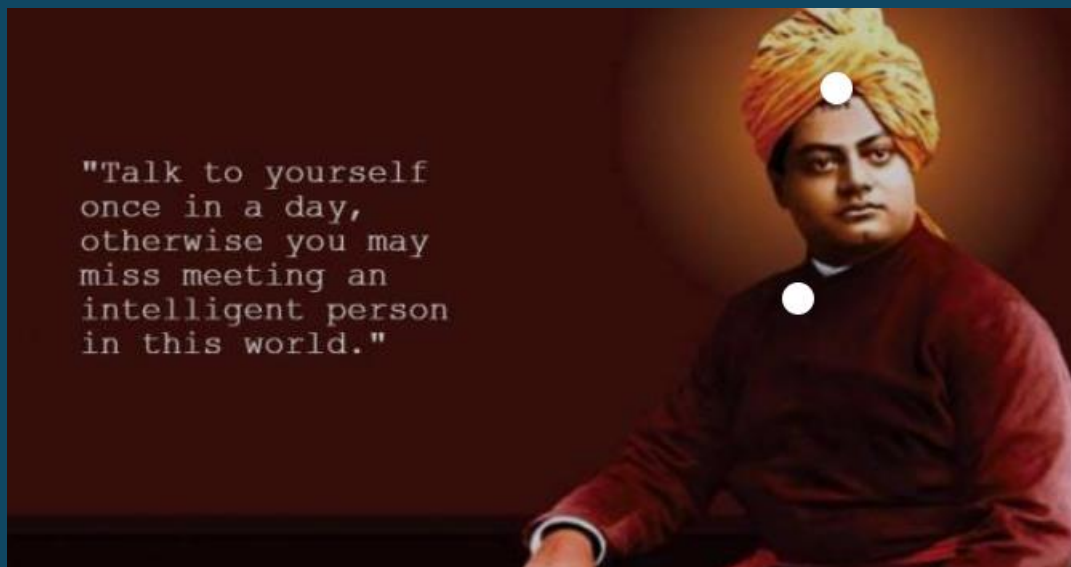

BACKGROUND

The National Youth Day is observed on January 12, which is Swami Vivekananda's birthday and a tribute to the legend. From January 12 to 16, 1995, Bhopal hosted the first National Youth Festival. Since then, the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India celebrates the event yearly in joint venture style in one of the States of India.

The youth festival aims to propagate the concept of national integration, the spirit of communal harmony, brotherhood, courage, and adventure amongst the youth by exhibiting their cultural prowess on a common platform. National Youth Festival allows youth across the country to discuss, debate, share their experience and aspirations, understand and enjoy the rich pluralistic diversities, and appreciate the underlying current of oneness and unity in these diversities.

The National Youth festival is organized by the theme “*Viksit Yuva -Viksit Bharat*”.The activities held during the festival include competitive and non-competitive Cultural events, Youth summits and plenary discussions on various themes, Indigenous sports and martial arts, Yuva Kriti-Social Development Fair, Food Festival, Young Artists’ Camp, and Adventure Sports. The presentation of the National Youth Awards also takes place during the festival. A microcosm of young India converged at Hubballi-Dharwad to have joyful learning experiences, and memories for a lifetime. Further, on 15/01/2023, a historic YOGATHON was held between 6.00 AM to 8.00 AM to create a Guinness Book of World record, by mobilizing 5 lakh people from across 31 Districts of Karnataka, along with National Youth Festival Participants. This event was a tribute to the deep-rooted traditions of the great Indian civilization and attempted to highlight the benefits of Yoga to the young generation, as a part of modern lifestyle. The 26th NYF gains more significance as it is guided by the principles of Green Indian and hence it is known as Green Youth Festival.

An exhibition and sale of delicacies from various parts of the country. It helps in reintegrating value back into food systems and existing food cultures. Food festival with 45 stalls built by participants from India showcase their food ethnics and the history behind their individual traditions. Indian cuisine consists of a variety of regional and traditional cuisines native to India. Given the diversity in soil, climate, culture, ethnic groups, and occupations, these cuisines vary substantially and use locally available spices, herbs, vegetables, and fruits. Indian food is tasty, healthy, and always contains the nicest spices. While each dish varies by region, the typical Indian dish contains around seven different ingredients and an infinite array of fresh spices, each bringing their own unique flavor to the table.



