiated at RGNIYD. Swachh Bharat program that is now a mass movement in the country is paving way for a cleaner and greener India. We at RGNIYD, practice the civic duty of Swachhta.

The Institute's new building dedicated for the 'Youth Resource Centre' (YRC) intended to serve as a knowledge hub for the future generations was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Minister of State (IC) for Youth Affairs and Sports, Shri. Vijay Goel.

During the year, the first Convocation at RGNIYD was organised during which 163 graduands were awarded Masters Degrees in various disciplines, namely, Youth Empowerment, Career Counselling, Gender Studies, Local Governance, Life Skills Education, and Development Practice. From 2008-10 Batch to 2014-16 Batches, 37 candidates will be awarded rank certificates for the scholastic achievement. Besides, Ms. Lakshmi Vaidyanathan Endowment Gold Medal for the first rank holder in Gender Studies was also instituted.

Continuing this trend, the Institute proposes to expand its number of teaching programmes, enhance the research and training capabilities and make meaningful policy interventions.

## OVERVIEW OF RGNIYD

The Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD) is an Institution of National Importance by the Act of Parliament No. 35/12. It is an apex Institution of the Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, functions with the goal of building the capacity of youth organisations, functionaries and professionals. The Institute works in close association with NSS and NYKs in conducting training programmes across the country for youth functionaries. RGNIYD endeavours to facilitate the nation's youth with a conducive environment and tools that will enable them to make the most of their natural potential to realize their aspirations.

RGNIYD serves as a vital resource centre with its multi-faceted functions of conducting training programmes for youth functionaries across the country, besides offering academic programmes, engaging in seminal research in the vital areas of youth development and extension and outreach initiatives across the country.

RGNIYD serves as a youth observatory and depository in the country, thereby embarking on surveillance on youth-related issues. It has a wide network with various organisations working for the welfare and development of youth.

### 2.1. The objects of the Institute

- a. To evolve and achieve an integrated approach to youth development for preparing and empowering the youth for the future, by –
  - i. providing action oriented research inputs for policy formulation;
  - ii. implementation of policy through extension and other programmes

promoting assessment and impact study and conducting teaching, training and other academic programmes;
- b. To set up advanced National Youth Resource Centre commensurate with the international standards to provide for comprehensive and scientifically analysed data on all youth-related issues and matters, with adequate library facility, documentation and publication;
- c. To provide for research and development and dissemination of knowledge through extension and outreach programmes;

- d. To act as a nodal agency for capacity building of stakeholders including youth bodies, organisations and agencies relating to youth;
- e. To empower youth to participate in inclusive development and nation building;
- f. To evolve as an institute of advanced study in the field of youth and to develop such professional excellence as may be required for the purpose;
- g. To provide for higher education in the field of youth development through employment-oriented and inter-disciplinary courses at the post graduate level.

### 2.2. Functions of the Institute

The Institute shall:

- a. develop as a “think tank” by way of carrying out policy research, evaluation and impact analysis on youth programmes and issues of contemporary and future relevance;
- b. function as a repository of knowledge pertaining to data on youth;
- c. develop documentation, information and publication of services for youth training and extension;
- d. provide technical advice and consultancy for formulation of youth related policy and promotion of youth programme;
- e. build the professional capacity of youth organisations, both in Government and voluntary sector;
- f. design, develop and conduct appropriate training and orientation programmes;

- g. conduct seminars, workshops and conferences on issues relating to youth;
- h. set up centres for dissemination of academic and training programmes;
- i. collaborate with national and international university, centres, institutes and such other agencies relating to youth training and youth development;
- j. establish programmes of study and research and to provide for instruction in such branches of study as the institute deems appropriate;
- k. award, subject to such conditions as the Institute may determine, degrees, diplomas, certificates or other academic distinctions or titles at various academic levels;
- l. confer honorary degrees or other distinction awards, fellowships, scholarships, prizes and medals;
- m. determine, demand and receive fees and other charges for its courses, programmes and other matters;
- n. conduct and coordinate projects and studies relating to youth sponsored by the Government of India and other developmental agencies;
- o. create with the prior approval of the Central Government, academic, technical, administrative, managerial and other posts in the Institute and make appointments thereto in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Institute
- p. regulate the conduct of the affairs of the Institute
- q. supervise and control the discipline of all categories of employees and students of the Institute;
- r. purchase, hire, lease, exchange or acquire property, movable or immovable and to construct, alter and maintain any building or buildings as may be necessary;
- s. set up distance learning or educational centres, in collaboration with Open Universities, to provide access to the aspiring young professionals enabling them to take up a career in the field of youth development;
- t. establish, maintain and manage halls of residences and hostels for students;
- u. lay down conditions of service including a code of conduct for teachers and other categories of employees;
- v. supervise, control and regulate the discipline of students of the Institute and to make arrangements for promoting their health and general welfare
- w. coordinate student exchange programmes with reputed International Youth Development Institutions
- x. undertake, assist and promote all such activities conducive or incidental to the attainment of the objectives.

### 2.3. Governance Structure of RGNIYD

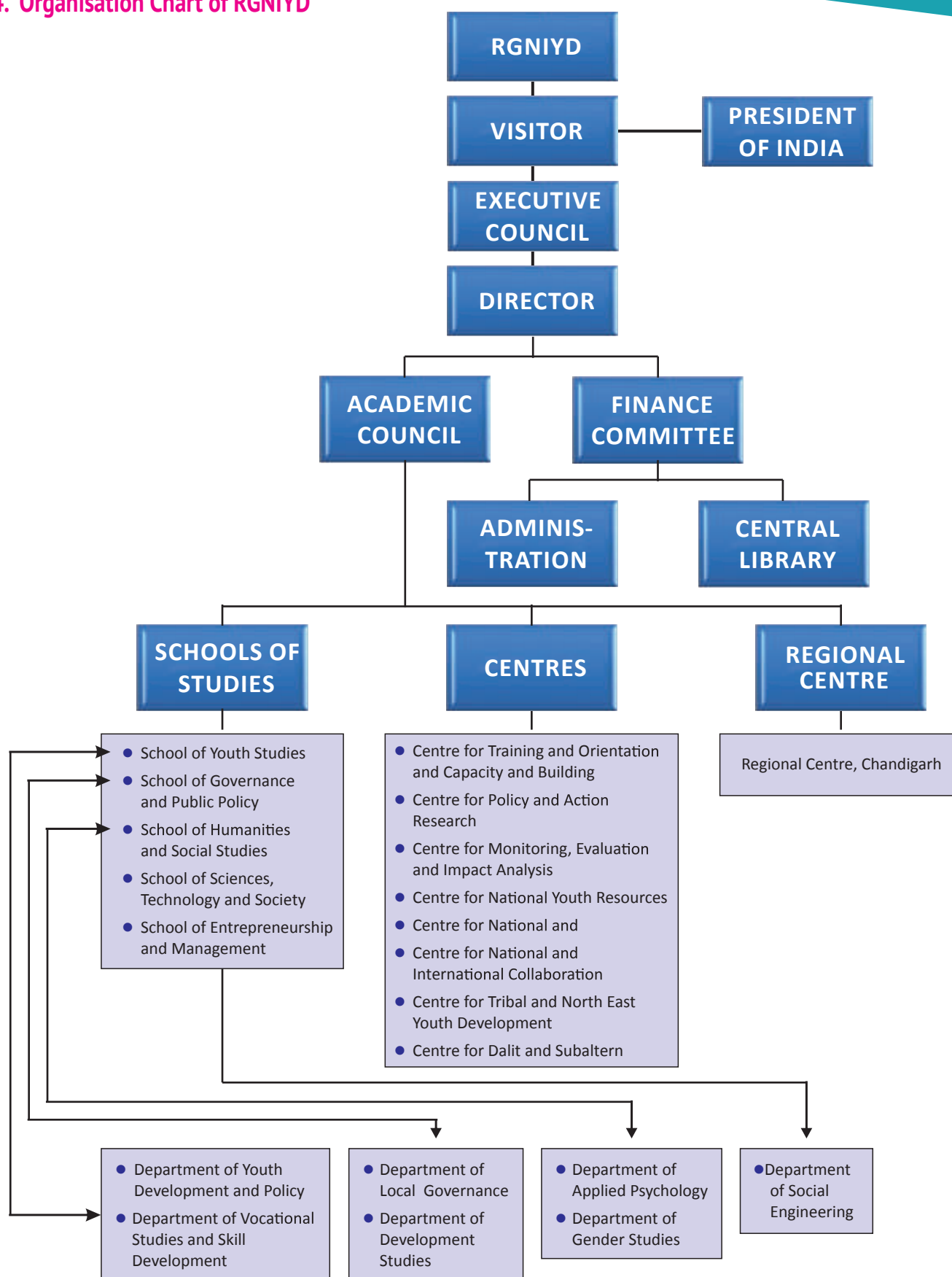
Hon'ble President of India is the Visitor of the Institute.

Various efforts were undertaken to strengthen the academic programmes of the Institute, during the year.

The following section provides a brief write-up of the academic programmes presently offered by the Institute and other academic activities carried out during the period.

