## **RGNIYD** poised to become an Institute of National Importance

The Hon'ble Union Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, Shri. Ajay Maken introduced the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development Bill, 2011 in the Lok Sabha on December 21, 2011. The Bill aims at converting the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD) into an Institute of National Importance. The conversion will enable the Institute to undertake advanced study and applied research on youth-related activities, offer employment-oriented and inter-disciplinary courses at the postgraduate level and also get more autonomy on financial and academic matters including launching its own courses. With the conversion, the Institute will become eligible for research grants from the government as also international bodies. Towards recommending this conversion, the Ministry of Youth Affairs and

Sports, Government of India constituted a Mentor Group to assess the present nature of the programmes and activities

being undertaken by RGNIYD and to suggest a road map for RGNIYD to emerge as an Institution of National Importance. The Mentor Group,

at the behest of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, has undertaken a thorough review of the Institute's mandates and activities, and has recommended that it be converted into an Institution of National Importance.



## One Day Orientation in Life Skills

#### 05 January 2012, RGNIYD

With the objective of enhancing the life competencies of the student, the Rajalakshmi College of Education requested training programme on Life Skills for their B.Ed students as part of their seminar from Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development. They also agreed to give radio programmes based on the training related adolescents issues. Therefore, a one-day training on Life Skills was organized on 5 January 2012 at RGNIYD. A total of 110 participants (25 male and 85 female) attended this training. The participants were oriented on the 10 core life skills. During the valedictory, Shri. P. Michael Vetha Siromony IAS Director, RGNIYD spoke on the imperativeness and relevance of life skills in real life situations and distributed the certificates to the participants.

# Orientation to Trainers of Anganwadi Training Centres in Collaboration with ICDS, TN

### 05 January 2012, State Training Institute, Taramani

The School of Counselling, RGNIYD rendered resource support for the Training of Trainers of Anganwadi Workers organized by the AWTC, Taramani, Chennai under the Sabla Scheme on 12 January 2012 for the Master Trainers on Adolescent Health and Development, Life Skills Education and Empowerment of Adolescent Girls by planning their careers at an early stage and the various Career Options available for them both in the urban and rural contexts. A total of 50 Anganwadi Workers from Chennai and adjoining districts participated.

# **International Seminar on Young People and Migration**

#### 18-19 January 2012, RGNIYD

With the advent of globalization, human mobility has become enormously frequent and there are is a huge cohort of young migrants moving in search of better lives. But, Youth Migration is a challenging and neglected phenomenon. When a youth migrates, in many cases, she/he faces multiple problems and deprivations. At this juncture, RGNIYD in collaboration with



Indian Council of Overseas Employment (ICOE), International Organization for Migration (IOM, Regional office for Asia and Pacific) and Centre for Development Studies (CDS) has organized an International Seminar on Young People and Migration on 18 and 19 January 2012 at RGNIYD. The objective of the seminar was to provide a platform for academicians, development experts, policy makers and other stakeholders to deliberate upon youth migration and the resulting issues and challenges in its global perspective in the wake of development challenges. The findings and the resulting interventions aims to facilitate a favourable environment for young migrants moving in search of better education, employment and such other avenues at the global and national front.

There were a total of 65 participants in the seminar. Apart from individual nominations at the International Level from Srilanka and Singapore there were representatives from UNFPA - New York, ILO - Bangkok, Centre on Integrated Rural Development for Asia and the Pacific (CIRDAP) -

Bangladesh, International Organization on Migration

(IOM) - Bangkok, Friedrich Ebert Stiftung (FeS) - Germany, Internation on Migration, India. There were research scholars, senior academicians and experts working in the area of migration from across the country from several renowned universities.

