

## Workshop on Women Connect for Leadership & Change






A traditional welcome was given to the officials and International delegates on 9th February 2016. The Youth delegates visited Kalakshetra, Chennai on 10th February 2016


### NSS Unit of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development



The Centre for Dalit and Subaltern Studies, RGNIYD in association with Tamilnadu Federation of Women Lawyers conducted five legal awareness programme for 900 girl students in five city colleges in Chennai during March, 2016. The objective of the workshop was to create awareness among girl students about their legal rights and constitutional entitlements. Chief Justice of Madras High Court, Experts in Law, Academics, Social





Activists, and Psychologists were invited to share their thoughts with the participants.

## Youth Led Sustainable Development Programmes

The RGNIYD continued to conduct the Youth Led Sustainable Development Programmes in collaboration with Educational Institutions of higher learning to reach out to the young people across the country thereby creating avenues for youth involvement in academic discourses on Sustainable Development areas and to engage them in the sustainable development process. The programme was conducted in 13 colleges in the month of March, 2016.

#### Orientation on Entrepreneurship Development - Phase II for Student Youth

In continuation of the ToT Programmes conducted jointly by RGNIYD and the ICT Academy of Tamil Nadu for the NSS Programme Officers on Youth Entrepreneurship Development, the trained NSS Programme Officers in various states conducted short duration orientation programmes on entrepreneurship development for the student youth in their respective institutions during March, 2016.

#### Employability Skills Training for SC/ST Student Youth

The RGNIYD in collaboration with the ICT Academy of Tamil Nadu offered training programmes to enhance the employability skills of the student youth in Banking, Financial services and Insurance (BFSI). The programme is designed exclusively to train the student youth belonging to SC/ST besides training the north-eastern youth during March, 2016.

The Department of Development Studies organized a TOT on Youth Employability Skills for SC/ST Students at Gandhigram Rural Institute – Deemed University, Tamilnadu from 21 – 25th March 2016. There were fifty final year undergraduate SC/ST students (46 - SC, 4 - ST) from various departments from Gandhigram Rural Institute participated in the programme. Similar kind of programme was conducted for 45 SC/ST students (41-SC, 4-ST) belonging to Kancheepruam District at Thiru. A. Govindasamy Government Arts College, Tindivanam, Tamilnadu from 21-25 March 2016.

### Capacity building programme on Women's right and Personality Development

A five days residential programme was organized by RGNIYD at its Regional Centre, Chandigarh for 50 North East students from 28 Jan - 1 Feb, 2016, RGNIYD, Chandigarh. This workshop witnessed participants from various parts of North East. Facilitators from their respective fields took sessions through various methodologies.

# RGNIYD and IIT Guwahati partnership for TEDx IIT Guwahati

The RGNIYD in partnership with IIT Guwahati organized a lecture programme under TEDx IIT Guwahati with an objective of giving a global platform especially to the people of the North East towards the sharing and exchange of ideas very aptly under the theme "Pushing the limits". TEDx provides a platform for people who have pushed their limits to take challenges for the betterment of the society.

The speakers for the event were drawn from various fields namely, Dr. Sanjoy Hazarika, shared about how he reached to the people who lived on the islands of Bhramaputra and how he facilitated the provision of basic services such as Schools, Health Centres, Power, Connectivity, Markets etc to the island people.


### Training of Trainers on Social Harmony and National Unity


### The Training of Trainers
