



The Hon'ble President of India is the Visitor of the Institute. The multifarious activities of the Institute are monitored by the Executive Council, Academic Council, Finance Committee and the Building and Works Committee. The various meetings held during the period are presented in the report.

Under the dynamic leadership of our Honourable Prime Minister, the government has envisioned an approach that is cognizant of divergent realities. The model he advocates is inclusive in nature that urges Sab ke Sath, Sab Ka Vikas. Under this approach, RGNIYD took constructive efforts to address issues and aspirations of the young millennials charting out their future.

This Annual Report for the year 2019-20 gives about the objectives of the Institute, functions and governance structure of the Institute and brings the details of the Academic programme, the Activities carried out by the Office of the Controller of Examinations, various training activities carried out throughout the year both in the Headquarters and Regional Centre at Chandigarh, the academic activities carried out by the Faculty Members of the Institute, the overall Administrative activities of the Teaching and Non-Teaching, functions of the Community Radio Station, the maintenance of Civil and Electrical Works carried out by the Engineering Wing, the special features of the Central Library and the Annual Accounts for the year 2019-20.

During the period under report, RGNIYD continued to offers 5 post-graduate programmes, namely, (i) M.Sc. in Counselling Psychology, (ii) M.A. in Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship, (iii) M.A. in Local Governance and Development, (iv) M.A. in Development Policy and Practice and (v) M.A. in Social Work (Youth and Community Development) and besides offering under graduate programmes viz., (i) B.Voc. (Apparel Manufacturing and Entrepreneurship), (ii) B.Voc. (Fashion Design and Retail). The Ph.D programme was temporarily suspended for the academic year in order to modify the Ph.D regulations as per the guidelines of the UGC. A new Ph.D regulations was framed by a Committee of Experts from various Universities and the Academic and Executive Councils have approved the revised Ph,D regulations.

The Rajiv Gandhi National Institute has conducted the 2nd Convocation on 8th February 2020 in which the Hon'ble Minister of State for Youth Development, Shri Kiren Rijju has awarded Degrees to the students. The Chairperson, Executive Council, has presided over the Annual convocation. The Secretary, Joint Secretary and Deputy Secretary of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports have participated.

The RGNIYD has organised 103 Training programmes spread over to the entire Country in which 4260 functionaries and youth have undergone training in various programmes out of which 2323 male and 1878 female participated. RGNIYD also observed several days of national and international significance.

The Institute stands firm in its social responsibility and has taken community-based development initiatives for strengthening its social causes. Towards this direction, RGNIYD continued to offer various services to the youth of the adopted village - Kachipattu by way of providing career guidance and counselling, besides periodically organising skill development and community development programmes for the uplift of the village youth. By organising rural camps, the students were exposed to the real-life situation of the youth in far flung villages and were encouraged to undertake various developmental efforts as part of their academic learning. The Institute also organised eye screening camps, blood donation campaigns etc. during the year.

The RGNIYD Regional Centre, Chandigarh catering to the training and consultancy needs of Youth functionaries, NGOs/CBOs and Youth in the northern region of the country conducted numerous master training and capacity building programmes. In commemoration/observance of various national/international days of importance the RGNIYD Regional Centre organised befitting programmes at its campus.

Internal Audit Report was conducted by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India on the Accounts of the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development for the year ending 31st March 2020 and the Audit has made some observations

and opined that to the best of their information and according to the explanations given to them, the said financial statements were read by Audit together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and issued the Separate Audit Report stating that the Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India.

02 AN OVERVIEW

The Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD) is an Institute of National Importance by an Act of Parliament No. 35/12. It is an apex Institution of the Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, functions with the goal of building the capacity of youth organisations, functionaries and professionals. The Institute works in close association with NSS and NYKs in conducting training programmes across the country for youth functionaries. RGNIYD endeavours to facilitate the nation's youth with a conducive environment and tools that will enable them to make the most of their natural potential to realize their aspirations.

RGNIYD serves as a vital resource centre with its multi-faceted functions of conducting training programmes for youth functionaries across the country, besides offering academic programmes, engaging in seminal research in the vital areas of youth development and extension and outreach initiatives across the country.

RGNIYD serves as a youth observatory and depository in the country, thereby embarking on surveillance on youth-related issues. It has a wide network with various organisations working for the welfare and development of youth.

A. The Objectives of the Institute

- To evolve and achieve an integrated approach to youth development for preparing and empowering the youth for the future, by
 - i. Providing action oriented research inputs for policy formulation;
 - ii. Implementation of policy through extension and other programmes. Promoting assessment and impact study and conducting teaching, training and other academic programmes;

- To set up advanced National Youth Resource Centre commensurate with the international standards to provide for comprehensive and scientifically analysed data on all youth-related issues and matters, with adequate library facility, documentation and publication;
- To provide for research and development and dissemination of knowledge through extension and outreach programmes;
- To act as a nodal agency for capacity building of stakeholders including youth bodies, organisations and agencies relating to youth;
- To empower youth to participate in inclusive e. development and nation building;
- To evolve as an institute of advanced study in the field of youth and to develop such professional excellence as may be required for the purpose:
- To provide for higher education in the field of youth development through employment-oriented and inter-disciplinary courses at the post graduate level.

B. Functions of the Institute

The Institute shall:

- Develop as a "think tank" by way of carrying out policy research, evaluation and impact analysis on youth programmes and issues of contemporary and future relevance:
- Function as a repository of knowledge pertaining to data on youth;
- Develop documentation, information and publication of services for youth training and extension;
- Provide technical advice and consultancy for formulation of youth related policy and promotion of youth programme;

- e. Build the professional capacity of youth organisations, both in Government and voluntary sector:
- f. Design, develop and conduct appropriate training and orientation programmes;
- g. Conduct seminars, workshops and conferences on issues relating to youth;
- h. Set up centres for dissemination of academic and training programmes;
- i. Collaborate with national and international university, centres, institutes and such other agencies relating to youth training and youth development;
- j. Establish programmes of study and research and to provide for instruction in such branches of study as the institute deems appropriate;
- Award, subject to such conditions as the Institute may determine, degrees, diplomas, certificates or other academic distinctions or titles at various academic levels;
- I. Confer honorary degrees or other distinction awards, fellowships, scholarships, prizes and medals;
- m. Determine, demand and receive fees and other charges for its courses, programmes and other matters;
- Conduct and coordinate projects and studies relating to youth sponsored by the Government of India and other developmental agencies;
- o. Create with the prior approval of the Central Government, academic, technical, administrative, managerial and other posts in the Institute and make appointments thereto in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Institute
- p. Regulate the conduct of the affairs of the Institute

- q. Supervise and control the discipline of all categories of employees and students of the Institute;
- r. Purchase, hire, lease, exchange or acquire property, movable or immovable and to construct, alter and maintain any building or buildings as may be necessary;
- s. Set up distance learning or educational centres, in collaboration with Open Universities, to provide access to the aspiring young professionals enabling them to take up a career in the field of youth development;
- t. Establish, maintain and manage halls of residences and hostels for students;
- Lay down conditions of service including a code of conduct for teachers and other categories of employees;
- v. Supervise, control and regulate the discipline of students of the Institute and to make arrangements for promoting their health and general welfare
- w. Coordinate student exchange programmes with reputed International Youth Development Institutions
- x. Undertake, assist and promote all such activities conducive or incidental to the attainment of the objectives.