The International Seminar on Young People & Migration was inaugurated by Shri. Vayalar Ravi, Hon' able Union Minister for Overseas Indian Affairs, Govt. of India. On the occasion the Minister released 'The Training Manual on Youth Employability'. The training manual would empower youth with employability skills and facilitate their career prospects. The Minister in his inaugural address

highlighted various critical issues related to Indian migrants. He brought out the importance of legal migration, steps taken by the Ministry of Overseas Indian Affairs for preventing illegal migration and protecting the Indian Migrants. He pointed out that the Overseas Indian Affairs Ministry was started in 2006 and was now receiving foreign remittances up to Rs. 57 billion. He underscored the need for RGNIYD to focus on skill development and employability. He shared the initiatives taken by the Ministry for Launching The Indian Council for Overseas Employment – A step towards legal migration of young people to other European Countries. He concluded his address with a provocative statement that "Young Men Should Think Big" and encouraged the Indian Youth to migrate abroad for acquiring multi-faceted skills and experiences.

There were a total of 4 plenary sessions, 7 thematic sessions and one consultation meeting spread over the two days. As an outcome of the seminar, the School of Youth Studies & Extension has planned to launch a research cell on Youth Migration with the support from Ministry of Overseas Indian Affairs, GOI.



# **Training in Life Skills and Personality Development**

#### 20 -22 January 2012, RGNIYD

The personality development through positive behaviour is one of the most important thrust area through training of Life Skills. The concept of Life Skills brings curiosity and interest in many people to lead life effectively. With the objective of enhancing the life competencies of the students and impart knowledge and skills in personality development a training in life skills and personality development was organized for the Masters degree in Fashion Management (MFM) students of National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT) students during 20 22 December 2012. Through this training the students were imparted comprehensive knowledge and skills on self awareness, self concept, critical & creative thinking, effective



communication, interpersonal relationship, empathy, team building and leadership skills, goal setting and time management. Nearly 28 students (girls and boys) attended this training.

# Orientation on Youth Development for Students of Shri Padmavathi Mahila Visvavidyala, Tirupati

#### 23 January 2012, RGNIYD

As part of the field visit, the Students pursuing Masters Degree in Social Work from Shri Padmavathi Mahila Visvavidyala, Tirupati visited RGNIYD on 23 January 2012. A total of 16 students accompanied by two faculty members participated in the programme. The RGNIYD corporate film was screened and the students were provided details about the programmes and activities of RGNIYD. They were also provided an overview of youth developmental programmes in India and the strategies for empowering the youth through the National Youth Policy. The faculty of RGNIYD provided orientation on life skills, career planning and career options in the field of social work and youth development, and a film on career planning was screened. They were also taken to the RGNIYD Adventure Park and were explained about the imperativeness of developing personality and physical agility through various adventure games.

## **Training of Trainers' in Life Skills**

### 23 –27 January 2012, Jambudvipa Trust, Yerwada, Pune

Life skills are abilities that promote psycho social and mental well being and help in building competencies of individuals to perform to their fullest. Practice of life skills, which are psycho-social in nature, fosters positive attitudes to life and work and equips individuals with relevant skills for a creative and innovative knowledge economy. Keeping in mind that consciously practicing Life Skills help to enhance a capacitates an individual, enhances a positive and cultured society and community. The Training of Trainers (TOT) Programme in Life Skills was organized from 23 – 27th January 2012 at Jambudvipa Trust, Yerwada, Pune, Maharashtra, by Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD) as per the Programme Calendar for the year 2010-2011. A total of 30 participants (19 Male and 11 Female) predominantly from Maharashtra and a few from Karnataka were present. The participants comprised off academicians, NGO workers and NYK representatives.

The inaugural function began with Mr. Satish Bansode, Director-Programs, Center for Youth Development and Activities (CYDA), Pune, addressing the gathering. He stressed on the importance of empowering the youth and the role of like skills for a positive outlook for well being and developing competencies. Other Resource persons, Mr. R. Sreehari from RGNIYD, Dr. Sushi Kadanakuppee from Bangalore were present.

Participatory methodology was used to impart the training to the participants. Techniques of a good facilitator and the various training methodologies were discussed in the initial session of the programme. The session on ice breaking and getting to know the group was taken by Mr. R. Sreehari, following which the concept of life skills and its importance were dealt with by Ms. Sushie K. Each of the ten core life skills such as *self awareness*, *empathy*, *critical and creative thinking*, *problem solving and decision making*, *effective communication and interpersonal relationship* were dealt in detail during the five days of the training. Exercises, role plays and debates were some of the techniques used during the sessions. 'The National Youth Policy (Draft) Summary 2010' was discussed and the issues and problems of the youth specific to the state were brainstormed. The training commenced at 9am and went on until 6pm each day.