#### M.Sc. Counselling Psychology

The PG Programme in Counselling Psychology offered by RGNIYD has strong roots in theory and contemporary practice commensurate to the profession. The programme enables the students to diagnose the problems of the clients scientifically and employ the therapeutic techniques and counselling skills during the counselling process together with ethical considerations. This cutting edge programme allows the students to choose their areas of specialization with inbuilt theory-practice nexus. The students are provided with opportunities for field practicum, internships, case works, institutional visits and supervised skill training in each domain

of specialization in counselling viz., school, adolescent, career, family and work place. The students could secure lucrative employment openings in educational institutions, corporates/industries, hospitals, adolescent and adult rehabilitation centres, NGOs, family and child care centres, legal sectors besides embarking on private practice, and as consultants to various organisations besides careers in teaching and research

#### M.A. Development Policy and Practice

M.A. Development Policy and Practice is being offered in recognition of the need for the quality professionals in the development sector. The course is designed to break new ground, drawing extensively from the wide range of theoretical perspective, issues and practices with alternative possibility. The overarching framework of the programme encompasses the canvass of key approaches, methodologies and methods. The pedagogic methods in the class room learning are entwined with the field immersion that provides immense opportunity for field tested learning. On the completion of the course, the students will be imbibed with substantive knowledge in development perspectives, issues and methodologies. This programme, with its value added thematic workshops and specialized training enhances the employability of the students as professionals in the development sector in diverse settings.

#### M.A. Gender Studies

The Master's Degree Programme in Gender Studies aims to fulfil the professional requirements of gender specialists in the development sector with a multi centric and development approach with diverse specialisations. The course is judiciously balanced with strong theoretical foundations drawn from feministic scholarship, conceptual framework of gender issues



built upon empirical knowledge and skill based courses with hands-on experience. The students of Gender Studies shall embark on an intellectual odyssey, a journey of two years, during which they will be ingrained with theoretical and methodological perspectives in the first semester, exposed to the conceptual issues in the second semester, imbibed with analytical and application orientation in the third semester, and capacity building with requisite skills for developing and implementing women development programmes/ projects in the fourth Semester. The unique feature of the programme lies in the introduction of application and skill based papers such as Gender Budgeting and Auditing, Gender Analysis & Mainstreaming, Gender Planning and Development, and Gender Training. The inbuilt training component in the curriculum and value added thematic workshops conducted will enable the learners to become trainers in gender sensitisation and specialists in Gender Planning and Development.

#### **M.A. Local Governance and Development**

This programme structures multi-dimensional and inter-sectoral knowledge-base for strengthening Local Government Institutions and development organisations. The curriculum enables the youth to analyse the dynamics of decentralized governance and to equip them with the requisite skills towards realising local economic development and social justice. The new trends in the field like E-Governance, Common Property Resource Management, Public Policy, Sustainable Cities, Disaster & Risk Management, Evaluation of Programmes & Projects, Constituency Management, etc. are also incorporated in the programme. It empowers the learner to apply the principles of 'Horizontal Learning' to identify, share and adapt the best practices, to achieve 'good governance at the grassroots'. Thematic workshops, learning journey, internships, field-based studies, social laboratory, experiential learning, etc. add value to the programme and enhance the employability of the learners in diverse work settings.

#### **M.A. Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship**

The purpose of postgraduate degree in Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship is to provide students with a new orientation and way of thinking to organise and lead sustainable development through social entrepreneurship. It is a

distinctive programme, structured to prepare the students professionally for meaningful social engagement by reflecting on the issues of unemployment by setting new patterns and possibilities for employment generation through social innovation and entrepreneurship. The programme provides extensive use of case studies, field immersion oriented learning, enabling students to explore new analytical frameworks and the latest research within a context of social entrepreneurship. Students will build skills through group interaction in case discussions, simulations and team exercises and have opportunities to apply what they learn from class room to real world social business challenges.

In addition, the Institute launched the B.Voc. programmes in Fashion Design & Retail, and Apparel Manufacturing and Entrepreneurship in collaboration with the ATDC, Ministry of Textiles, Govt. of India.

#### **M.A. Social Work (Youth and Community Development)**

The Institute launched the M.A. Social Work Programme with specialization in Youth and Community Development during the year 2016.

Introduction of M.A. in Social Work with Youth Work and Community Development as a specialization would create a platform for delivering youth services in a professional manner by stimulating synthesis of theory and practice. The course aims to professionalize youth work and train youth workers as critical reflective practitioners.

Social work is an interdisciplinary subject which also needs to be expanded in the terrain of youth and community development. India is the youngest country with 64 per cent of its population in the working age group. The median individual in India will be 26 years in 2020 and the youth are going to be turned into a demographic dividend, it is essential to pay due attention to this dynamic workforce. Access to opportunities and providing training will empower the youth to contribute towards nation building. The National Youth Policy, 2018 (NYP-2018) also emphasizes on youth development and productive youth participation. According to a UN High Level Panel report on the Post 2015 development agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals, Youth should be placed at the centre of any new development framework by focussing on youth development. This will enable them to design,

implement and monitor youth empowerment strategies. For assessing the needs of the young people and to work for youth and community development, professional intervention calls for attention.

Social work is a professional and academic discipline which intends to enhance the quality of individuals, groups and communities belonging to weaker sections. Youth work is for all young people to build their capacity individually and collectively, to exercise citizenship and civic engagement and to create a democratic and just society. M.A. Social Work in youth and community development is a two years postgraduate course that aims to provide knowledge of youth work – origins, concepts, models, principles and practices with experiential learning. The course provides a comprehensive understanding of issues concerning youth and a professional approach to dealing with youth related problems.

At the end of the course, students of M.A. Social work in youth and community development will benefit as follows:

- Capacitated to deal with various problems professionally by using scientific methods and approaches.
- Become empowered citizens to exercise citizenship and civic engagement.
- Serve as social facilitators in bringing transformation in the lives of youth and communities through research, policy, direct practice (youth organizing and community development) and teaching.
- Become a professional youth worker in designing, organizing and delivering services for bringing changes in the lives of young people, especially the socially and economically disadvantaged categories.

### **B.Voc. Programmes in Fashion Design & Design and Apparel Manufacturing and Entrepreneurship**

Indian Textile and Apparel Industry has been growing significantly over the last many years and contributing to significantly to India's GDP and serves as the second largest employment providing sector next to agriculture. In the current scenario, the Apparel & Textile Sector plays a key role

in the country's growth and economic development. The categories of jobs available in this sector are based on creativity, technology and management. The workforce required for Apparel Sector requires key competencies/capabilities which facilitate not only innovative responses to market pressures, but also flexible adaptation to unstable and rapidly changing markets. With this backdrop, RGNIYD has introduced the Bachelor's Degree Programmes – B.Voc. in Fashion Design and Retail and Apparel Manufacturing and Entrepreneurship. These programmes are offered through a tripartite agreement among RGNIYD, Apparel Training and Design Centre (ATDC) and Institute of Apparel Management (IAM).

### **The Objectives of the course are:**

- to provide vocational education, hands on training, enhance their employability skills and knowledge for performing various tasks and "employability roles" within the industry and to be highly valued by employers overseas.
- to make the learners as adaptive skilled workforce in accordance with technological advancement for creating future professionals

### **Post Graduate Diploma in Youth Development**

In order to achieve the mandate of RGNIYD and execute the priority areas of National Youth Policy 2014, RGNIYD has launched the Post-Graduate Diploma in Youth Development (PGDYD) as one of its programmes of study from January, 2016 onwards.

The prime objective of this programme of study is to train professionals in the area of youth development across the nation with scientific knowledge and specific models of youth work. This programme will also target the workforce already working in the area of youth development in equipping knowledge and skills to work with youth more scientifically.

The programme is on offer through 'Convergence Mode' in collaboration educational institutions in India across 12 locations. The learners will be facilitated with Self-Instructional Material (SIM), and field activity manual. The learners will be supervised for their field work by the qualified

supervisors and counselling sessions will be conducted by the qualified educators in the area.

### **Doctoral Programmes**

The Institute continued to offer Ph.D. programmes (Full time and Part Time) which were launched during 2011. Presently, 11 full time scholars and 8 part-time scholars have been enrolled for Ph.D. programme in the Institute.

### **Statutory Academic Bodies**

Departmental Boards have been duly constituted as per the Academic Ordinances. Meetings of Departmental Boards were conducted during the year to design, finalise and recommend the Syllabus to Academic Council for its approval. In certain cases, consultation workshop on curriculum development were also organised prior to the meeting of the Departmental Board. Subsequent to the meeting of the Departmental Boards, the 8th Academic Council was held on 27 April 2016 at India International Centre, New Delhi to ratify the revised Syllabus recommended by the respective Boards.

### **Academic Activities**

During the year 2016, a total of 118 students were admitted to various post graduate programmes being offered by the Institute. A total of 119 students were admitted to B. Voc Programmes during the year 2016 through 14 ATDC Centres across the country. A total of 58 candidates were enrolled under the Post Graduate Diploma in Youth Development during the period under report.