C. Governance Structure

Details on Academic Programmes

A. Doctoral Programmes

The Institute continued to offer Ph.D. programmes (Full time and Part Time) which were launched during 2011. Presently, 23 full time scholars and 10 part-time scholars with a total of 33 Scholars have been enrolled for Ph.D. programme in the Institute. Two of the scholars have been conferred with Ph.D degree. Following are the PhD Programmes.

Ph.D in Youth Empowerment (Youth Studies and Extension)

The PhD in Youth Empowerment (Youth Studies and Extension) gives the research Scholar an opportunity to develop specialised knowledge in an area of interdisciplinary interest and to hone advanced research skills in the field of youth development. The PhD in Youth Empowerment is linked to Sociology, Psychology, Social Work and Education. Depending on the specialised area, the scholar can choose the course work and methodology training. Here, the scholars seek to understand and make a difference to the lives of youth and their families and to build understandings youth in theory, research and practice. Apart from these, the PhD in Youth studies and Extension enables the researchers to have a unique transdisciplinary approach to the study of youth where the scholars are encouraged to think and study across the traditional disciplinary boundaries.

Ph.D in Gender Studies

In contemporary Indian context it's important to gain knowledge on various feminist theories, women's organizations and women's movements for better understanding of women issues. We focus on alternative inclusive research method namely feminist research method to study gender issues. How the knowledge is constructed and deployed and how interdisciplinary feminist perspectives

inform research methods to enable the young researchers to introspect on the gendered experiences across the spectrum of daily life and understand power relations through gender lens. This discipline focuses on conceptual understanding of gender disparities and gender inequalities in society. Enhancing the understanding and to capacitate the students to explore the possibilities to alter the genderscape.

Politics of gender roles and cultural construction of masculinity and femininity, gender socialisation, perspective of body and discourse on power relationship. Invisibility of women's work and gender inequality, segmented labour market and gender based segregation, gender issues in organised and unorganised sectors are very important to study and bring policy suggestions to improve the condition. Multi sectoral approach, multidimensional planning is important to achieve the sustainable development goals. Evaluation of social and economic empowerment of women, Political and legal Empowerment of Women are need of the hour. Imparting training for women development functionaries, youth workers on capacity building for women empowerment, Women and Health, Gender Planning, Gender Budgeting, Gender mainstreaming and gender analysis are the main trust areas in Gender and Development spectrum.

To analyse health issues which concern women throughout the life cycle, the psychological, Physiological, cultural and political impact upon women's wellbeing will be focused in research. Study on the importance of nutrition and health to improve the quality of life for women in particular. Understand about health care education for women, and policies, to examine the interconnections of poverty, privatization and health seeking behaviour of women, learn about gender based violence, gender stereotyping, gender discrimination and plan to ensure gender just society.

Ph.D in Local Governance and Development

The PhD programme in Local Governance and Development is a multi-disciplinary programme structured with a multi-dimensional and inter-sectoral knowledge-base for strengthening Local Government Institutions and development organisations. The course-work curriculum enables the scholars to analyse the dynamics of decentralized governance and to equip them with the requisite skills towards

realising and understanding the various dimensions of local economic development and social justice. The programme is expected to enhance their leadership potentials as change agents. In addition to the course-work training at the department scholars benefits from a broad range of specific methods training offered by reputed Universities / Institutes across the country for which scholars receive special support form the Institute. To equip the scholars with the diverse settings of their studies department support them with thematic workshops, learning journeys, social laboratory experiments etc.

Ph.D in Life Skills Education

Education, besides improving knowledge and imparting skills, is viewed as an exceptional means to foster more harmonious form of human development and thereby reduce poverty and social exclusions, promote social justice and equality of opportunity. The concept of education is to be broadened beyond the traditional and continuing education. The meaningful education that can empower people with knowledge, skills and right attitude has become an absolute priority. The broader vision of education encompasses the four important pillars of education: learning to be, learning to know, learning to do and learning to live together. Life Skills Education aims to provide human society with strategies to make healthy choices that contribute to a meaningful life. Life skills are the abilities that help to promote mental wellbeing and competence in people as they face the realities of life. It enables people to take positive actions to enhance personal growth and promote meaning full social relationships. Life skills education empowers people with leadership and other psycho-social skills to meet the challenges in life.

The new millennium brought the enduring tensions between unlimited expansion of knowledge and the limited capacity of human beings to assimilate it on the one hand competition and inequality of opportunity on the other. The universal challenge at this juncture is developing human potential of this generation to face and balance between the competing interests, enriching and enhancing youth has become a prioritised global agenda to make a healthy generation. The core life skills are very important and it needs to incorporate in the academic curriculum and make all possible ways to practice in daily life.

The innovative methods of life skills training, Participatory teaching and learning in life skills education and inclusive growth, Philosophical and theoretical foundations of Life Skills Education, Personality Development and Leadership Qualities are achieved through Life Skills Education. Developing appropriate tools for life Skills research are very much needed in different context. The evidence based results will support and strengthen the life skills across the disciples. The multi sectoral approaches in life skills education are important and well acclaimed across the societies.

Ph.D in Applied Psychology

The Applied Psychology Ph.D. programme offer the foundation for an independent, insightful and analytical perception of one's own and others' research through studying theoretical and methodical subject areas, as well as providing practice in communicating research results in academic - and other forums. The PhD Programme offered by the Department of Applied Psychology will provide academic support and supervision in the candidate's thesis work and qualify for research activity or other work that requires an advanced extent of academic insight.

Ph.D in Development Studies

Development, as broadly understood, refers to a range of perspectives, predominantly premised on dominant discourse of western modernity and plurality of approaches. Moreover, the state-led-development model has not yielded desired results and India continues to face the development challenges At this juncture, it becomes imperative to articulate development thinking and development action with a fresh outlook taking into consideration of ground realities in the Indian context. In view of the present scenario and in recognition of the need for the quality professionals in the development sector, the Department of Development Studies has started offering Ph.D. Programmes. Following are the salient features of the programme:

 Conceptualizing inclusive models of development that problematizes the structural inequities in Indian context (religion, caste, gender, geographic dynamics) and exploring new models and scales of partnerships for development

- Evolving perspectives for a right-based, sustainable development through, research and extension activities in the field of development studies
- To ideate and research on youth development issues, nationally and internationally, that successfully addresses the unique challenges of developing nations

Ph.D in Social Engineering

Being the part of the PhD programme in the Department Social Engineering the student becomes part of our vibrant and interdisciplinary research team. The Department encourages and develops entrepreneurial skills as well as academic and research abilities. Students of the Department are presently working on the topics.

Ph.D in Social Work

The Department of Social Work was established at RGNIYD in the year 2016. The Department offers Ph.D. Programme in Social Work on Full time and Part-time basis. The Department extends opportunity to persons with inclination to develop new knowledge and new skills in advanced level of research in Social Work, specifically in the areas, such as Social Work with Youth, Youth and Community Development and Youth issues. Persons who have completed M.Phil., with 55% and / OR completed UGC-NET are eligible to apply for the Ph.D. programme in Social Work. The minimum period of completion is 3 years and the maximum period is 5 years. For admission to the Ph.D. Programme in Social Work, submission of a research proposal is compulsory. The research proposal must contain 1000 words by highlighting the broader area of the research which includes the Problem statement, Need and importance of the study, objectives, Scope of the study, Materials and methods to be adopted and References. The Candidates can also give brief information on their previous research experience in the proposed research area, if any.