The valedictory function commenced at 3.00pm on 27th January 2012 at the Training Venue, Pune. The Valedictory was organized by Center for Youth Development and Activities (CYDA) and the participants of the group. The participants gave their feedback which was on a positive note. They thanked RGNIYD for conducting such a wonderful five day Life Skills Training Programme and providing excellent accommodation and food. Certificates were distributed to the participants after which the five day Life Skills Training of Trainers (ToT) programme came to a close.

The participants of the programme were open to learning, enthusiastic, academically sound, keen on working with youth and for deprived children and disseminate the concept of life skills to people around. Some of the participants seemed very promising and have been identified as prospective resource persons for the future training programmes. The five day training has definitely helped the participants to understand and internalize the concept, need and importance of life skills, thus realizing the objectives of the training.

# **Celebration of Republic Day**

26 January 2012, RGNIYD

RGNIYD celebrated the 63rd Republic Day on 26 January 2012 at RGNIYD. A total of 200 Faculty, Staff and Students of RGNIYD participated in the programme. The Director, RGNIYD hoisted the National Flag and delivered the Republic Day Message. The students of RGNIYD engaged in Shramdhan activities. The staff and students of RGNIYD planted saplings in the RGNIYD campus. # Capacity Building for Presidents and Members of Village Panchayats of Tamil Nadu

### 31 - 01 February 2012

PRIYA Division organised a two-day Capacity Building Programme for Elected Presidents and Members of Panchayat Raj Institutions (PRI) of Kancheepuram Districts at RGNIYD from 31 January - 01 February 2012 at RGNIYD. The programme was organised with the aim of enhancing the knowledge on Panchayati Raj System among the newly elected presidents and members of PRIs and to build their capacities on 'Need Assessment, Resource Mapping and Participatory Planning' in their functional area. About 25 elected members including Presidents from Village Panchayats participated in the training programme.

In the inaugural session, Dr.K.Gireesan, Faculty Head, PRIYA Division highlighted the importance of Panchayat Raj System, highlighting the role of young elected members who have a full tenure before them. The participants were provided inputs on the basic features of 73rd Amendment Act and Tamil Nadu Panchayat Raj Act 1994, Grama Sabha and Peoples Participation, Need assessment of Panchayat, participatory planning, resource identification and resource mapping, participatory techniques and social audit. The participants were divided into various groups and were made to discuss on the needs, issues, concerns and priorities among the various social categories like women, differently abled, youth, children and aged.

#### **TOT on Life Skills for NCC officers**

#### Kamptee, Nagpur, 31 January - 04 February 2012

The ToT on Life Skills for NCC officers was organised by RGNIYD at Kamptee, Nagpur from 31 January - 4 February 2012 in which 34 NCC officers were trained.

Dr. A. Radhakrishnan Nair, Faculty Head, School of Life Skills Education and Social Harmony, Mrs. Gitanjali, Consultant. Dr. S Pricillia, Faculty Head, School of Career Counselling Mr. Joseph Thomas, Research Scholar, RGNIYD, Mrs. Arti Bardhan, Clinical Psychologist served as the resource persons for the programme. The programme had intense training sessions on the 10 core life skills, career opportunities for the youth in the contemporary world of work, emotional intelligence and peer education were held. The NCC Officials felt that the training component on life skills would be incorporated as a compulsory element for the master trainers of NCC.

## 24th Ship for World Youth Program

#### 12-13 February, 2012, RGNIYD

31st January 2012, a chartered ship "Fuji Maru" left Yokohama (Japan) carrying 140 youths from Japan and 132 Youth from 12 other countries and would cruise around Singapore, India, Sri Lanka before returning to Tokyo on March 5th under the 24th Ship for World Youth Program". The purpose of the "Ship for World Youth" program is to broaden the global view of the Japanese Youths, to promote mutual understanding and friendship between Japanese and foreign youths as well as to cultivate the spirit of international cooperation and the competence to practice it, and furthermore to foster the youths with capability of showing leadership in various area of international society.