Indigenous Sports – 14th January 2023

Venue – RN Shetty Stadium

Agility, strength, balance, hand eye coordination, accuracy, strategy, intuition and patience are perfectly blended and performed in indigenous games. The Indian Martial Arts are involved for the first time in National Youth Festival. Maharashtra's Mallakhamb, Tamil Nadu's Silambam, Andhra Pradesh's Kharasamu & Kattisamu and many others from different parts were a sight for sore eyes. A total of 11 teams from different parts were participated and performed.

Yuva Kriti – 14th January 2023

Venue – KC Football Ground

It showcases handmade products and skills in handcraft featuring the products of young artisans from all across the country. More than 180 people participated in the Yuva Kriti, which featured 90 stalls with works from handcrafted crafts, ideas for sustainable development, advice on mental health, artifacts made from textiles, wood, clay, soft and hard metals, etc. A few exhibits are namely: - Jute Bags, Wooden Toys, Coffee, Honey & Millets, Rajwade Art, Matparai Painting Art, Bastar bell metal craft, Bandhani Saree, Suits, Dupattas & Dress Materials, Sketch Art on the given themes with cultural blend, Go-Kriti (Made of Cow Dung), Zardozi Embroidery, Kolhapuri Chappals. The army also has set up two booths, one for information on various job opportunities for young people in the armed services, and the other for a demonstration of weapons and ammunition used by the armed forces.



Yogathon – 15th January 2023

State Government of Karnataka conducted Yogathon to be included in the Guinness Record. The participants of NYF from all across the nation were present in Hubli – Dharwad and enthusiastically became a part of this new Guinness world record. 4,05,255 people performed yoga simultaneously in 33 different places of the entire Karnataka State, breaking all the previous records and creating a new Guinness Record.

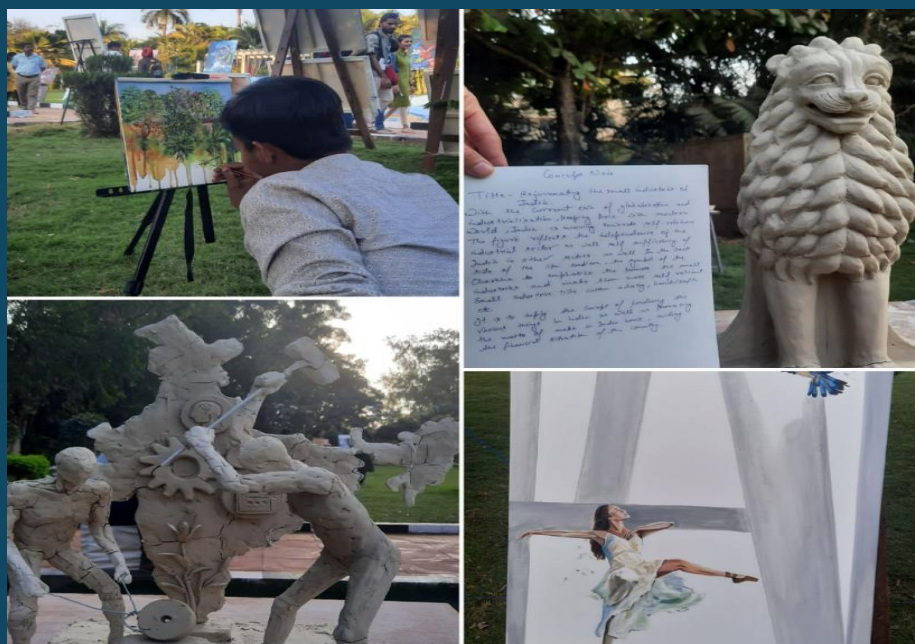

As part of the camp, there was opportunity to participate in Kayaking, Rafting, Hiking and Mountain Biking (approx. 20km). A basic introductory session on the Do's and Don'ts followed by a briefing of sport activity workshop to familiarize various sport equipment's and a practical demonstration of the same.