### **Faculty Development Programme on “Taxonomy for Teaching, Learning and Assessing”**

**07 – 08 June 2016**

RGNIYD organised a two days Faculty Development Program from 7 – 8 June 2016 for orienting the faculties on Teaching and Learning process. Dr. N. Asokan, conducted the Faculty Development Program on Taxonomy for Teaching, Learning and Assessing with the objectives to write in terms of learners terminal behaviour, to gain a more complete understanding of Teaching, learning and Assessing Process and apply the principles of construction and scoring of structured essay questions and make working environment and life easier. Twelve faculties attended the Program.

### **Refresher Programme for Faculty of RGNIYD**

**23 - 24 June 2016**

A refresher program for the faculty of RGNIYD was organized by the Department of Social Work on 23 and 24 June 2016. The following resource persons were invited to address the participants. Various sessions on Current Trends in Social Sciences, Teaching Methods in Humanities and Social Sciences, Utilization of Learning Resources with reference to Library Usage, Professional Ethics for Teachers, Importance of Communication in Teaching, Functioning of the Academic System and Counselling Skills for Teachers were organized for the faculties of RGNIYD and interactive sessions facilitated learning and sharing of ideas among the faculties.

### Yuva Jyoti- Capacity Building of Tribal Youth in Good Livestock Practice

**06 – 08 April 2016**

In Wayanad tribal youth's role in agriculture does not stop in crop production but encompasses other sub-sectors of agriculture such as livestock and fisheries. They are also rearing small livestock such as sheep, goats and pigs as well as poultry. Under 'Yuva Jyoti' collaborative project of RGNIYD and MSSRF Wayanad, 42 youth were trained in good livestock management. The programme mainly covered the theory and practical demonstration on modern scientific management of pig, poultry, goat and fishery farming besides livestock based integrated farming system for effective utilization of on-farm resource



### Capacity Building Programme on First Aid

**15 – 16 April 2016**

Department of Local Governance organised a capacity building programme on First Aid at RGNIYD during 15-16 April 2016. Prof. R Manickam, Secretary, Indian Red Cross Society, Kancheepuram District was the key resource person. Sessions on Components of First Aid, Basic Life Support and First Aid in Emergency situations were conducted. As part of the practicals, thrust on application of CPR, handling of persons with head injury/ spinal injury, snake bite, etc. was conducted.

### Training on Life Skills

**22 – 24 April 2016**

The RGNIYD conducted a three day "Training on Life Skills" for 16 SC college students. The training was held at RGNIYD, Sriperumbudur from 22 – 24 April 2016. The aim of this training is to prepare the youth for employment potential. The college youth were trained on 10 core life skills, goal setting and time management, career guidance and employability skills. The training was facilitated by a team of Faculty members and co-facilitated by the students of M.A Life Skills Education.

### Exchange-cum-Orientation programme on Enabling Leadership

Department of Local Governance organised an Exchange cum Orientation programme on enabling leadership for youth volunteers from different Districts of Jammu and Kashmir at RGNIYD during 24-27 April 2016. The programme included sessions on various aspects of youth leadership, life skills, analysis of youth status, youth policy, Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojana, Sustainable Development; Community based disaster management, etc. Total of 41 youth participated in the programme.

### Yuva Jyoti- Capacity Building of Tribal Youth in Fruits & Vegetable Processing 25 - 27 April 2016

Fruits and vegetable processing play an important role in Tribal culture. Towards achieving this, RGNIYD and MSSRF, Wayanad had organised three capacity building programme on



Fruit and Vegetable processing. The objective of the Capacity Building was to assist landless tribal youth to improve their quality of life by increasing their income from sustainable small-scale food processing enterprises. This was achieved in the three day programme by transferring information and expertise in food processing enterprise through resources persons from NABARD, KVASU and Farm Federation of Kerala. Fifty two youth attended the programme.

#### **One day Orientation programme to Philosophy students**

**04 May 2016**

The Department of Social Engineering conducted one day orientation programme to Philosophy students, Don Bosco, Youth Services, Chennai on 04 May, 2016. There were 16 students participated in the programme. Sessions on understanding youth, life skills for youth, National Youth Policy, 2014, Role of Youth in Innovation and Social Entrepreneurship were handled by the faculty members of Department of Social Engineering. Mr. Anil D'Souza, II year student, M.A. Youth Empowerment presented his research study findings on Youth employability Skill assessment. The participants had also made campus visit to understand the activities and facilities available at RGNIYD.

#### **YUVA JYOTI- Capacity Building of Tribal Youth in Apiary Beekeeping**

**11 - 13 May 2016**

There are a good number of small holder bee keepers available among the tribes of Wayanad, Kerala but they have not enough knowledge about the functionality of bees. Moreover, they lack income to buy protective clothing and equipment. Training and capacity building sessions allow beekeepers to radically improve their beekeeping practices. In order to value adding, marketing activities, and make them able to raise the family income, RGNIYD and MSSRF jointly organised the capacity building programme for tribal youth at Amabalavayal, Wayanad on modern practices in beekeeping. Forty youth participated in the three day programme. Theoretical as well as practical sessions were held on sustainable beekeeping practices. Practical sessions were held at beekeeping farms at Amabalavayal.

#### **YUVA JYOTI- Capacity Building of Tribal Youth in Value Addition of Pepper, Ginger and Spices**

**18 - 20 May 2016**

Tribal people of Wayanad are mostly working as gatherers of Minor Forest Products(MFPs) such as Honey, Gum Karaya, Mahua flower, Lac, Donna Pattal making, Hill Grass, keeping this in view RGNIYD and MSSRF organised three day capacity building programme on value addition to spices at Amabalavayal campus of MSSRF for 42 tribal youth. The main objective of the programme was to improve tribal youth's income by the way of train them in non-destructive harvesting, primary processing, value addition and marketing of MFPs. Training sessions were handled by experts from District Industrial Centre, Kerala Veterinary University and NGOs working in the field.

#### **Yuva Jyoti- Capacity Building of Tribal Youth in Precision Farming**

**06 - 08 June 2016**

Tribal youth in Wayanad are engaged in various farming activities such as planting, weeding, harvesting and processing, storage and marketing agricultural products and many of the tribes in Kerala are agricultural labourers. They are directly involved in the production of some important crops as yams, maize, ragi, ground nuts etc. However, the tribal farmers require knowledge about appropriate technologies to enhance their livelihood and income through farming. The tribal farms comes under marginal farming which may sometime not covered under irrigation projects, therefore to equip young tribal farmers of Wayanad with proper water management information in the form of precision farming, RGNIYD and MSSRF organized three day capacity building programme on 'precision farming' under the Yuva Jyoti project. Hands on experience in handling and operation of precision farming were provided to the young farmers by experts in the field, programme held at MSSRF Wayanad. Forty two tribal youth attended the 3-Day capacity building programme.

### **Yuva Jyothi- Capacity Building Tribal youth in Mushroom Cultivation**

**20 – 22 June 2016**

With a pro-livelihood approach, Yuva Jyothi project of RGNIYD and MSSRF, focusing upon Tribal youth to improve their livelihood options, organised a three day capacity building programme for tribal youth in mushroom cultivation at MSSRF Wayanad. Thirty two tribal youth participated in the programme.

### **Yuva Jyothi-Capacity Building of Tribal Youth in Cattle Farming**

**07, 08 and 11 July 2016**

To assist tribes in their socio-economic development, there is an imperative need to provide more employment avenues and income generation opportunities. With this aim the Yuva Jyoti Project of RGNIYD-MSSRF conducted three day capacity building programme to upgrade the skills of tribal youth in Cattle Farming at Cheeyambam 73 Colony (tribal colony), Wayanad. The programme exposed tribal youth to in various traditional/modern methods of animal husbandry. Technical sessions covered cattle farming issues like housing, breeding, Feeding and Management and Health Care. Sixty seven tribal participants attend the three day programme.

### **Yuva Jyothi-Capacity Building of Tribal Youth in Food Processing**

**18 – 20 July 2016**

It is obvious that food and food processing play an important role in Tribal culture. The food processing sector is obviously very vibrant - especially at the small-scale. Therefore a training intervention in this sector will enhance livelihood opportunities of the tribal youth in Wayanad. Towards achieving this RGNIYD and MSSRF, Wayanad had organised three day capacity building programme on Fruit, Vegetable and Milk Processing at Community Hall, Panamaram. The objective of the Capacity Building was to assist landless tribal youth to improve their quality of life by increasing their income from sustainable small-scale food processing enterprises. This was achieved in the three day programme by transferring information and expertise in food processing enterprise through resources persons from NABARD, KVASU and Farm Federation of Kerala. Fifty six youth attended the programme

### **Training of Tribal Youth as Social Animators**

**28 July-01 August 2016**

Training of Tribal Youth as Social Animators was organised at Munnar, Kerala from 28 July - 01 August 2016 in collaboration with Zonal Office, Trivandrum in which 40 tribal youth participated. Some of the important topics covered during 5 days residential training programme were Life skills and self-awareness, problem solving, decision making, communication, interpersonal relationships and coping with emotions and stress, macro analysis of tribal situation, their distribution, state situation analysis, challenges, problem tree analysis, understanding tribes, history and identification of tribes and tribe Vs. Caste etc.