B. Post Graduate Programmes

The course curricula at RGNIYD are customized to provide knowledge and information from interdisciplinary view points that merge the various aspects of contemporary social theory and thought. Along with training in the process of academic scholarship, the Institute also provides the students with opportunities to innovate, and to convert academic knowledge into hands-on experience in both rural and urban environments. All the Post Graduate courses of RGNIYD have one clear distinct focus: to transform its students into career professionals both for the public and the private sector. Following are the Post Graduate Programmes offered:

M.Sc. Counselling Psychology

Counselling Psychology is a specialized area in the discipline of Psychology that provides professional help to individuals to enhance their personal and interpersonal functioning across the lifespan with a focus on emotional, social, vocational, educational, health, developmental and organizational issues. Counsellors facilitate individuals and groups to improve and adjust to demanding situation in highly effective way. The M.Sc., Programme in Counselling Psychology being offered by RGNIYD has strong roots in theory and contemporary practice commensurate to the profession. The programme will enable the students to diagnose the problems of the clients scientifically and employ the therapeutic techniques and counselling skills during the counselling process besides with ethical considerations. This cutting edge programme allows the students to choose their areas of specialization with inbuilt theory-practice nexus. The students are provided with opportunities for field practicum, internships, case works, institutional visits and supervised skill training in each domain of specialization in counselling viz., School, adolescent, career, family and work place.

M.A. (Development Policy and Practice)

M.A. in Development Policy and Practice is designed to break the new ground, drawing extensively from the wide range of theoretical perspective, issues, and practices with alternative possibility. The overarching framework of the programme encompasses the canvass of key approaches, methodologies, and methods. The pedagogic methods in the classroom learning are entwined with the field immersion that provides an immense opportunity for field tested learning. On the completion of the course, the students will be imbibed with substantive knowledge in development perspectives, issues, and methodologies. This programme, with its value-added thematic workshops and specialized training will enhance the employability of the students as professionals in the development sector in diverse settings. The Masters in Development Policy and Practice paves the theoretical grounding that helps youth address developing world issues with practical experience and refine the transferable skills in critical analysis, communication, cross-cultural understanding, research methods, project design, project management and teamwork.

M.A. Local Governance and Development

This programme structures multi-dimensional and inter-sectoral knowledge-base for strengthening Local Government Institutions and development organisations. The curriculum enables the youth to analyse the dynamics of decentralized governance and to equip them with the requisite skills towards realising local economic development and social justice. The new trends in the field like E-Governance, Common Property Resource Management, Public Policy, Sustainable Cities, Disaster & Risk Management, Evaluation of Programmes & Projects, Constituency Management, etc. are also incorporated in the programme. It empowers the learner to apply the principles of 'Horizontal Learning' to identify, share and adapt the best practices, to achieve 'good governance at the grassroots'. Thematic workshops, learning journey, internships, field-based studies, social laboratory, experiential learning, etc. add value to the programme and enhance the employability of the learners in diverse work settings.

M.A (Social Innovations and Entrepreneurship)

M.A in Social Innovations and Entrepreneurship is a two-year masters' programme designed for the students who possess entrepreneurial spirit and aspire for social change. It is a distinctive and innovative programme structured to prepare the students professionally for meaningful social engagement by reflecting on the issues of unemployment and by setting new patterns and possibilities for employment generation through

social innovations entrepreneurship. The course comprises of theoretical and experiential learnings through class room teaching, innovative assignments, case analysis, internship, skill labs, concurrent field work and interaction with successful social entrepreneurs. Students will also be given training for honing their entrepreneurial traits, skills and competencies that are pre-requisite for successful social entrepreneurs to create social values and meet social needs.

M.A. Social Work (Youth and Community Development)

The Institute launched the M.A. Social Work Programme with specialization in Youth and Community Development during the year 2016.

Introduction of M.A. in Social Work with Youth Work and Community Development as a specialization would create a platform for delivering youth services in a professional manner by stimulating synthesis of theory and practice. The course aims to professionalize youth work and train youth workers as critical reflective practitioners.

Social work is an interdisciplinary subject which also needs to be expanded in the terrain of youth and community development. India is the youngest country with 64 per cent of its population in the working age group. The median individual in India will be 28 years in 2020 and the youth are going to be turned into a demographic dividend, it is essential to pay due attention to this dynamic workforce. Access to opportunities and providing training will empower the youth to contribute towards nation building. The National Youth Policy, 2014 (NYP-2014) also emphasizes on youth development and productive youth participation. According to a UN High Level Panel report on the Post 2015 development agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals, Youth should be placed at the centre of any new development framework by focussing on youth development. This will enable them to design, implement and monitor youth empowerment strategies. For assessing the needs of the young people and to work for youth and community development, professional intervention calls for attention.

Social work is a professional and academic discipline which intends to enhance the quality of individuals, groups and communities belonging to weaker sections. Youth work is for all


young people to build their capacity individually and collectively, to exercise citizenship and civic engagement and to create a democratic and just society. M.A. Social Work in youth and community development is a two years postgraduate course that aims to provide knowledge of youth work origins, concepts, models, principles and practices with experiential learning. The course provides a comprehensive understanding of issues concerning youth and a professional approach to dealing with youth related problems.


At the end of the course, students of M.A. Social work in youth and community development will benefit as follows:

Enrolment of Students from the Year 2015-17 to 2018-20





C. Institution under MOU with RGNIYD

The Apparel and Training Design Centre entered into MoU with Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development for offering the B.Voc programme in Apparel Manufacturing & Entrepreneurship, Fashion Design Retail, with the total duration of the programme as 3 years (6 Semester in a modular format) with 150 credits / 3000 Hours of teaching at ATDC-SKPs. Credits for General Contents are awarded by RGNIYD and Skill Content by ATDC for the award of Diploma / Advance Diploma / Degree.

Apparel Training and Designing Centre (ATDC)

The Apparel Training and Designing Centre (ATDC), a Society registered under the Societies Registration Act 1860 and promoted by Apparel Export Promotion Council, New Delhi has entered into MoU with RGNIYD and the following B.Voc courses at 30 ATDC vocational institutes across the country, which is a full time academic programme.

B.Voc. Programmes in Fashion Design & Design and Apparel Manufacturing and Entrepreneurship

Indian Textile and Apparel Industry has been growing significantly over the last many years and contributing to significantly to India's GDP and serves as the second largest employment providing sector next to agriculture. In the current scenario, the Apparel & Textile Sector plays a key role in the country's growth and economic development. The categories of jobs available in this sector are based on creativity, technology and management. The workforce required for Apparel Sector requires key competencies/capabilities which

facilitate not only innovative responses to market pressures, but also flexible adaptation to unstable and rapidly changing markets. With this backdrop, RGNIYD has introduced the Bachelor's Degree Programmes B.Voc. in Fashion Design and Retail and Apparel Manufacturing and Entrepreneurship. These programmes are offered through a tripartite agreement between RGNIYD, Apparel Training and Design Centre (ATDC) and Institute of Apparel Management (IAM).