The participating countries included besides Japan, the Kingdom of Bahrain, Federative Republic of Brazil, Canada, Arab Republic of Egypt, India, New Zealand, Republic of Peru, Russia, Spain, Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, Republic of Turkey and Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela. Eleven youth delegates from India are representing India at the 24th Ship for World Youth Program.

This programme operated by Cabinet Office, Government of Japan, enables the participating youth to live together, and while on board and when visiting the different countries, they study and discuss common issues from a global perspective and participate in other various activities that involve multi-cultural and multi-national exchange opportunities.

During the voyage one of the Ports of Call was Chennai. The Ship for "World Youth Program" arrived on 12 February 2012 at Chennai. The RGNIYD was designated by the

Sports, Government of India as the official host to the participating youth of this 24th Ship for World Youth Program. The RGNIYD organized field visit for the international youth delegates to seven different institutions at Chennai viz., Balavihar, Banyan, ICWO, Ethiraj College, IIT, Chennai and Stella Maris College,

#### 6-12 February 2012, RGNIYD

The RGNIYD in collaboration with Commonwealth Youth Programme (CYP) Asia Centre, Chandigarh, organized Master Training Programme on Youth and Peace Building from 6-12 February 2012. The CYP Asia centre has developed a training manual to train the Youth as Ambassadors of Peace for the Commonwealth Member Countries. The aim of developing this manual was to develop necessary competencies of the young people to facilitate them as key promoters of peace and harmony. The programme was attended by 34 delegates from various countries.

The workshop was inaugurated by Shri. R. K. Mishra, the Regional Director of CYP Asia Centre.

The purpose of the traning programme was two-fold viz., to scrutinise and pilot-test the training manual with the experts in peace building and conflict management from various member countries of the Commonwealth and to enhance the competencies of the participants on the training methodologies with special reference to peace building and conflict management.

Dr. D. Agochiya the former Director, CYP London facilitated the entire programme. Following the scrutiny of the content of the manual chapter-wise, the suggestions/modifications indicated by the experts were incorporated in the manual. The manual was also pilot tested on the student youth of RGNIYD by the participating expertss.

Chennai on the 12 February 2012 and the delegates observed the activities of these institutions and interacted with the key stakeholders.

The RGNIYD arranged a traditional Indian welcome at its premises on 13 February 2012 to the participants of the 24th SWY. The participants were divided into groups and attended thematic sessions on Yoga, Gender Equity, Life Skills, Social Harmony, Youth Empowerment, Education, Environment, Decentralised Governance, MGNREGS and RTI, Health, Adolescent Development etc. They engaged in focused group discussions and interacted with the student youth of RGNIYD. A cultural programme comprising a mix of classical and folk dances of various Indian States was performed by the students of RGNIYD to give a glimpse of rich Indian Heritage for the youth delegates.



Later, the delegates of the ship were taken in seven groups to various villages visits to expose the international youth to Indian way of life and local governance (Panchayati Raj system) and witness for themselves, the developmental initiatives and schemes being implemented through the local governance institutions including rural sports and games.

# National Youth Campaign on Reaching the Unreached Consultation Meeting of Leaders of Youth Wing of Political Parties and Others

#### 17 February 2012, Wayanad

A consultation meeting of leaders of Youth Wing of Political Parties and other Youth Organization of Wayanad was organised at the Collectorate Conference Hall, Kalpetta, Wayanad on 17 February 2012. Dr. K.Gireesan, Faculty Head, PRIYA Division briefed the delegates about activities carried out as part of the project in the District. Sri. P Michael Vetha Siromony, IAS gave a detailed picture of the scenario of Youth Development in India. In his address, he narrated the different indicators of Youth Development which need to be operationalized in the field. Sri. P Hari Kishore, IAS put forward three suggestions to be included while thinking of linking various activities as part of the Wayanad Youth Development Plan. (a) Need for more awareness sessions for youth on various schemes/programmes by different departments/ agencies; (b) Initiation of a training centre for organising skill development on tourism, hospitality and agro-processing; (c) Initiation of a five year integrated programme on Higher Education for Tribal students. Sri. Abdul Azeez District Youth Programme Officer, Kerala State Youth Welfare Board, Wayanad proposed vote of thanks to all the delegates.