### **Workshop on Youth as conflict resolving personnel through Peace Education**

**29 - 30 July 2016**

Workshop on Youth as conflict resolving personnel through Peace Education was organised by RGNIYD at Queen Mary's college from 29-30 July 2016 with the objective to provide good opportunities to the students to explore the ways to promote a culture of peace in the country in which 40 UG girl students participated.

### **Yuva Jyothi- Capacity Building of Tribal Youth in Beekeeping**

**03 - 06 August 2016**

There are different entry points for capacity building in Beekeeping –Apiary to strengthen the livelihood of tribes who are traditionally honey hunters. Current scenario is that, new generation of honey hunters are facing problem non-availability of indigenous honey nests in the forest. Keeping this issue in mind we have trained 59 youth in Beekeeping- Apiary, under Yuva –Jyoti Project of RGNIYD and MSSRF. The three day programme held at MSSRF, Agro-Bio Diversity Centre Wayanad. The technical sessions on improved harvests of honey and beeswax were engaged with additional input on processing honey skilfully and obtaining higher prices for the same.

### **Yuva Jyothi- Review Meeting of Project Monitoring Committee**

**11 -12 August 2016**

Review meeting of Yuva- Jyothi Project Monitoring Committee was held from 11-12 August, 2016 at Community Agrobiodiversity Centre of MSSRF at Wayanad. Yuva Jyohti is a join project by RGNIYD and MSSRF to retain tribal youth in agriculture. The project had devised 24 programmes in Wayanad- district with high tribal density and trained tribal youth in modern agricultural techniques with the aim of enhancing their livelihood opportunities. Nine hundred and sixty youth were trained under this one year long project. All Project Monitoring committee members (Project Officer-ITDP, Zilla Panchayat President, Deputy Director Department of Agriculture, and Principal Scientist MSSRF) were present on 11 August to review the project. On behalf of Director RGNIYD, Dr. Hiranniya Kalesh, Faulty RGNIYD participated in the review meeting and conducted field verification on 12 August 2016 and interacted with training completed participants.

### **Training Programme of Tribal Youth as Social Animators**

**12-16 August 2016**

A five day long training programme of tribal youth as social animators was organised from 12 to 16 August 2016 at Youth volunteers Union, Thoubal Wangmataba. 40 tribal youth from Ukhrul, Senapathi, Chandel, Imphal West and Thoubal districts participated in the five days training programme.

### **Training on Livelihood to Young People**

**16-20 August 2016**

The training on livelihood was conducted jointly by RGNIYD and Restless Development for 30 SC and ST youth of Thiruvallur, Chennai, Kanchipuram and Vellore districts at the SPW India training centre at Poonamalle. Village exposure was provided at Ozhalur in Chengalpattu.

The training was conducted through PRA analysed to identify the gaps and possibilities for livelihoods interventions in the respective area. The analysis formed the basis for interventions or Livelihoods Enhancement Action Plan (LEAP). Tools such as Social Mapping, Resource Mapping, Livelihoods Mapping, Income and Expenditure Analysis, Traded-in and Traded-out Analysis, Value Chain Analysis, Market (Local

Opportunities) Analysis, Seasonality Analysis, Migration Analysis, Credit Analysis, Health Analysis, Education Analysis, Vulnerability Analysis, Institutional Analysis and Farming system Analysis were employed during the programme.

The training enabled the participants to understand the employment trend, livelihood opportunity and self-employment opportunities available in their own communities. At the end of the training the young people were able to make their individual livelihood plans to start business and have access to employment.

### **Yuva Jyothi - Capacity Building of Tribal Youth in Value addition & Marketing of Spices**

**23 - 26 August 2016**

It has been noted that without value addition triable Minor Forest Product (MFP) gatherers' are facing problem to get remunerative prices for their products. Accordingly RGNIYD-MSSRF Wayanad has designed training programmes under the Yuva Jyoti project to empower the tribal youth in proper harvesting and preserving of the spices collected from forest. The three -day training programme provided inputs on value addition to Hill Grass, Tamarind, Dona Pattal, Amla, Honey & some Agro based items like spices, herbs, cashew, etc. 48 Youth participated in the programme. Practical session was handled by Spice and Medicine Factory of Mullankolly, Wayanad.

### **Psychosocial Counselling for Adolescents in Govt. Children and Observation Home**

The RGNIYD in collaboration with Department of Social Defence (DSD) Tamil Nadu is implementing a project called Life Skills Education for Adolescent Development (LEAD) aiming at providing life skills training and psychosocial counselling to the adolescents who are residing in Govt. Children's / Observation Homes across Tamil Nadu. In this connection, a total of five visits made to different Govt. observation homes in Chennai and Chengalpattu.

Thirty six women from 12 districts of Tamil Nadu attended the training programme for Sanitary Napkin Production between 27 September - 01 October 2016. The scheme was promoted by the National Health Mission as early as in the year 2010 to promote hygiene among the young adult women of the rural India. UNICEF volunteered to train the SHG women in the trade. Hence the Gender Studies Department found it essential to give the training to the young women agricultural labourers to empower them with an alternative livelihood.

### **Training on LISTEN (Life Skills Training and Education)**

on Entrepreneurship and Career Guidance and Counselling from 03 – 06 March, 2017. 40 participants attended the programme.

### **Training on Role of Local Self-Governance in Youth Development**

**04 – 07 March 2017**

The Department of Social Work, RGNIYD in collaboration with the Kumbhalkar College of Social Work, Maharashtra organised 3-day training programme on Role of Local Self-Governance in Youth Development from 4 – 7 March, 2017. Forty participants attended the programme.

### **Training on Relationship Enrichment for College Students**

**06-07 March 2017**

The RGNIYD in collaboration with the M.S. Chellamuthu Institute of Mental Health and Rehabilitation conducted training on Relationship Enrichment for College Students at their Bodhi Campus, Madurai from 06-07 March 2017. The programme was attended by 38 girl students from various institutions in Madurai.

The objectives of the programme were to enable the participants understand the various factors that lead to building healthy relationships, create awareness on the factors underlying relationships among the youth, strengthen personality factors among the youth that enhance relationship, build positive resources to strengthen relationships in their lives, to help them establish compatibility in relationship and to assist them in identifying abuse in a relationship and seek help.

The training encompasses series of skill-building sessions to provide requisite impetus on nurturing essential relationships in life viz., concept or relationships, importance of relationships, expectations in relationships, relationship mapping, relationship challenges, relationship building habits, emotional intelligence. The training enable the participant to learn the behaviours and skills needed to develop and sustain fulfilling relationships. Further, it enabled the participants to learn to decrease behaviors that are associated with distress and unpleasant experiences and break-up of the relationship besides developing a sense of security, trust, and satisfaction in a relationship. The programme helped them to develop skills to strengthen and maintain a healthy relationship.

### **Training on Life Skills for College Students**

**08 – 10 March 2017**

The RGNIYD in collaboration with the Jyoti Nivas College (Autonomous), Bangalore organised a training on Life Skills Education for the College Students from 08–10 March 2017 at Jyoti Nivas College, Bangalore. A total of 60 students attended the training. The third batch training was organised from 15-24 March 2017. The practical training has been conducted in around Guwahati Rock fields, Water Sports points & hills located near Guwahati. This Incubation training includes mountaineering, basic rock climbing, jungle safari, jungle camping & water sports etc.

### **Training Programme on 'Life Skills and Civic Citizenship'**

**21 – 24 March 2017**

The Department of Local Governance and Public Policy, RGNIYD in collaboration with the Gandhigram Rural University, Dindigul organised a training on life skills and civic citizenship from 21 – 24 March 2017.

### **Training on Entrepreneurship for Rural Dropout Young Girls**

**25 – 29 March 2017**

RGNIYD organised training on Entrepreneurship for rural dropout young girls in collaboration with the Arul Anandar College, Madurai from 25-29 March 2017. A total of 40 rural dropout young girls attended the training. The participants were provided orientation on basics of entrepreneurship, characteristics of an entrepreneur, achievement motivation, innovation and creativity, risk taking, goal setting, business orientation, communication skills, product selection, opportunities in the world of self-employment, fundamentals of enterprise launching and management, starting a micro/small enterprise, statutory requirements, marketing, undertaking market surveys, content/elements of a project report, preparation of a bankable project report, support systems of Government and Non-Governmental agencies.

### **Training on Youth Employability Skills**

**27 – 31 March 2017**

The Department of Development Studies organized a training on Youth Employability Skills for college students at Department of Social Work, Madras Christian College, Tambaram, Kanchipuram District, Tamil Nadu from 27 – 31 March 2017. Fifty three students from various colleges in the districts of Kanchipuram, Chennai, Namakkal and Coimbatore attended the training.

### **Life Skills Training Programme for College Students**

**March 2017**

RGNIYD organised a series of training programmes on life skills for the college students during March 2017. RGNIYD in collaboration with the Department of Psychology, S. V. University, Tirupati organised the training on life skills for

college students from 08-10 March 2017 in which 143 students from various colleges participated. From 06-08 March 2017 RGNIYD in collaboration with the Union Christian College, Aluva, Kerala conducted training on life skills in which 101 students participated.