The Objectives of the course are:

- To provide vocational education, hands on training, enhance their employability skills and knowledge for performing various tasks and "employability roles" within the industry and to be highly valued by employers overseas.
- To make the learners as adaptive skilled workforce in accordance with technological advancement for creating future professionals

D. Fellowship and scholarships offered

Fellowship to Ph.D Scholars

RGNIYD offers fellowship of Rs.13000 p.m plus Rs.24,000 contingency per year for full time Ph.D scholars who are not in receipt of any other fellowships from any source.

Merit Scholarship

RGNIYD took initiative to award merit scholarship to its students purely based on merit alone. It is an incentive for hard work and scholarly pursuit. Scholarship is given to first and second rank holders in each semester examination from each Department.

NYKS and NSS Scholarship

In order to attract more no. of students, RGNIYD took initiative to provide scholarship to NYKS volunteers with meritorious service for a minimum period of two years duly recommended by the State Director. The NYKS volunteers were awarded a scholarship of Rs.3500 per student per semester. Likewise, the NSS volunteers who participated in the NSS activities for 240

hours in two years and attended NSS special camp for seven days were awarded scholarship amount of Rs. 1000 per month.

Scholarship for Single Girl Child

As per UGC guidelines, RGNIYD grants Rs.2,000/- per month for a period of two years only (10 months in a year) for Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarship for Single Girl Child. As per this, a student is eligible to get Rs.20,000/- per annum excluding hostel charges, refundable deposits & medical charges.


Scholarship to SC/ST Students

A.Training of Trainers Programme

Training of Trainers on Employability Skills for NSS Programme Officers
10-12 July 2019
Yogi Vemana University, Kadapa, Andhra Pradesh

The Centre for Training Orientation and Capacity Building, RGNIYD, Sriperumbudur and Yogi Vemana University, Kadapa, Andhra Pradesh jointly organized a 3-day Training of Trainers on Employability Skills for the NSS Programme Officers of YSR District (Kadapa District) from 10-12 July 2019



at Yogi Vemana University. The programme was attended by 35 NSS Programme Officers and NSS Volunteers of YSR district of Kadapa. The programme was inaugurated by the Prof. Attipalli Ramachandra Reddy, Vice-Chancellor, Yogi Vemana University who emphasized the importance of employability skills in the competitive world. RGNIYD has selected YSR district, Kadapa to train the College Educators, Placement Officers and NSS officers for enhancing the employability skills of college students. The main objective of the programme was to equip the trainees on various aspect namely self-branding, career goal setting and execution, managing time, communication skills, adaptability and collaboration, enhancing and influencing skill, decision making

skill and how to use digital communication technology to gain knowledge on the job opportunities available. Experiential learning methodology was used to elicit participation from the participants. Simulation exercises, role place, group activities and video presentations for the other methods used to train the trainees to enable them and enhance the employability skills.

Training of Trainers on Conflict Resolution and Peace Building 05-07 August 2019 NEHU, Shillong

The Centre for Training, Orientation and Capacity Building, RGNIYD, Sriperumbudur organized a 3-day Training of Trainers on Conflict Resolution and Peace Building for the NSS Programme Officers from Meghalaya from 05-07 August 2019 at NEHU, Shillong. The programme was attended by 26 NSS programme officers from Meghalaya. The programme was inaugurated by the State Liaison Officer of Meghalaya. The objective of the programme was to help the participants understand the different ways by which peace is built and maintained between individuals, families and communities. Part of the deliberations is to understand what is conflict (strained relationship) how it is an integral part of human social eneavour and the ways to handle conflict. Human experience suggests that every conflict can be converted into creative experience, provided we handle it appropriately. The sessions included fundamentals of peace, approaches to peace, individual and society and peace construction, social web. social fabric, understanding conflict, structure of conflict, thirteen factors of conflict, causes of conflict, primordial paradox, nonrealistic ventilation, propensity to proliferate, dealing with conflict, methodology, multi tract approach.

Training of Trainers on Social Entrepreneurship 22 - 24 August 2019 Aadikavi Nannayya University, Rajamahendravaram, Andhra Pradesh

The Department of Social Engineering conducted a three days' Training of Trainers on Social Entrepreneurship in Rajamahendravaram in collaboration with the Department of Social Work, Aadikavi Nannayya University from 22-24 August, 2019. There were 40 Assistant Professors and Lecturers from SC and ST Category. The participants were trained to train the



students of their respective colleges/Universities. There were some session organised on identifying problem, come out with a business plan and do entrepreneurship. The scope and opportunities related to entrepreneurship were also provided to the participants. The three days programmecapacitated the participants on the theme.

Training of Trainers on Conflict Resolution and Peace Building 05-07 September 2019 Dera Natung Government College, Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh

The Priority Area 10 of the National Youth Policy 2014 on inclusion draws increased attention to facilitate participation of Youth living in conflict affected districts, especially those affected by Left Wing Extremism (LWE) including the youth of North Eastern region so that they can access and benefit from various youth development programmes. In this backdrop, RGNIYD in collaboration with the State NSS Cell, Directorate of Higher and Technical Education, Government of Arunachal Pradesh, organised a three-day Training of Trainers on Conflict Resolution and Peace Building for the NSS Programme Officers of various Universities and Colleges in Arunachal Pradesh from 5-7 September 2019 at Dera Natuna



Government College, Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh to build the capacities of youth functionaries. A total of 25 NSS Programme Officers from different districts of Arunachal Pradesh participated in the training. Training of Trainers on Life Skills 16-20 September 2019 Rajiv Gandhi University, Doimukh, Arunachal Pradesh

The Department of Social Work, RGNIYD in collaboration with NSS Regional Centre, Guwahati and Rajiv Gandhi University, Doimukh, Arunachal Pradesh conducted a five-day residential programme on "Training of Trainers on Life Skills" at Rajiv Gandhi University, Doimukh, Arunachal Pradesh from 16-20 September 2019. A total of 37 NSS Programme Officers and teachers of North East Regions participated in this programme. The prime aim of the programme is to impart knowledge and skills on life skills education to the NSS Programme Officers who would, in turn, replicate the life skills training to the college students studying in North East Region. Sessions on Introduction to Life Skills, ten core life skills, training methodologies and techniques were facilitated through activities like group work, discussion, collage, debate, role play by a team of resource persons who are experts in Life Skills.

The participants felt that the training is highly needed for them and for the students to mould their personality and bring about positive behaviour change which are the essential ingredients for academic excellence, personality and leadership development.