**National** to Reach the Unreached Consultation Meeting of **Presidents of** Gram **Panchayats** and Block **Panchayats** 

17 February 2012, Wayanad

A consultation meeting of Presidents of Gram Panchayats and Block Panchayats and Kalpetta Municipality from the District was organised at the Collectorate Conference Hall, Kalpetta, Youth Campaign Wayanad on 17 February. At the outset, Dr. K Gireesan welcomed the Presidents of GPs and BPs for the meeting and appraised them about the activities so far carried out in the District as part of the project. He indicated that there is a need for receiving inputs from them on two counts: (a) To ascertain their views on 'Needs, Concerns, Issues, Problems and Priorities of Youth' in their area; (b) To analyse various projects initiated in their GP which are directly or indirectly beneficial to the youth. The consultation meeting was organised to conceive and put into practice, how youth development can be factored in the projects of GPs/BPs in the plan 2012-13. The delegates expressed their views on various aspects of youth development unanimously highlighed the need and significance of addressing the concerns, issues and problems of youth by initiating appropriate projects, if necessary guidance and support can be provided to them. Shri. Michael Vetha Siromony IAS, Director, RGNIYD highlighted the significance of giving due thrust towards incorporating the projects for development of youth and requested the Presidents to look up to this aspect in a holistic and integrated manner. Sri. CV Joy, Project Director DRDA, Wayanad, thanked all the participants for their active involvement and inputs towards transforming the LGIs into more youth-focused and youth-friendly institutions.

# Capacity Building for Young Elected Women Members of Panchayati Raj Institutions

#### 17 - 19 February 2012, Coimbatore

PRIYA Division organised a three-day Capacity Building Programme for Young Elected Women Members of Panchayati Raj Institutions from Coimbatore District at Avinashilingam Institute for Home Science and Extension Education (AIHSEE), Coimbatore from 17 - 19 February 2012. The major thrust of the programme was on Need Assessment, Resource Identification and Participatory Planning.

The Programme was inaugurated by Shri. Leaders from Khasi and Garo ADCs of Meghalaya, Karbi Anglong ADC and Mishing Tribal Autonomous Councils of Assam, and VCs of Nagaland shared their experiences which gave a 'bird's eye view' to the current status and functioning of these institutions in the respective states. Number of theoretical positions and operational dimensions were highlighted by the leaders and the session was

moderated by the Faculty Head (FH), PRIYA Division. During the programme, delegates were given inputs on the local government system in India, uniqueness and features of the ADCs in the context of 6th Schedule of Indian Constitution, Tribal autonomous councils – Retrospect and Prospects, Right to Information, Significance of participatory structures at the local level and youth participation in local governance. Dr. S Umdor, Dr. AK Baruah and Dr. B Mishra, Mr. Phyobemo Lotha and Mr. Naba Narayan Taye have handled the sessions. The delegates made a visit to the Umran Village and interacted with Mr. Hoping Kurbah, Headman and other key functionaries. Functioning of Khasi Durbar with specific measures of transparency and accountability practiced in the institution was highlighted during the interactions. The need for enhanced women participation in the decision making of Khasi village councils was noted in the context of the matriarchal system being practised. The need for carrying out a 'Youth status study' in their respective areas and taking up 'Youth Budgeting in local governance' was suggested by FH, PRIYA towards analyzing the investments made for youth development. The need for a 'Youth Policy' in all the respective States was also emphasized.

The need for taking up state-wise workshops involving all the stakeholders and capacity building programmes for the young leaders of the tribal autonomous councils have been made. The programme brought out expression of a renewed vigour and commitment by all the participants towards enhancing the functioning of the tribal autonomous councils by enhancing youth participation in local governance. Mr. Sunil Kumar Basumatary, Head, NSS Regional Centre, Guwahati inaugurated the programme and Dr. Biswambhara Mishra, Head, Dept. of Economics, NEHU delivered the valedictory address.