### **Training on Life Skills and Psychosocial Counselling for Adolescents**

#### **March 2017**

The RGNIYD in collaboration with Department of Social Defence (DSD) Tamil Nadu and UNICEF is implementing a project called Life Skills Education for Adolescent Development (LEAD) aiming at providing life skills training and psychosocial counselling to the adolescents who are residing in Govt. Children's / Observation Homes across Tamil Nadu.

In this connection, two visits were made in the month of March, 2017 to Govt. Children Homes in Erode and Dharmapuri districts.

Training on various components of life skills viz., Self-Concept, SWOT analysis, Decision Making, Problem Solving, Empathy, Communication, Goal Setting, Effective Relationship and Orientation towards Life were emphasized through games, activities, role play inspirational/motivational stories and anecdotes. Apart from that group counselling were provided on Managing Anger and Stress were also conducted during the visits. Through this intervention, 25 female inmates of Erode Children Home and 27 male inmates in Dharmapuri Children Home benefitted.

### **Employability Enhancement Programme for Student Youth**

#### **2016 – 2017**

The RGNIYD in collaboration with the ICT Academy of Tamil Nadu as part of the Employability Enhancement Programme to train about 1000 SC/ST/NE student youth across different states, organized 25 batches of training programmes in BFSI and Web Designing sectors in the states of Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Puducherry and Tamil Nadu covering a total of 1014 youth. Under this project a total of 616 scheduled caste youth and 398 scheduled tribe youth were trained.

### **Orientation on Entrepreneurship Development - Phase II for Student Youth**

#### **2016-2017**

In continuation of the ToT Programmes conducted jointly by RGNIYD and the ICT Academy of Tamil Nadu for the NSS Programme Officers on Youth Entrepreneurship Development, the trained NSS Programme Officers 12 states, short duration orientation programmes on entrepreneurship development for the student youth were conducted by the trained NSS Programme Officers in their respective institutions. A total of 9655 students were trained in Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Odisha, uducherry, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Telangana.

### **Entrepreneurship Development Programmes for Youth – Conduct of Training through ni-msme, Hyderabad**

#### **2016-2017**

Entrepreneurship plays a very important role in the economic development. Entrepreneurs act as catalytic agents in the process of industrialization and economic growth. The rate of economic progress of a nation depends upon its rate of innovation which in turn depends upon the distribution of entrepreneurial talent in the population. Technological progress alone cannot lead to economic development unless technological breakthroughs are put to economic use by entrepreneurs. It is the entrepreneur who organizes and puts to use capital, labour and technology in the best possible manner for the setting up of one's enterprise.

The entrepreneurship development programme (EDP) enable entrepreneurs initiating and sustaining the process of economic development. The other benefits of the entrepreneurship development include creation of employment opportunities, capital formation, balanced regional development, maximising the use of local resources, improving the per capita income, improving the standard of living and promoting economic independence among the youth.

During the financial year 2016-17, a total of 600 youth were trained in Guwahati (Assam), Kakinada (Andhra Pradesh), Mysore (Karnataka), Nagpur (Maharashtra), Mahabubabad (Telangana), Agartala (Tripura) through ni-msme in the trades

such as Computer Accounting with Tally, Hardware and Networking, Beautician, Tailoring, Plumbing, Front Office Management, Computing with MS Office and Internet.

The Objective of project is to provide Training in Entrepreneurship Development in the MSME segment to the youth of the country so that, on completion of such training they may either be absorbed in the formal sector as employees or may start their own enterprise which may help them earn income on a sustainable basis.

### **Diploma Course in Job Skills, Ongoing Programme 2016-2017**

The Department of Gender Studies initiated an innovative programme, 'Diploma in Job Skills' for young women in the age group of 19 – 35 years. with a total of 450 class hours, a) Yoga and Meditation, b) Spoken Hindi, c) Spoken English , d) Computational Skills ,e) Tally, and f) Book Keeping.

## **Workshops**

### **Five-day Workshop on Urban Planning–Bypass Infrastructures of the Peri-urban Fringe**

**26 June - 02 July 2016**

Workshop on Youth as conflict resolving personnel through Peace Education was organised by RGNIYD at Stella Maris College from 06-07 August 2016 with the objective to provide good opportunities to the students to explore the ways to promote a culture of peace in the country. In this programme 40 UG girl students participated. During the programme the participants were motivated to discuss on "What an individual youth need to equip oneself as Conflict Resolving Personnel based on the conduct of lessons on peace education and What are the different approaches one must have to include everyone in the conflict resolving efforts and how to make it holistic by drawing everyone's participation and obviously on "how to stimulate the self-thinking process that would ultimately make one a self-made leader for peace basically depending upon one's inner resources.



### **Workshop on Relationship Enrichment**

**03 September 2016**

The workshop on relationship enrichment was conducted by Dr. Sangeetha Makeash, consultant Psychologist on 03 September 2016. She covered the topics on conflict, trust, assertiveness, fight styles, emotional balance, values, acceptance, negotiation and communication in a relationship.

**23-24 September 2016**

The Street Theatre Workshop was conducted on 23 and 24



September 2016 for the first MA Social Work Students. Dr. Kaleesswaran, trainer in media arts and Street Theatre conducted the training.

### **Make Peace with Yourself - An Interactive Workshop on Anger Management**

**26 September 2016**

As an activity of the Counselling and Assessment Centre, an interactive session on Anger management- "Make Peace with Yourself" was conducted for the Students of RGNIYD on the 26 of September, 2016.

### **IGCS Stakeholder Workshop**

**03 October 2016**

The Stakeholder workshop was conducted by IGCS, IIT Madras and hosted by RGNIYD on 03 October, 2016 with the aim to understand the opportunities for a resilient future in the rapidly changing Sriperumbudur Taluk, which faces the challenges of rapid growth and climate change. The findings of the workshop enabled the IGCS to initiate an ongoing Global Technology Watch on Sustainable Habitat targeted towards identifying (best) practices that enhance and generate higher levels of resilience in peri-urban areas, as well as natural changes, socio-economic processes and cultural practices that pose obstacles to resilience. The workshop had thematic discussions on the status of the Sriperumbudur Taluk region by IGCS members. Several examples from around the world were shared through images and videos to showcase best practices and to provide access points to alternative scenarios. Twelve participants from Tamil Nadu and Puducherry participated and had a meaningful interaction with the Successful Entrepreneurs related to different sectors.

### **Workshop on Theatre for Transformation**

### **Academic Writing Workshop for SC/ST Ph.D. scholars**

Non-communicable diseases (NCDs), mainly cardiovascular diseases, cancers, diabetes, obesity and chronic respiratory

diseases, represent a leading threat to human health and human development in today's world. These diseases are driven by forces that include ageing, rapid unplanned urbanization, and the globalization of unhealthy lifestyles. For example, globalization of unhealthy lifestyles like unhealthy diets may show up in individuals as raised blood pressure, increased blood glucose, elevated blood lipids, and obesity. These are called 'intermediate risk factors' which can lead to cardiovascular disease, a NCD. With this in mind, three days Awareness Programme and Workshop on Preventive Care and Control of Non-Communicable Diseases for Marginalised Social Groups was held in Fatima College, Madurai on 05 – 07, January 2017. The workshop counted with the participation of 40 students from various colleges in and around Madurai city from marginalised social groups. On 05 January 2017 inauguration session was held on San Jose Seminar Hall, Fatima College, Madurai

### **Workshop on Career Counselling**

This programme covered various sessions like understanding the challenges of youth in employment sector, various opportunities available in the market to start up their own ventures, understanding self, challenges faced by early entrepreneurs, various Govt. schemes available.

### **Workshop on Youth Ambassadors for Change**

**09 - 13 August 2016**

A 5-day workshop on Youth Ambassadors for Change was organized for over 60 NSS volunteers of Guwahati University, Assam. The participants were from different states of North east. This five-day workshop offered a unique opportunity to a group of 50 young NSS volunteers to learn about their role in nation building, to develop their leadership skills to make positive changes in their communities. This programme empowered youth to become effective leaders in their communities and they gained a clear understanding that the power to impact positive changes in their communities lies within each of them.

A total of 391 students actively participated in the programme. The programme consisted various aspects of Self analysis and Career planning such as Knowing self, SMART techniques on Career Planning, SWOT analysis, Goal setting, Career options, Vocational courses, etc. The programme was found to be very useful to the students and it was observed that most of the students did not have much career consciousness. As an outcome of the programme, it was also felt that career guidance and Counselling training programmes should also be extended to teachers and parents as well.

### **Awareness on Beti Bachao Beti Padhao**

**26 November 2016**

An Awareness programme on Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (Save the Girl Child, Educate the Girl Child) was held on 26 November 2016 in association with NSS, Tezpur University, Assam. The program was organized to sensitize and create awareness on the importance of the girl child and the need to provide them education and a number of events were organized for the students.