Training of Trainers on Life Skills for Field Staff of Community Development Foundation 26-27 September 2019
L&T Skill Training Centre, Eachanari, Coimbatore

Life Skills facilitate the practice and reinforcement of psychosocial skills in a culturally and developmentally appropriate way and contributes to the promotion of personal and social development, besides, preventing health and social problems thereby enabling individuals to face daily life



challenges effectively. The Centre for Training, Orientation and Capacity Building, RGNIYD, Sriperumbudur organized a 2-day Training of Trainers on Life Skills for the Field Staff of Community Development Foundation from 26-27 September 2019 at L&T Skill Training Centre, Coimbatore. The programme was attended by 18 field staff of Community Development Foundation, Coimbatore. The objective of the programme was to impart life skills training for the field staff of Community Development Foundation, Coimbatore who will in turn train the tribal adolescent student to enhance their skills and personality to bring a positive change in behavior and attitude among them in nine government schools. Ultimately this effort will help in enabling the tribal adolescents develop capacities to face challenges in their academic and career life. The participants were provided hands on training on the ten core life skills prescribed by the WHO viz., Self -awareness,

Empathy, Critical Thinking, Creative Thinking, Decision Making, Problem Solving, Communication skills, Interpersonal skills, Coping with emotions and Coping with Stress. They were trained on the facilitation skills for imparting life skills to the tribal adolescents using various methods including storytelling, engaging them in real-time activities/exercises and use of audio-visual contents. The participants were also trained on the empirical assessment of life skills among the adolescents which will enable them to identify the lacking areas and to provide appropriate interventions. During the valedictory, the Mr. Sugaraja, CSR Manager, L&T, Coimbatore indicated that the master trainers trained through this programme would reach out to about 3000 tribal students from the Government schools with the support of L&T CSR initiatives. He requested RGNIYD to organize programs on Career Guidance, employability skills for field staffs of Community Development Foundation, Coimbatore.

The Youth enthusiastically participated in the training held in Hyderabad (NIRD & PR) from 9-14 December 2019. They were exposed to the different kinds of leaves that are available in plenty in the north east that could be converted into plates, cups, glasses and spoons which will be replacing similar plastic products in their state. The trainees were oriented on the Details of Machinery, Leaf Stitching Machines, Types of Moulding Machines for Manufacturing Leaf Plates and Cups



Field visit was arranged to a Successful Small Scale Industry involved in manufacturing Leaf Plates and Leaf Cups and Industrial facility manufacturing various types of machines and dies for manufacturing leaf plates and cups, models of machines, operations of various types of machines (Visit to M/s. Annapurna Cottage Industries, Hyderabad). The trainees were provided opportunity to witness the actual production of leaf plates and cups with various types of raw material, the

machine fabrication facility of the industry which also sells the machines for the prospective entrepreneurs.

The trainees were oriented on the basic aspects of computers and the essential operations and functions that a rural entrepreneur needs to be equipped with for correspondence, marketing, sales and billing. Further, they were oriented on various e-commerce platforms on which they could easily register their products for marketing globally. Later, the trainees were provided various simulation exercises for registering and creating profile of their products online.

The Director General, NIRD & PR delivering the valedictory address and urged the youth of north east to become employers providing employment to the other youth in the north east by becoming successful entrepreneurs.

RGNIYD and NIRD & PR will facilitate the trained youth of north east to get loans from various sources to enable them to set up self-employment units in their respective villages/districts.

The trainees were provided inputs on Introduction about Eco-friendly Handmade paper making products like bags, photo frame, jewel box, importance and advantages of handmade paper products, demand in the market for handmade paper making, raw material for bags, photo frame, box, details of required tools, raw material availability in North East, difference between handmade paper and mill paper. Practical sessions on handmade paper bag making (step by step guide to making) based on raw material availability to suit various markets, During the training, the trainees are exposed to designing, cutting, fabrication and finishing of goods through both classroom as well as practical learning. The trainees undertook a task analysis of breaking down all the operations that involved in production of handmade paper bags (measurement, cutting paper) and logo with minute details of do's and don'ts. The trainees later were engaged in Q & A Session to clarify their doubts regarding the production process, printing logos and machinery. The valedictory session was presided over by Dr. B. Janardhan Reddy, IAS, Secretary, Agriculture and Co-operation, Government of Telangana. The Head of Centre for Innovations & Appropriate Technologies and the Senior Consultant of the Rural Technology Park were also present during the valedictory.

Enhancing Skills of Youth of North East India through Rural Technologies Skill Training on Preparation on Herbal Beauty Care Products for the Youth from Mizoram 18-22 February 2020

National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Hyderabad

Centre for Training, Orientation and Capacity Building of RGNIYD in collaboration with National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Hyderabad organised the fifth batch consisting of 22 Youth and one coordinator from the districts of Mamit, Lawngtlai, Siaha of Mizoram state were trained on 'Preparation on Herbal Beauty Care Products. The youth enthusiastically participated in the training held in Hyderabad (NIRD & PR) from 18-22 February 2020.

They were exposed to the different kind of natural products like plant or plant extract, including leaves, bark, berries, roots, gums, seeds, stems and flowers that could be made into natural cosmetics such as Herbal Shampoo, Herbal Hair Conditioners, Fairness Relaxation Paste, Natural Lip Balm and Herbal Body Scrub which will be replacing chemically synthesized products which is highly concentrated with drugs that may produce many side effects. The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) and team of State Rural Livelihood Mission (SRLM) mobilized the youth from Mizoram.



The trainees from Mizoram shared their learnings through the skill training programme and their future plans for setting up entrepreneurial ventures to overcome the unemployment situation in the north east.

The funds are available in SHGs and government also encourage women entrepreneurs. Therefore women trainees were eager to set-up herbal beauty care products unit with the support of their mothers from SHGs and trainees will train their mothers to market their products and village wise formed group for setting up entrepreneurial ventures to overcome the unemployment situation in Mizoram.

Skill Training on Preparation on Preparation of Soya & Millet Product and Solar Lights Assembling Installation and Maintenance for the Youth from Nagaland 22-26 February 2020

National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Hyderabad

The unemployed youth from the districts of Kohima, Peren and Phek of Nagaland state were trained on 'Preparation of Soya & Millet Products and Solar Lights Assembling Installation and Maintenance. Eight youth (05 male and 03 female) were trained on Preparation of Soya & Millet Products and 11 youth (11 male) were trained on Solar Lights Assembling Installation and Maintenance. The youth enthusiastically participated in the training held in Hyderabad (NIRD & PR) from 22-26 February 2020 which was organised by CTO&CB, RGNIYD in collaboration with NIRD&PD, Hyderabad.

The trainees were exposed to the varieties of Soya and Millets products that could be made into Ragi Papad, Soya Milk, Soya Panner, Soya Nuts, Namkeen, Soya Instant Halwa, Upma, Kichadi & Ragi Biscuits and snacks.

The trainees were provided inputs on introduction about Soya Beans and Millet products, importance and advantages, benefits, nutrition values and varieties of Soya Beans and Millet. The youth were given hands on training on preparation of papad.

Practical sessions on how to prepare Soya Milk, Soya Panner, Soya Nuts & Namkeen were held. The trainees were provided inputs on introduction, importance on packaging, importanceon labellingand how to apply for a FSSAI registration.



At the end of the day, they underwent self and participatory evaluation and oriented on how to start business with low budget. The trainees were also oriented about the use of social media as tools for developing online content for marketing their products, making audio-visual promotional material on their products through use of simple online tools, e-marketing etc.

Skill Training on Conversion of Handmade Paper into Value - added Products for the Youth from Mizoram 07-13 March 2020

Further, the seventh batch consisting of six youth (6 male) from Lawngtlai, Champhai and Kolasib of Mizoram State were trained on Natural Dyeing from 7-13 March 2020.

The trainees were taught about the Steps to Start a Small Enterprise, Registration / Statutory Licences / Clearances required for an enterprise, procedures and requirements for provisional and permanent registrations. The session on Finance included the type of financial requirements for setting up an enterprise, types of financial assistance available



through various institutions and schemes. The highlight of the session was, the different sources and schemes for entrepreneurship, financial support under various schemes, particularly for the Youth of Nagaland were taught. The programme was coordinated by CTO&CB, RGNIYD in collaboration with NIRD&PD, Hyderabad

Trainees were divided into six groups (Each group has minimum Four / Five members) for practical application and given raw material to each group. Further, they were oriented on various e-commerce platforms on which they could easily register their products for marketing globally. Later, the trainees were provided various simulation exercises for registering and creating profile of their products online.

Skill Training on Vermicomposting for the Youth from Mizoram

14 March 2020

National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Hyderabad

On 14th March 2020, 25 trainees from Mizoram and the Coordinator from MzSRLM were provided training on vermicomposting. Ecological sanitation (ecosan) represents a holistic approach towards ecologically and economically sound sanitation, and is a systemic approach as well as an attitude. It is an alternative approach to overcome the limitations and disadvantages of conventional sanitation systems. The ecosan paradigm in sanitation is based on an ecosystem approach, which focuses on recycling of nutrients. Human excreta and grey water from households are recognized as a resource rather than waste and therefore

human excreta have to be made available as raw materials for supporting agriculture. The applied technologies may range from natural wastewater treatment techniques to compost toilets, simple household installations to complex, mainly decentralized systems. Considering the feasibility in every household in rural villages of Mizoram, this add on training was provided to the participants.

C. Seminars / Webinar / Workshops / Conferences / Consultations / Lectures

National Conference on Governance and Democracy in North East India 04-05 April 2019 Sikkim University, Gangtok, Sikkim

The Department of Political Science, Sikkim University in collaboration with the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu organised a two day National Conference on 'Governance and Democracy in North East India' on 4th and 5th April 2019. The inaugural session was graced by the Honourable Vice Chancellor of Sikkim University Prof. Avinash Khare and the Chief Guest Prof. Ramesh K.Arora, former Head, Department of Public Administration, University of Rajasthan. The theme of the session was governance, democracy and development. The discussion and presentations in the third plenary session and first technical Session underscored the importance of local governance, development and entrepreneurship, and citizenship and governance in North East India.

Workshop on Anomalistic Psychology 26 April, 2019 RGNIYD, Sriperumbudur

A Workshop on Anomalistic Psychologywas organised by Department of Applied Psychology, RGNIYD, Sriperumbudur on 26th April, 2019. The resource person of the workshop was Dr. Sherin V. George, a pioneering anomalistic psychologist from Kerala. The workshop dealt with introduction to parapsychology and the emergence of anomalistic psychology. The resource person explained about various paranormal activities and the science behind paranormal activities like devotional statues drinking milk in India, and other parts of the world, the idols crying in Christian missionaries in the form of blood and

also scientific mechanisms behind construction of such idols in ancient temples and the psychology used by the fortune tellers to influence the thoughts of the people. The post lunch session dealt with disapproving of telepathy, reincarnation and outer body experiences and the resource person displayed some magic tricks and explained how people are deceived by these perceptual errors. The workshop was a myth breaking event which was entirely interactive.

National Conference on Skill Development and Entrepreneurship 02-03 May 2019 Conference Hall, IGNTU-RCM, Makhan

The chief guest of the conference was Prof. Ibohal Meitei, Director, Centre for Entrepreneurship and Skill Development, School of Social Sciences, Manipur University, the president of the inaugural function was Dr. Ngalengnam, Director, IGNTU-Regional Campus Manipur. Welcome and keynote address was given by Dr. N. Surjitkumar, Head, Department of Tribal Studies, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University-Regional Campus Manipur. The main views emerged in two days were: 1. The situation in Northeast India where there are hardly any industrial houses worth the name and the local industry in terms of agro based products and of how raw material remains untapped, the potential being exploited by middlemen. 2. How jute, rubber, bamboo and cane, ginger, turmeric are grown in abundance in the different states and of how these can be encapsulated as micro units to generate employment. 3. Women as entrepreneurs have been facing a plethora of challenges towards enhancing their entrepreneurship including financial insufficiency or lack of financing, lack of advisory systems and mentors, a risk adverse culture among women, etc. 4. There is the urgent need to address the issue of skill gap and widespread unemployment in the districts and of how effective and timely intervention can drastically bring down insurgency problems, solve political instability and bring about more gender equity. 5. While some developed countries like South Korea, Japan and Germany have 96, 80 and 75% of their workforce receive skill trainings, only 10% of India's labour force receive skill trainings As such, in order to make the mission of 'Make in India' a success, there is an urgent need to provide more vocational training opportunities in the country.

National Seminar on Media Representation of Northeast India: Looking Back and Looking Forward 07-08 June 2019

Don Bosco Institute of Management, Guwahati, Assam

The Department of Mass Communication, Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh organized a two-day National Seminar entitled "Media Representation of Northeast India: Looking Back and Looking Forward" at Don Bosco Institute of Management, Kharguli Hills, Guwahati, Assam on 7th and 8th June, 2019. Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD) in collaboration with the 1 JAK LI (Sher-e-Kashmir) of Indian Army organised a new initiative titled as 'Empowerment of Local Government System'. As part of the initiative, a workshop was organised Gagian Halqa Panchayat, RS Pura Block, Jammu District, Jammu and Kashmir during 9-10 Aug 2019. This initiative aimed at developing a 'Model Halqa Panchayat' in Jammu and Kashmir and in the country by taking up a scientific and systematic situational analysis of the locality in terms of documentation of resources (Natural, Physical, Human and Financial); analysing the needs,

concerns, issues, problems and priorities of different categories of population; identifying the shortcomings / weaknesses in the governance and development; mapping and establishing linkages with the relevant Department Schemes; and, identifying the potential allies and institutions to provide necessary guidance and support to the Halqa Panchayat. To teach 10 Core life skills the resource person used various methodologies such as drawing, games, storytelling, brainstorming, role plays, case study analysis, group discussions and presentation. Four methods of solving a problem - Analyzing the problem, making a strategy, executing the strategy and evaluation of the problem were taught to the participants using the human knot game. Case studies were given to the participants to boost their critical thinking. 'The news Paper' activity was used to enhance the creative thinking of the participants and to initiate a new change in their thinking patterns.

Workshop on Menstrual Hygiene Management 14-16 July 2019 Himalayan Mountaineering Institute, Darjeeling, West Bengal

Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Regional Centre, Chandigarh, in collaboration with Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan, West Bengal, successfully concluded its three-day residential workshop on "Menstrual Hygiene Management" from 14th to 16th July 2019 at Himalayan Mountaineering Institute, Darjeeling. The workshop witnessed the participation of 28 young girls from different districts of West Bengal. A questionnaire was given to assess the knowledge and awareness level of the participants related to menstrual hygiene management which could later be used to compare the increase in information and awareness level post-training sessions. Further, to ease communication, a box was placed so that the participant could write up and put questions anonymously in case they felt hesitant to ask any question directly to the facilitator. A group activity was also conducted on Gender and Health. The facilitator also gave a basic introduction to the female reproductive system and explained the function of the pituitary gland, Uterus, Vagina, Cervix, Ovaries, Fallopian tubes with a powerpoint presentation. The facilitator also focused on the physiological and emotional changes that occur during the adolescent period. The facilitator explained about the onset of menstruation and elaborated on steps to deal with menstrual flow. To maintain general hygiene, a girl can use a clean cotton cloth which is washed properly and dried in sunrays or she may use disposable sanitary napkin, reusable cloth napkin,

menstrual cup or tampon to manage the menstrual flow. The facilitator demonstrated the participants to use all these products. The facilitator also explained how to dispose of a used sanitary pad or a tampon. After the presentation, the facilitator demonstrated some yoga asana to ease menstrual cramps. There were also discussions on different strategies to deal with bad touch. A short movie produced by Childline to create awareness was also shown to the participants.