### **Gender Sensitization and Legal Awareness Programme**

**29 November 2016**

A Gender Sensitization and Legal Awareness Programme was organized in association with Women's Cell and NSS, Tezpur University on 29 November 2016 at Tezpur University. The programme was held to sensitize the young people on various gender issues emphasizing the need to promote gender equality aggressively. An Orientation programme was organised for the first year students in exploring the various facets of RGNIYD, and especially to understand both the academic and non-academic



pursuits of campus life. The students were from diverse backgrounds and spanned across 14 Indian states vis-à-vis Ladakh to Andaman and Delhi to Nagaland. The sessions designed on both the days gave a broad framework to the students to overcome challenges and also offering suggestions and strategies for appropriate self-reflection. The Orientation programme ended with a guided campus visit to the various resource centres, such as, library, radio station and computer lab.

In recognition of their participation, the students of first and second batches, RGNIYD awarded their certificates to 45 candidates in an Award ceremony organized at RGNIYD on 12 July, 2016. Ninety five students participated in the programme.

### **Participation in National Seminar on 'Status and Progress of Development – De-Notified Nomadic, Tribal Women and Children in Tamil Nadu'**

**25 July 2016**

The faculty and students of the Department of Gender Studies, RGNIYD participated in a National Seminar on 'Status and Progress of Development – De-Notified Nomadic, Tribal Women and Children in Tamil Nadu' which was held on 25 July 2016 at Mother Teresa Women's University, Kodaikanal, Tamil Nadu.

### **Swachh Bharat Abhiyan**

**01 -31 August 2016**

Swachh Bharat Abhiyan is a national campaign by the Government of India which was officially launched on 02 October 2014 by Hon. Prime Minister Narendra Modi. RGNIYD conducted cleanliness drive, sanitation awareness, sensitization programme among the students. The detail program carried out during the month of August were as follows:

#### **i) Inauguration and Campus Cleanliness Drive**

The RGNIYD inaugurated the "Swachh Bharat Pakhwada" on 01 August 2016 by taking mass pledge on Swachhata by all the staff and students. 100 students and staffs of RGNIYD carried out campus cleaning activities.

#### **ii) Rally on Clean India**

As part of "Swachh Bharat Pakhwada" (Clean India Mission), RGNIYD organized a "Mass Rally" involving around 150 students and staff of RGNIYD on 03 August 2016 at 3.30 pm. The Rally commenced at RGNIYD campus and marched up to Sriperumbudur Bus Terminus. This awareness and sensitization rally was conducted with the objectives of total sanitation, cleanliness drive in the city.

#### **iii) Competitions**

Competitions on essay, poster making and slogan writing on the theme "Environment friendly products", "Impact of globalization and emerging issues of environment" and "Youth and E-waste management" were conducted for the students of RGNIYD. They were also informed that those who keep their hostel rooms and toilets neat and tidy will be given attractive prizes. As part of competitions, the sanitation and maintenance of hostel rooms and toilets were also oriented to students to keep the campus clean and green.

#### **iv) Free Medical Camp**

A free medical camp was organized in the campus in collaboration with Saveetha Medical College and Hospital on 09 August 2016 at AYUSH Clinic buildings, RGNIYD. Around 190 people from nearby villages viz., Panchalapattu, Sivanthangal, Beemanthangal, N.G.O colony, Chellaperumal Nagar and students and staff of RGNIYD were immensely benefitted in this camp. The majority of the beneficiaries were women from self-help group formed by Equitas Micro Finance. In this medical camp, treatment for general health illness, diabetic screening, eye check-up and dental screening were done on free of cost.

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v) **Cleaning of Public Places**

On 06 August 2016, around 100 NSS volunteers were involved in cleanliness drive outside the campus. The cleaning took place in one kilometre stretch in National highways up to toll plaza. The cleanliness campaign reached out to street vendors and shop owners in sensitizing them on maintenance of dustbins, proper disposal of dumping of garbage. They collected around half a ton of garbage and destroyed them by firing and properly disposing. -

vi) **Tree Plantation on Independence Day**

On 15 August 2016, after flag hoisting, tree plantation was carried out by the Director, Registrar, Staff and students at RGNIYD campus. The students who participated in various competitions were given attractive prizes.

The other activities which were coincided with Swachh Bharat Pakhwada are as follows

- i. The beautification of entrance, parking circle, lawn, cutting of grass, weeding of bushes were carried out during this fortnight.
- ii. The guest house has been renovated with white wash, painting, replacement of electrical and plumbing materials and renovation of toilets.

- Through this programme the people were provided on intervention of medical treatment in which around 110 local residents benefitted

Prior to the medical camp, on 19 August, 2016, Community cleaning program was held at Middle School, in which 18 RGNIYD students and 10 Community youth and 50 NSS volunteers participated. D.G. Vaishnav College, Chennai participated in the cleaning work.

Orientation were given on the topics, Coping with Stress and Emotion for Internal Peace, Self-awareness, Self-Confidence and Creative thinking and how to form youth clubs.

Children's Homes across Tamil Nadu. In this connection, three life skills trainings were conducted in the month of February, 2017 in Tamil Nadu. In this programme 66 adolescent's girls were trained on life skills. During the training programme, the adolescents were inculcated on self-awareness, effective communication, empathy, interpersonal relationship, critical thinking and creative thinking, problem solving and decision making skills, coping with stress and emotion through various methods like brainstorming, group discussion, buzz group discussion, experiential sharing, drama, mind games, activities, and poster presentation. The program on Psychosocial Counselling for Adolescents in Govt. Children and Observation Home was organised on 09 February 2017 in Kancheepuram district. The program was participated by 66 girls.

### **STEPS – Students' Theatre**

**18 February 2017**

The STEPS, RGNIYD organised Theatre program by conducting intercollegiate theatre competition. Students from Chennai city colleges participated in the competitions and cultural performances were given by Alternative Media Centre and Children and youth from Kachepedu Village Community. The objective of the programme was to sensitize the students about significance of theatre and using theatre as medium for social change and community capacity building. In total 75 participants attended the program Mr. Hariharan a renowned Film Maker, Chennai, spoke about the modern theatre and its role and significance. He appreciated the activities of STEPS and having taken effort to celebrate Theatre Day. The office bearers, members and faculty in charge of STEPS organized the event.

### **Training on Life Skills and Psychosocial Counselling for Adolescents in Govt. Children and Observation Home**

**March 2017**

The RGNIYD in collaboration with Department of Social Defence (DSD) Tamil Nadu and UNICEF is implementing a project called Life Skills Education for Adolescent Development (LEAD) aiming at providing life skills training and psychosocial counselling to the adolescents who are residing in Govt. Children's / Observation Homes across Tamil Nadu.

In this connection, two visits were made in the month of March, 2017 to Govt. Children Homes in Erode and Dharmapuri districts.

Training on various components of life skills viz., Self-Concept, SWOT analysis, Decision Making, Problem Solving, Empathy, Communication, Goal Setting, Effective Relationship and Orientation towards Life were emphasized through games, activities, role play inspirational/motivational stories and anecdotes. Apart from that group counselling were provided on Managing Anger and Stress were also conducted during the visits. Through this intervention, 25 female inmates of Erode Children Home and 27 male inmates in Dharmapuri Children Home benefitted.

### **Activities of the Counselling and Assessment Centre**

The Counselling and Assessment Centre at RGNIYD catered to the counselling needs of the students of RGNIYD and the clients at NIEPMD. Further, professional services are extended to the Directorate of Social Defence, Government of Tamil Nadu by the Centre.--

## ACTIVITIES OF THE RGNIYD REGIONAL CENTRE, CHANDIGARH

### Training of Trainers Programmes

#### Training of Trainers on Youth Ambassadors for Drugs free Punjab

15 -17 April 2016

A 3-Day residential training of trainers on Youth Ambassadors for Drugs Free Punjab was organized by RGNIYD, RC, Chandigarh in Patiala, Punjab. Since the extent of drug addiction in Punjab is alarming, the dream of drug free Punjab can only be made come true if the youth actively participate in fighting against this evil. The goal of this training programme was to make the youth of Punjab aware of the ill effects of drugs and implement the strategies learnt from this training for a Punjab free from Drugs. The objective behind this 3-day training programme was to increase the knowledge base and skill level of drug addiction counsellors, to enhance the effectiveness of their work with drug users.

#### Training of Trainers on Youth Empowerment through Adventure Sports

18 -27 June 2016

Adventure sports are a popular term for certain activities perceived as having a high level of inherent danger. These activities often involve speed, height, a high level of physical exertion, and highly specialized gear. The emotional and physical benefits of adventure sports are impressive such as improved problem solving, increased health and a positive thinking. In order to develop these qualities in participants RGNIYD RC organized this training with Atal Bihari Vajpayee Institute of Mountaineering and Allied Sports, Manali, Himachal

Pradesh for 50 participants. The main objective behind this training is to empower youth and to inculcate the qualities like working together to achieve the common objective and how to deal in the crisis situation. The training was concluded on 27 June, 2016.

#### Training of Trainers of DYCs of NYKS

23 -25 June 2016

Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Regional Centre, Chandigarh in collaboration with Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan, Punjab and Chandigarh zone organized a 3-day Training of Trainers for 20 NYKS District Youth Coordinators from states of Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and Punjab. The training is organized in order to train the DYCs on various topics so that they can replicate the learning when they go back to their respective States and further train National Youth Corps Volunteers. The training program was inaugurated by Sh. Vivek Pratap Singh, IAS, Secretary, Youth services and Sports, Govt. of Punjab. Various topics covered in the 3 days long training are challenges in understanding youth psychology, handling social media, life skills, flagship programmes of GOI and State and community mobilization.

#### Training of Trainers on Effective Facilitation Skills

27 June - 03 July 2016

Every day supervisors, managers, team leaders and others are asked to facilitate a wide range of activities from meetings to problem-solving sessions to team building or conflict resolution. Facilitation is more complex than simply presenting or managing a meeting or session. Keeping in view the importance of effective facilitation skills, RGNIYD Regional Centre organized a Training of Trainers on Effective Facilitation Skills. Fifty professionals from various education backgrounds consisting of the NSS program officers joined the training from states like Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, Delhi, Punjab, Haryana and Chandigarh.

### **Training of Trainers on Youth & Peace Building**

**14 – 18 July 2016**

Keeping in view the role of youth in 21st century for building peace all over the world, RGNIYD RC organized a workshop on Youth and Peace building. The training programme witnessed the active participation of 50 youth and dynamic peace builders from various states of India including Himachal, Haryana, Punjab, Jammu & Kashmir, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Delhi and Chandigarh. Mr. Ajatshatru, Ms. Abha Jeurkar from Play for Peace and Mr. Gurinder Singh Azad from Centre for social equity was the lead facilitators for the training. The trainers used experiential method of training to simplify the issue of peace & conflict for these budding peace builders. The trainers emphasized upon core human values of peaceful co-existence, conflict resolution by being empathetic, understanding social justice & its parameters. By the end of the training, the participants were able to explore peace within & peace outside and they were able to come out with a concrete action plan in order to build peace one step at a time.

### **Training of Trainers on Employability Skills through Life Skills Approach**

**25-29 July 2016**

A Five day residential training programme on Employability Skills through Life Skill Approaches kick-started on 25 July, 2016 at RGNIYD, Regional Centre, Chandigarh witnessing a participation of 37 young people from various states like Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh and Chandigarh. These young people were trained on the set of skills required to train others to develop employability skills through life skill approaches in the current corporate world. Eminent speakers person took sessions to develop the competencies of the participants in dealing with challenges that they might face in the field. This was a residential 5 day ToT concluded on 29 July, 2016.

### **Training of Trainers on Life Skills**

**25-31 July 2016**

Seven day training on Life Skills is organized by Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Regional

Centre Chandigarh in collaboration with State NSS Cell of Uttar Pradesh. 50 NSS Programme Officers from different colleges and universities of Uttar Pradesh participated in this programme. This training was specially designed for the Programme Officers to enhance their skills. Sh. Govind Raju, Special Secretary, Higher Education of Uttar Pradesh, inaugurated the function. Other eminent guests present in the inauguration were Dr Anshumali Sharma, State NSS Officer of Uttar Pradesh, Mr. Rakesh, NSS Coordinator of Lucknow University and Mr. Avinav Thakur from RGNIYD Regional Centre, Chandigarh. The objective of this ToT was to create a cadre of master trainers who would further train young people in higher educational institutions, so that young people can adapt and excel in different situations. This training helped the participants to realize the value of life skills and improve their facilitation skills.

### **Professional Development Programme for NYKS officials**

**01 - 12 August 2016**

Staff is a critical ingredient for quality youth-serving organizations. Programmes often attribute their success to effective youth workers, and research shows that professional development can enhance the skills of both new and longtime employees. Keeping this in mind RGNIYD organized a 12 days comprehensive, responsive, customized and multi-disciplinary Professional Development Programme for the 45 Zonal Directors, District Youth Coordinators and Deputy Directors of Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan from 22 states across India who directly work with youth at the state and district level on a wide range of educational, recreational, capacity building programmes. The goal of this training was to produce high performing youth work professionals with motivation, commitment, knowledge, and skills as change agents, facilitator, mentor and catalyst to transform youth development to youth-led development. Officers from 22 states of Rajasthan, Punjab, Haryana, Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, Manipur, Karnataka, Bihar, Sikkim, Jammu and Kashmir, Andaman and Nicobar, Tamil Nadu, Orissa, Himachal Pradesh, Kerala, Lakshadweep, Nagaland, Telangana, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh and Assam actively participated in this training programme. The feedback of the participants reflects that the training was a great success.



## **Training of Trainers on Project Cycle Management**

40 head of the organisations and project leaders from various NGOs and Civil Society Organizations working for youth development from Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, New Delhi and Maharashtra participated in a 5 day Training of Trainers on Project Cycle Management. The goal of this training was to equip and empower the participants with enhanced designing and management tools to tailor projects more adequately to meet the needs of young people. It will help the organisations in the effective delivery of the projects to meet the expectations of young people and address their needs effectively "The whole training was very good and it is very useful to me. The most important aspect of training was the session on project proposal writing and its components. The second aspect was scaling up management session and tool.

## **Training of Trainers on Strengthening Youth Organisations**

**03 September 2016**

The RC Chandigarh organized one day Training of Trainers on Strengthening Youth Organisations on 03 September 2016 for Presidents, General Secretaries and other members of Students' organizations from Chandigarh. The goal of this training was to inculcate the leadership qualities among the participants.

## **Orientation Training for NSS Program Officers**

**17-23 December 2016**

A Seven day Orientation Training for NSS Programme Officers was organized from 17-23 December, 2016 at RGNIYD, Regional Centre, Chandigarh with active participation of 35 NSS Programme Officers from Haryana and Chandigarh. **Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Rajive Gandhi National Institute of youth Development, Sriperumbudur for the year ended 31 March 2017.**

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the Rajive Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Semipermeable as on 31 March 2017, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller & Audit General's ( Duties, powers & Conditions of Service) Act 1971 read with Section 28 (2) of the Rajive Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development Act 2012. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institutes's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our Audit.

The separate Audit Report Contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency cum performance aspects. Etc if any are reported through Inspection Report CAG's Audit Report separately.

We have conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statement as free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principals used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our Audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

**Based on our audit, we report that :**

- i Subject to the comments in we have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii Except Balance sheet, other financial statements like the Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the Uniform format prescribed by Ministers of Finance, Government of India. The closing balances of various account heads have not been suitably grouped and disclosed under respective major accounting heads in balance sheet as prescribed in the format.
- iii In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by Rajive Gandhi National Institute of Youth Develop Sriperumbudur as required in the rules and regulations of the Institute in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv We further report that :

**A. Balance Sheet****Sources of Funds****1) Application of Funds - Advances - Rs. 17,68,36,707**

Advances given to various programmes and to staff amounting to Rs. 2,12 crore were incorrectly accounted as expenditure in the year of payment in earlier years and these advances were yet to be settled. This has resulted in understatement of Earmarked funds and Current assets, Loans & Advances to the extent of Rs. 2.12 crore.

However, it was wrongly mentioned in revised financial statements (such-17 : notes on accounts) that the pending advances as on 31.03. 2017 were Rs. 2.91 crore

**2. Sources of Funds**

**Capital Fund ( Sch.1) Rs. 92,03,11,269**

**Current Liabilities (Sch.-4) Rs. 1,46,16, 920**

i) According to the guidelines in uniform, the amount of grant in aid utilized for creation of capital assets during the year has to be added to capital fund and the utilized grant has to be disclosed under current liabilities,. It was also mentioned in the "Significant accounting policies" (Such-16: pars) enclosed to financial statements of the institute that unspent capital grant balances have been carried forward in the balance sheet separately.

However, out of the capital grant of Rs. 10.79 corer received during the year. The institute has utilized an amount of Rs. 7.96 corer for purchase of fixed assets. (In the US given for capital grant, It was mentioned that an amount Rs. 7.96 Core the entire capital resulted in overstatement of capital fund and understatement of current Liabilities to the extent of Rs. 2.83 crore

ii) Further, an amount of Rs. 25,18,63,200 (Including capital grant of Rs. 10.79 core) has been added to capital fund and an amount of Rs. 14,41,95,446 Has been reduced from capital fund during the year. The details of this addition/ deletion furnished to Audit.

Hence, the correctness of closing balance of capital fund disclosed in balance sheet could not be ensured by audit.

The institute has spent an excess amount of Rs. 1, 62,68, 655 And Rs. 38,08, 298 Over and above the grants received for SC Sub and ST Sub Plan schemes respectively. Without any sanction from Gil, the



excess spent amount has been disclosed as receivable: under assets side in Balance sheet. This has resulted in overstatement of capital fund and current Assets to the extent of Rs. 2.01 crore

## **B. Income & Expenditure Account**

### **Income - Grants Received**

**Plan - Rs. 9,91,19,302 & Non plan - Rs. 7,00,00,000**

### **Balance Sheet**

**Sources of Funds - Current Liabilities - Rs. 1,46,16,920**

The entire revenue grand (plan & non plan) received during the year amounting to Rs. 16,91 core has been accounted as income in I!E Account instead of accounting the revenue grand as income only to the extent of Rs. 16.13 crore (i.e) excess of expenditure including depreciation expenditure over internal revenue for the year) This has resulted in overstatement of income and surplus in income & Expenditure account to the extent of Rs. 0.78 crore Consequently, this has resulted in overstatement of capital fund and understatement of current liabilities (underutilized grand) to the same extent.