Training of Trainers on Career Guidance and Counselling 22-25 July 2019

The participants also learned about the various rules and regulations to successfully organize regular activities and special camps for NSS volunteers, they vividly learned about the budgeting and accounting of NSS activities, their duties as an NSS program officer.

Workshop on Menstrual Hygiene Management 23-25 December 2019 RGNIYD Regional Centre, Chandigarh

The Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Regional Centre, Chandigarh, successfully concluded its three day residential workshop on "Menstrual Hygiene Management" from 23rd to 25th December, 2019 at its own campus in Chandigarh. The workshop witnessed the participation of 32 young girls from seven different districts of Punjab. the facilitator of the programme explained the basic concept of gender and used drawing method to show the difference between gender and sex. A group activity was also conducted on Gender and Health. The facilitator also gave a basic introduction to female reproductive system. The facilitators discussed about the process of menstruation and menstrual cycle. The facilitator explained about onset of



menstruation and elaborated on steps to deal with menstrual flow. To maintain general hygiene, a girl can use a clean cotton cloth which should be washed properly and dried in sun rays or she may use disposable sanitary napkin, reusable cloth napkin, menstrual cup or tampon to manage the menstrual flow. The participants were also provided information on available government schemes related to menstrual hygiene management. The participants were also taught to use online apps to track menstrual cycle. The facilitator gave a power point presentation to talk about balanced diet. After the presentation the facilitator demonstrated some yoga asana to ease menstrual cramps. There were also discussions on different strategies to deal with bad touch. Considering the increasing incidence of violence against women, 5 A's (Avoid, Access, Aware, Assert & Armed) of self defense were also taught to the participants. A short movie produced by Child line to create awareness was also shown to the participants. The Chief Guest at the valediction ceremony was Prof. Shivani, Sharma, Chairperson, Dept. of Philosophy, Punjab University. At the end of the programme certificates were awarded to the participants by the Chief Guest and Coordinator, RGNIYD RC, Chandigarh.

Observance of National Youth Day 12January 2020 RGNIYD Regional Centre, Chandigarh





H. Progressive use of Official Language & Meetings:

Community Radio Station

Community Radio Station Activities:

Community Radio Station was established in the year 2008 for the community, with a view of focusing adolescents for better interaction and exhibiting their talents and involve in



programme production and rural community through this community radio station. The Community Radio Station also aimed to Adolescent Women, Self-help group members, ICDS beneficiaries, rural and college youth community in a creative manner.

RGNIYD named it "Ilanthalir" (Ilanthalir means 'tender leaf') RGNIYD Community Radio, with a frequency of 107.2 MHz meant 'For the adolescents, by the adolescents and to the adolescents' targeting the Adolescents of school going and out





of school, identifying the drop-outs between the age group 10 and 19 years, youth between 15 and 35 years and community involving Self Help Groups, Gram Panchayats in and around Sriperumbudur, including some parts of Thiruvallur district. The Community Radio Station also aims at dissemination of knowledge, information and creation of employment. It is designed to serve a specific well-defined local community in and around the Insitute; it covers the radius of 20 kms of the Intitute. Durig the period under report, the Community Radio Station has been producing and disseminating more than 125 educational programmes in collaboration with District Institute of Education and Training (DIET). The Programmes was also shared with SCERT, Govt. of Tamilnadu for disseminating all-over Tamilnadu. Programmes on Swatch Bharath Abhiyan specifically on Health and Hygene to be maintained was produced with the support of the Block Medical Officer, Department of Health, Govt. of Tamilnadu.

Engineering Wing

The RGNIYD campus is situated in Sriperumbudur town on NH4 Chennai-Bangalore. Sriperumbudur is an industrial town



in the district of Kancheepuram, Tamil Nadu with proximity of 40 km from Chennai city. It encompasses Industries like Hyundai, Foxcon etc and ten prominent colleges. The campus is sited on a lush green sprawling campus of 43 acres at Sriperumbudur in Tamil Nadu. The Institute is equipped with infrastructure facilities that match international standards which include well-equipped air-conditioned Conference Halls, Classrooms, Seminar Halls and 500-member capacity Auditorium with latest Audio-Visual equipments, Boys Hostel, Girls Hostel, Guest House to provide the necessary support to organise effective training and academic activities. The new academic block and Type III & IV quarters are getting ready.

On one side of the Admin Block GF Department of Applied Psychology, Seminar Hall (100 Capacity), Conference Hall (40 Capacity), Auditorium (500 Capacity), Staff Canteen (50 Capacity), Faculty Room and Store Room are housed.

Training Block

The Training Block has Faculty Rooms, Offices of Department of Local Governance, Department of Development Studies, Department of Social Work, Centre for Training Orientation and Capacity Building, Community Radio Station and Computer Lab.

On the other side of the Training Block 5 Class Rooms in Ground Floor and a Class room in First Floor are available.

Executive Dining Hall



A separate Dining Hall with Kitchen and Store Rooms is available to serve Girls and Boys students in the Ground Floor and 9 Multipurpose Rooms are available in First Floor.

Hostel Block

This consists of 36 rooms (1 Study room) for Girls with attached bathroom facilities and 32 rooms for Boys with attached bathroomfacilities.



Eighteen fully Air-Conditioned VIP Guest Rooms are available. In the Hostel Block a Moder Gym has been provided with 2 Tread Mills, 1 Ergomenter Bicycle, 1 pressing station, 1 Pro-Action Series Equipment, with additional workouts such as tumbles weight plates etc., to accommodate 10 Students at a time.

Central Library

A. About Central Library

The Central Library of RGNIYD was established in the year 1999. It is a three floor building and the basement area is totally



meant for Research Scholars. It is a centralised air-conditioned well equipped with modern RFID facilities with a seating capacity of 300 users at a time. The building has Safety equipments like Fire extinguisher, Fire alarm, Water sprinkler system, emergency exit and Lift facilities. In addition, WiFi facilities are enabled in the library premises for the use of the faculty and students.

It is a specialized library for Social Sciences and Youth Development with a rich collection of Books, Journals and Institutional publications. It is entirely devoted to the needs of the Academic, Training and Research of the faculty and students.

The Central Library has more than 32000 books, e-journals, Print journals and Magazines, Dissertation, Audio-Visuals, Newspapers in English, Hindi, Malayalam and Regional Language, Online Databases, Back-volumes of Periodicals and Institutional Publications. Impressive collections in Social Science, Social Work, Sociology, Youth Studies, Gender Studies, Local Governance, Management, Political Science,

Psychology, Public Administration, Rural and Urban Development, Demography, Economics, Education and Environmental Studies etc. It is well equipped with modern RFID facilities with a seating capacity of 300 users at a time. The books are procured under the guidance of Library Purchase Committee.