## **C. General**

- i) According to the guidelines in uniform format of accounting, separate financial statement ( Balance Sheet, I & E accounts & R&P account) have to be prepared for the transactions relating to Contributory Provident Fund (CPF) and National Pension System (NPS) and the same have to be appended to institute;s main accounts. Based on the audit objection in previous year, the institute had removed the transactions of CPF & NPS from institute main accounts during the year. However separate Financial statement for CPF & NPS were not appended to main accounts.
- ii) Even though the CPF liability was removed from main accounts, the CPF assets (CPF deposit - Rs. 17,40,822 and CPF bank balance - Rs. 10,93,452 were continued to be disclosed under assets side of institutes main accounts. As duce without any C PF liability on the liabilities side, the C PF assets amounting to Rs. 28,34,274 Were continued to be disclosed on the assets side of institutes main accounts.

Hence, the correctness of C PF & NP S transactions could not be ensured.

## **2. Discrepancies in bank accounts**

### **1. Canara Bank, SB Accounts No. 2926101006030**

The closing balance as per cash book (ledger) as on 31.03.2017 was rs. 55,12,012 And as per bacnk statement it was Rs. 54,40,312. Instead of disclosing the balance as per cash book in financial statements as Rs. 55,12.012 The balance as per bank statement ire Rs. 54,40,312 Was disclosed under current assets in balance sheet.

Cash remittances and squelches deposited in bank during 07/2016 to 12/2016 amounting to Rs. 71,700 Were not yet credited in bank account.

**ii) Canard Bank, SB Account No. 2926101000001**

Thirteen squelches amounting to Rs. 2,58,506 Issued on this bank account during 10.09.2015 to 23.12.2016 were not yet encashed in bank.

Twenty three DD/ Cheques amounting to Rs. 13,29,824 Received and deposited in bank during 04.05.2016 to 23.12.2016 were not yet credited in bank account.

Two items of cash remittance amounting to Rs. 8,21,071 during 2016 were not yet credited in bank account.

**iii) canard Bank, AB Account N. 2926101003230**

The correctness of an amount of Rs. 32,60,412 Disclosed as closing balance of the above bank account in the list of Cash and bank balance under current assets in balance sheet could not be ensured by audit as no details view provided to audit.

**iv) Indian Bank, SB A/c No. 884440070**

DDS/ Cheques/Cash deposited during 2008 to 2015 amounting to rs. 14,99,187 were not yet credited in bank account.

Cheques issued before 2008 for an amount of Rs. 13,58,425 were not yet encashed in bank.

3. The total value of fixed deposits as per deposit register and fixed deposit receipts (FDRs) held as on 31.03.2017 was Rs. 5,01,83,746. Whereas the value of deposits disclosed in balance sheet was Rs. 4,96,88,899. Thus there was a difference of Rs. 4,94,847 Between the value of Deposits as per books of accounts and disclosure in balance sheet.
4. It has been mentioned in the significant accounting policies ( Seh. 16- Para.3) that I&E account has been prepared on accrual basis, however, many liabilities created for outstanding expenses and assets created for prepaid expenses in earlier years are continue to be disclosed under current liabilities, other current assets and student dues for the last three years without adjusting the curretn year incommode Expenditure. This shows that the institute has not complied the concept of accrual basis in preparation of I&E account.
5. According to the guidelines in uniform format, any income or expenditure over and above Rs. 50,000 or 1% of gross income whichever is higher shall be shown as a separate and distance item against an appropriate account head in I&E account. This principal was not complied In following disclosure

**a) Indirect Income**

DD& NE-FT Received Rs. 29,04,303: NEFEN Returned : Rs . 1,60,000

Nodal account India ideas : Rs. 7,47,807

**B) Establishment expenditure**

Non plan expenditure : Rs. 93,72,870. Other Expenditure : Rs. 1,60,000

Hence, the correctness and the nature of income or expenditure in I & E account with regard to above items could not be ensured.

6. No depreciation was provided on the value Common wealth-Asia Centre disclosed under fixed assets of Regional Office, Chandigarh.
7. ETTI grant received during the year as per Received and payments account was Rs. 15,52,500. However, an amount of Rs. 40,36,500 was wrongly accounted as receipt under ETTI grant in the earmarked funds (Sch). Hence, the correctness of ETTI grant disclosed in balance sheet could not be ensured.
8. An amount of Rs. 19,95,330 was disclosed as reconciliation suspense under payments side of receipt & payments account to tally the difference in r & p account. In view of the suspense amount, the correctives of R&P account could not be ensured.
9. The institute has been maintaining its accounts in TALLY software. The books of accounts were available in soft copy form only. However, the institute has neither given access to TALLY software nor furnished hard copy of books of accounts (i.e. Printed copy form TALLY) for audit verification. The ledger copies were furnished only with regard to objections raised by Audit. As such the complete set of books of accounts was not available for audit security.
10. Provision for EL encashment has not been provided by the Institute. Provision for Gratuity based on actuarial valuation for the year ended 31 March 2016 was provided during the year. No additional provision for current year was made. The provision made for gratuity was also not routed through income & expenditure account as required under general accounting principles.

**D. Effect of Revision in Accounts**

The accounts of the institute were revised based on audit comments, which resulted in the following:

- a. Assets & Liabilities in Balance sheet were increased by Rs. 1.36 crore. (ten transaction)
- b. Income decreased by Rs. 4.50 crore (two transaction) and expenditure decreased by Rs. 5.58 crore (four transaction). This has resulted in Deficit of Rs. 0.26 crore in Income & Expenditure Account become surplus of Rs. 0.82 crore. Total effect of revision is Rs. 1.08 crore.

**E. Management letter**

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

**F. Grants-in-aid**

Out of the grants-in-aid of Rs. 31.78 crore received during the year 2016-17, Rs. 0.40 crore being unspent balance of the previous year and interest earned on grants Rs. 0.35 crore (totaling Rs. 32.53 crore), the Institute could utilize a sum of Rs. 29.02 crore leaving a balance of Rs. 3.51 crore as at 31st March 2017.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, subject to comment No. A-2, A-3, c-3, C-4 and C-9 and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India;
- a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur as at 31st March 2017 and
- b. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account, the surplus for the year ended on that date.

### Schedule 16

#### Significant Accounting Policies

##### 1. Basis of preparation of financial statements

The Financial statements are prepared in accordance with "Generally Accepted Accounting Principles" followed in India under the historical cost convention on the mercantile basis.

##### 2. Government Grants

Institute has both restricted and unrestricted grants.

Restricted grants are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions given at the time of grant.

Grant received towards Plan, Non-Plan Expenditures and Grants received for specific programmes have been routed through the Income & Expenditures Account. Capital Grants received have been accounted for in the capital fund and unspent balances have been carried forward in the Balance Sheet separately.

##### 3. All Known Incomes and Expenses are recognized based on accrual method.

##### 4. Fixed Assets & Depreciation

Value of Fixed assets are exhibited at cost of acquisition less depreciation. Depreciation has been provided on the Written down value method as per the rates prescribed in the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Cost of acquisition is inclusive of inward freight, duties and incidental and direct expenses related to the acquisition.

For fixed assets belonging to Commonwealth Programme-Asia centre in Chandigarh, the market value as provided has been taken as grant-in-aid and added with the fixed assets, whereas depreciation has not been provided for such fixed assets.

##### 5. Retirement Benefits

Necessary provision has been made for payment of gratuity to retiring employees.

##### 6. Based on the Observations of CAG Audit, the accounts have been revised and re-grouped wherever necessary.

##### 7. The institution is following New Pension System and hence no provision for pension has been made in the annual accounts. No provision for EL encashment has been made.

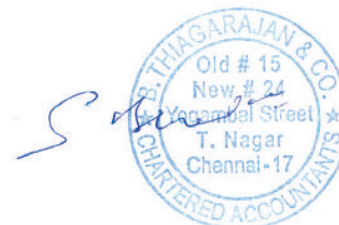

#### 2. PROGRAMME ADVANCE

The institute's policy is to provide advance to programme of organizers (both employees & other institutions) for conducting various programmes. #### 3. Taxation

Since the institute has been registered under 12AA of the Income Tax Act, 1961; the computation of income has been prepared based on the actual Receipts & Payments Account ( on Receipt Basis ) as prescribed u/s 11 of the Income Tax Act, 1961. There will be no tax liability and hence no provision has been made towards taxation.

- 4. Financial Statement relating to Contributory Provident fund and National Pension Schemes have been incorporated in the institute's financial statement.
- 5. Previous year's figures have been regrouped / reclassified wherever necessary to conform to current year's Classification.