Facilities in the RGNIYD Library

Central Library has separate sections for Reference books (Encyclopeadia, Handbooks, Dictionary & General), Competitive Examination Section, Hindi Section, Tamil



Section, Dissertation Section, Institutional Publications Section and General Stack etc. The Library routine services have been fully automated and user friendly library management software "Koha" (Open Source Software) is being used.

For Circulation of documents "Self Service Kiosk" has been implemented to adapt with the technological advancement, which enables users to Check-Out (Issue) and renew books by themselves (RFID staff station), EAS security gate and a book drop box (Check-in Service). Installation of the CCTV at the Central Library has immensely facilitated effective surveillance of all important locations of the Library.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development for the year ended 31 March 2020.

We have audited the attached balance Sheet of RGNIYD as at 31 March 2020, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that day under section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 28 (2) of RGNIYD Act 2021. These financial Statements are the responsibilities of the Institute's Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on out audit.

- 2. this separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards disclosure norms etc., audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules and Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum performance aspects, etc., if any are reported through inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports Separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India, These standard require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material mis-statements. An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statement. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by managements as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

- i. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii. The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this Report have been drawn up in the Uniform format of accounts approved by the Ministry of Finance.
- iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur as required in the rules and regulations of the Institute in so far as it appears from our examination of such books
- iv. We further report that:

A. General

The title of land and building of Regional Office Chandigarh occupied by Institute was not transferred to the Institute. However, Institute included the value of building of Rs. 0.85 crore in the fixed assets of the Institute while not including the value of the land on the pleas that title of land has not been transferred to Institute. Since title of land and building has not been transferred, the value of building should not be included in the fixed assets of the Institute. The same should be disclosed by way of note in the Note to accounts.

B. Effect of Revision in Accounts

The account of the Institute were revised based on audit comments as a result of which, Assets / Liabilities were decreased by ₹0.09 crore and the excess of Expenditure over Income (Deficit) was increased by ₹0.02 crore.

C. Grants in aid

Out of the grants-in-aid of ₹40.46 crore received during the year 2019-20 and ₹3.6926 crore being unspent balance of the previous year, totaling ₹50.15 crore the Institute utilized a sum of ₹43.15 crore, including ₹1.59 crore surrendered, leaving a balance of ₹7.00 crore as unutilised grant as on 31 March 2020.

D. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Separate Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Sriperumbudur, through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial / corrective action.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.

- a) In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Sriperumbudur as at 31st March 2020; and
- b) In so far as it related to Income & Expenditure Account of the deficit for the year ended on that date.

Schedule 14 - Significant Accounting Policies

1. Basis of preparation of financial statements

The Financial statements are prepared in the Uniform Format of Accounts prescribed by the Government of India for Central Autonomous Bodies in accordance with "Generally Accepted Accounting Principles" followed in India under the historical cost convention on mercantile basis.

2. Government Grants

Institute has both restricted and unrestricted grants. Restricted grants are funds (Earmarked Funds) which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions given at the time of grant.

Grant received towards General Plan and Non-Plan and Grants received for specific programmes have been routed through the Income & Expenditure Account.

Capital Grants received have been accounted for under the Capital Fund in the Balance Sheet and unspent balances been carried forward. Pending recast of Capital Fund for ad dition and disbursal of funds received for creation of capital assets in previous years to current liabilities, Capital Fund is depicted in the Balance Sheet following the doctrine of consistency.

3. Recognition of Income and Expenditure

All known Incomes and Expenses are recognized based on accrual method other than Academic Receipts which are accounted for on cash basis.

4. Fixed Assets & Depreciation

Value of Fixed assets is exhibited at cost of acquisition less depreciation. Depreciation has been provided on the Written down value method as per the rates prescribed in the Income Tax Act, 1961. The rates of depreciation are consistently followed. Cost of acquisition is inclusive of inward freight, duties and incidental and direct expenses related to the acquisition.

For fixed assets belonging to Commonwealth Programme-Asia centre in Chandigarh, the market value as provided has been taken as grant-in-aid and added with the fixed assets, whereas depreciation has not been provided for such fixed assets.

As the institution continue to follow the written down value method, Gross Block of Assets are not shown in the relevant schedule.

5. Retirement Benefits

Necessary provision has been made for payment of gratuity and encashment of earned leave to retiring employees. The provision for gratuity and encashment earned leave has been made based on Actuarial valuations. As the institution is following New Pension System, no provision for pension has been made in the accounts.

2. Programme Advance

The institute's policy is to provide advance to programme of organizers (both employees & outside institutions) for conducting various programmes. After completion of programmes, the institute receives expenditure Account from the programme organisers and settled. As there were differences between the figures in main accounts and subsidiary registers of pending advances action was initiated to reconcile the pending advances. Entries were made where the advance amounts found settled during the earlier years and shown against the prior period expenses and pay and allowances. Till such time reconciliation is completed for the remaining advances amounts, shown as pending programme advance in schedule 7.

3. Taxation

Since the institute has been registered under 12AA of the Income Tax Act, 1961; the computation of income has been prepared based on the actual Receipts & Payments Account (on Receipt Basis) as prescribed u/s 11 of the Income Tax Act, 1961. There will be no tax liability and hence no provision has been made towards taxation.

4. Contingent Liabilities

The institution was in receipt of Notice from Income tax Department regarding mismatch between collection and remittance of TDS and consequent arrears of Rs.19,84,340/- from 2008-09 to 2018-19 (11 years) for which the reconciliation is being done by engaging professional services.

5. Contributory Provident Fund

For the employees covered under Contributory Provident Fund scheme, accounts are maintained separately and de-linked from main accounts.

6. National Pension System

The institution is following New Pension System since 01.01.2004.

7. Court Cases

There are two court cases pending as on 31.03.2020 before the Courts relating to administrative issues.

8. Hostel Accounts

The institution is having separate hostels for boys and girls. The accounts for the mess are maintained by the Student Mess Management Committee to which the mess fee collected from the students is being transferred. The Mess Accounts are being delinked from Main Accounts.

9. General

Previous year's figures have been regrouped / reclassified wherever necessary to conform to current year's Classification.

10. Internal Audit

The internal audit for the year 2019-20 was conducted by M/s. P.K.K.G. Balasubramanian & Associates, Chartered Accountants, Chennai.

11. Internal control system

The institution is in the processes of establishing a more secured internal control mechanism.

12. Physical verification of Fixed Assets and Inventory

- a) The Physical verification of Fixed Assets was done periodically. Consumables are issued to the sections / departments are treated as consumed and hence, the closing stocks of consumables are taken as Nil.
- b) The value of the Fixed Assets which were lost due to fire accident occurred on 01.01.2019 was removed from the Fixes Assets (Schedule 5).

13. Foreign Exchange Transactions

The foreign exchange transactions are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of making payment by Bank with Bank charges.

14. Provision for Salary and Other components

The Salary and Other Components shown in the Income and Expenditure A/c is for twelve months from March 2019 to February 2020. Hence, no provision has been made for the salary of March 2020 which is payable on 01-04-2020.

15. Refund of Student Deposits

Since cash basis system of accounts is being followed for receipt of academic fees, any refund made out of that is done based on collateral evidence basis.

16. Academic Fees

Based on available information Academic fees accounted have been grouped into two components viz. Academic fees and B.Voc fees including previous year.
